## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to county compensation boards and salary
- 2 increases for elected county officers.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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1 Section 1. Section 331.212, subsection 2, Code 2024, is 2 amended by adding the following new paragraph: NEW PARAGRAPH. i. Setting the compensation schedule of 3 4 elected county officers. Sec. 2. Section 331.321, subsection 1, paragraph 1, Code 5 6 2024, is amended by striking the paragraph. Sec. 3. Section 331.322, subsection 6, Code 2024, is amended 7 8 to read as follows: 9 6. Review Annually prepare and review the final 10 compensation schedule of the county compensation board and 11 determine the final compensation schedule in accordance with 12 section 331.907. 13 Sec. 4. Section 331.322, subsection 7, Code 2024, is amended 14 by striking the subsection. Sec. 5. Section 331.323, subsection 1, paragraph e, Code 15 16 2024, is amended to read as follows: 17 e. When If the duties of an officer or employee are assigned 18 to one or more elected officers, the board shall set the an 19 initial salary for each elected officer. Thereafter, the 20 salary and, thereafter, shall be determined determine the 21 salary as provided in section 331.907. 22 Sec. 6. Section 331.907, subsections 1, 2, 3, and 4, Code 23 2024, are amended to read as follows: 24 The annual compensation of the auditor, treasurer, 1. 25 recorder, sheriff, county attorney, and supervisors shall 26 be determined as provided in this section. The county 27 compensation board annually shall review the compensation 28 paid to comparable officers in other counties of this state, 29 other states, private enterprise, and the federal government. 30 In setting the salary of the county sheriff, the county 31 compensation board shall set the sheriff's salary so that it 32 is comparable to salaries paid to professional law enforcement 33 administrators and command officers of the state patrol, and 34 the division of criminal investigation of the department of 35 public safety, and to city police chiefs employed by cities of

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1 similar population to the population of the county. The county 2 compensation board shall prepare a compensation schedule for 3 the elective elected county officers for the succeeding fiscal 4 year with an annual salary increase based on the consumer 5 price index but not to exceed a three percent increase. A 6 recommended compensation schedule requires a majority vote of 7 the membership of the county compensation board. The board 8 may increase the annual salary of an elected county officer 9 by ordinance and budgetary procedures set forth in section 10 331.434, but a salary increased by ordinance shall not take 11 effect until the first fiscal year following the next regular 12 election for which the affected position was on the ballot. 13 For purposes of determining a salary increase under this 14 subsection, the board shall initially use the salary of a 15 position as of the effective date of this Act. 16 At the public hearing held on the county budget as 2. 17 provided in section 331.434, the county compensation board 18 shall submit its recommended compensation schedule for the 19 next fiscal year to the board of supervisors for inclusion 20 in the county budget. The board of supervisors shall review 21 the recommended compensation schedule for the elected county 22 officers and determine the final compensation schedule which 23 shall not exceed the compensation schedule recommended by 24 the county compensation board. In determining the final 25 compensation schedule if the board of supervisors wishes to 26 reduce the amount of the recommended compensation schedule, 27 the amount of salary increase proposed for each elected 28 county officer, except as provided in subsection 3, shall be 29 reduced an equal percentage. A copy of the final compensation 30 schedule shall be filed with the county budget at the office 31 of the director of the department of management. The final 32 compensation schedule takes effect on July 1 following its 33 adoption by the board of supervisors.

34 3. The board of supervisors may adopt a decrease in
35 compensation paid to supervisors irrespective of the county

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1 compensation board's recommended compensation schedule or other 2 approved changes in compensation paid to other elected county 3 officers. A decrease in compensation paid to supervisors shall 4 be adopted by the board of supervisors no less than thirty days 5 before the county budget is certified under section 24.17. The elected county officers are also entitled to receive 6 4. 7 their actual and necessary expenses incurred in performance 8 of official duties of their respective offices. The board 9 of supervisors may authorize the reimbursement of expenses 10 related to an educational course, seminar, or school which that ll is attended by a county officer after the county officer is 12 elected, but prior to the county officer taking office. 13 Sec. 7. REPEAL. Section 331.905, Code 2024, is repealed. 14 EXPLANATION 15

17 This bill eliminates county compensation boards and amends 18 the method for determining annual salary increases. The bill 19 grants county boards of supervisors the responsibility of 20 annually preparing and reviewing the compensation schedule 21 for certain elected county officers. Under current law, a 22 county compensation board annually prepares a recommended 23 compensation schedule for certain elected county officers for a 24 succeeding fiscal year subject to adoption by the county board 25 of supervisors.

The bill requires the county board of supervisors to increase an elected county officer's annual salary based on the consumer price index but not by more than 3 percent each year. The bill permits the county board of supervisors to increase elected county officer salaries by ordinance and budgetary procedures, but the salary increase shall not go into effect until the next regular election for which the affected position was on the ballot. For purposes of determining salary increases, the bill requires the county board of supervisors to initially use the salary of a position as of the effective

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1 date of the bill.

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
