A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to lifetime hunting and fishing licenses
- 2 available for certain disabled veterans.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 483A.24, subsection 16, Code 2023, is 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 16. Upon payment of the fee established by rules adopted
- 4 pursuant to section 483A.1 for a lifetime fishing license or
- 5 lifetime hunting and fishing combined license, the department
- 6 shall issue a lifetime fishing license or lifetime hunting and
- 7 fishing combined license to a resident of Iowa who has served
- 8 in the armed forces of the United States on federal active
- 9 duty and who was disabled or was a prisoner of war during that
- 10 veteran's military service. The department shall prepare
- 11 an application to be used by a person requesting a lifetime
- 12 fishing license or lifetime hunting and fishing combined
- 13 license under this subsection. The department of veterans
- 14 affairs shall assist the department in verifying the status or
- 15 claims of applicants under this subsection. As used in this
- 16 subsection, "disabled" means entitled to a service connected
- 17 rating under 38 U.S.C. ch. 11.
- 18 Sec. 2. Section 483A.24, Code 2023, is amended by adding the
- 19 following new subsection:
- 20 NEW SUBSECTION. 21. The department shall issue without
- 21 fee a lifetime fishing license or lifetime hunting and fishing
- 22 combined license to a resident of Iowa who has served in the
- 23 armed forces of the United States on federal active duty and
- 24 who was disabled during that veteran's military service. The
- 25 department shall prepare an application to be used by a person
- 26 requesting a lifetime fishing license or lifetime hunting
- 27 and fishing combined license under this subsection. Upon
- 28 application, the person shall provide proof of service in the
- 29 armed forces of the United States on federal active duty,
- 30 proof of disability resulting from that service, a disability
- 31 rating of at least zero percent determined by the department of
- 32 veterans affairs, and proof of Iowa residency at the time of
- 33 application. The department of veterans affairs shall assist
- 34 the department in verifying the status or claims of applicants
- 35 under this subsection. As used in this subsection, "disabled"

- 3 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 6 This bill relates to lifetime hunting and fishing licenses
- 7 available to certain disabled veterans. Under current law, a
- 8 resident who served in the armed forces of the United States on
- 9 federal active duty and who was disabled during that veteran's
- 10 military service shall be issued a lifetime fishing license or
- 11 lifetime hunting and fishing combined license after payment of
- 12 a fee established by rule.
- Under the bill, a resident disabled veteran may apply for
- 14 and receive a lifetime fishing license or a lifetime hunting
- 15 and fishing combined license without fee. A person applying
- 16 for a license under the bill shall provide proof of service in
- 17 the armed forces of the United States on federal active duty,
- 18 proof of disability resulting from that service, a disability
- 19 rating of at least 0 percent determined by the department of
- 20 veterans affairs, and proof of Iowa residency at the time of
- 21 application. The bill requires the department of veterans
- 22 affairs to assist the department of natural resources in
- 23 verifying the status or claims of applicants under the bill.
- 24 For purposes of the bill, "disability" means entitled to a
- 25 service-connected rating between 0 and 100 percent under 38
- 26 U.S.C. ch. 11.
