## A BILL FOR

- An Act relating to the referral of a patient for diagnostic
   imaging by a physical therapist.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 148A.1, Code 2023, is amended to read as
2 follows:

3 148A.1 Definitions — referral — authorization.

4 1. a. As used in this chapter, "board":

5 <u>a. "Board"</u> means the board of physical and occupational
6 therapy created under chapter 147.

b. As used in this chapter, "physical therapy" is that 7 8 "Physical therapy" means the branch of science that deals 9 with the evaluation and treatment of human capabilities and 10 impairments. Physical therapy uses the effective properties 11 of physical agents including  $\tau$  but not limited to  $\tau$  mechanical 12 devices, heat, cold, air, light, water, electricity, and sound, 13 and therapeutic exercises, and rehabilitative procedures to 14 prevent, correct, minimize, or alleviate a physical impairment. 15 (1) Physical therapy includes the interpretation of 16 performances, tests, and measurements, the establishment and 17 modification of physical therapy programs, treatment planning, 18 consultative services, instructions to the patients, and the 19 administration and supervision attendant to physical therapy 20 facilities. (2) Physical therapy permits the referral of a patient 21

by a physical therapist for diagnostic imaging, including plain radiographs and magnetic resonance imaging, provided the diagnostic imaging is performed and the results are interpreted by an appropriately licensed and qualified health care professional. The physical therapist who ordered the diagnostic imaging shall report the results of the diagnostic imaging to the patient's designated primary care provider within seven days following receipt of the results to ensure patient coordination of care, unless the patient does not have a designated primary care provider or the health care professional who performed and interpreted the diagnostic imaging previously provided the results to the primary care provider.

35 2. Physical therapy evaluation and treatment may

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1 be rendered by a physical therapist with or without a 2 referral from a physician, podiatric physician, dentist, or 3 chiropractor, except that a hospital may require that physical 4 therapy evaluation and treatment provided in the hospital shall 5 be done only upon prior review by and authorization of a member 6 of the hospital's medical staff.

10 This bill amends the definition of "physical therapy" to 11 permit the referral of a patient by a physical therapist for 12 diagnostic imaging, including plain radiographs and magnetic 13 resonance imaging, provided the diagnostic imaging is performed 14 and the results are interpreted by an appropriately licensed 15 and qualified health care professional. The physical therapist 16 who ordered the diagnostic imaging shall report the results of 17 the diagnostic imaging to the patient's designated primary care 18 provider within seven days following receipt of the results 19 to ensure patient coordination of care, unless the patient 20 does not have a designated primary care provider or the health 21 care professional who performed and interpreted the diagnostic 22 imaging previously provided the results to the primary care 23 provider.

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
