A BILL FOR

- $\ensuremath{\mathbf{1}}$ An Act relating to the accurate completion and the correction
- 2 of death certificates.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. Section 144.26, Code 2024, is amended to read as 2 follows:
- 3 144.26 Death certificate.
- 4 l. a. A death certificate for each death which occurs
- 5 in this state shall be filed as directed by the state
- 6 registrar within three days after the death and prior to final
- 7 disposition, and shall be registered by the county registrar
- 8 if it has been completed and filed in accordance with this
- 9 chapter. A death certificate shall include the social security
- 10 number, if provided, of the deceased person. All information
- 11 including the certifying physician's, physician assistant's,
- 12 or advanced registered nurse practitioner's name shall be
- 13 typewritten.
- 14 b. A physician assistant or an advanced registered nurse
- 15 practitioner authorized to sign a death certificate shall be
- 16 licensed in this state and shall have been in charge of the
- 17 deceased patient's care.
- 2. All information included on a death certificate may be
- 19 provided as mutually agreed upon by the state registrar and
- 20 child support services, including by automated exchange.
- 21 3. a. The county in which a dead body is found is the
- 22 county of death. If death occurs in a moving conveyance,
- 23 the county in which the dead body is first removed from the
- 24 conveyance is the county of death.
- 25 b. If a decedent died outside of the county of the
- 26 decedent's residence, the state registrar shall send a copy
- 27 of the decedent's death certificate and any amendments to the
- 28 county registrar of the county of the decedent's residence.
- 29 The county registrar shall record a death certificate received
- 30 pursuant to this paragraph in the same records in which the
- 31 death certificate of a decedent who died within the county
- 32 is recorded. The state registrar may provide the county
- 33 registrars with electronic access to vital records in lieu of
- 34 the requirements of this paragraph.
- 35 4. The department shall provide for correction and

- 1 substitution of a death certificate if evidence substantiating
- 2 the correction or substitution is presented to the state
- 3 registrar within twelve months of the filing of the death
- 4 certificate. The death certificate shall be marked "amended"
- 5 and comply with other requirements pursuant to sections 144.38
- 6 and 144.41.
- 7 4.5. a. The department shall establish by rule procedures
- 8 for making a finding of presumption of death when no body
- 9 can be found. The department shall also provide by rule
- 10 the responsibility for completing and signing the medical
- 11 certification of cause of death in such circumstances. The
- 12 presumptive death certificate shall be in a form prescribed by
- 13 the state registrar and filed in the county where the death was
- 14 presumed to occur.
- 15 b. The department shall provide for the correction,
- 16 substitution, or removal of a presumptive death certificate
- 17 when the body of the person is later found, additional facts
- 18 are discovered, or the person is discovered to be alive.
- 19 6. The department, in consultation with the state medical
- 20 examiner, county medical examiners, the university of Iowa
- 21 hospitals and clinics, the board of mortuary science, and
- 22 the department of veterans affairs, shall implement training
- 23 standards for individuals with a duty related to a death
- 24 certificate to ensure the accurate completion and filing of a
- 25 medical certification of death and a death certificate.
- 26 5. 7. Upon the activation of an electronic death record
- 27 system, each person with a duty related to death certificates
- 28 shall participate in the electronic death record system. A
- 29 person with a duty related to a death certificate includes but
- 30 is not limited to a physician as defined in section 135.1, a
- 31 physician assistant, an advanced registered nurse practitioner,
- 32 a funeral director, and a county recorder.
- 33 EXPLANATION
- 34 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
- 35 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

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- 1 This bill relates to the accurate completion and the
- 2 correction of death certificates.
- 3 The bill provides that the department of health and
- 4 human services (HHS) shall provide for the correction and
- 5 substitution of a death certificate when substantiated evidence
- 6 of a mistake is presented to the state registrar within 12
- 7 months of the filing of the death certificate. The death
- 8 certificate shall be marked "amended" and comply with other
- 9 requirements pursuant to Code sections 144.38 (amendment of
- 10 official record) and 144.41 (amending local records).
- 11 The bill also requires HHS, in consultation with the state
- 12 medical examiner, county medical examiners, the university of
- 13 Iowa hospitals and clinics, the board of mortuary science,
- 14 and the department of veterans affairs, to implement training
- 15 standards for individuals with a duty related to a death
- 16 certificate to ensure the accurate completion and filing of a
- 17 medical certification of death and a death certificate.
