A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to emergency management services and emergency
- 2 medical services and including applicability provisions.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 29C.9, subsection 2, Code 2024, is 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 2. The commission shall be composed of a each member of
- 4 the board of supervisors, the sheriff, and the mayor from each
- 5 city within the county. A commission member may designate
- 6 an alternate to represent the designated entity. For any
- 7 activity relating to section 29C.17, subsection 2, or chapter
- 8 24, participation shall only be by a commission member or a
- 9 designated alternate that is an elected official from the same $% \left(1\right) =\left(1\right) \left(1\right)$
- 10 designated entity.
- 11 Sec. 2. Section 29C.17, subsections 2, 3, and 6, Code 2024,
- 12 are amended to read as follows:
- 2. For purposes consistent with this chapter, the local
- 14 emergency management agency's approved budget shall be funded
- 15 exclusively by one or any combination of the following options,
- 16 as determined by the commission:
- 17 a. A countywide special levy pursuant to section 331.424,
- 18 subsection 1 certified and levied by the commission at a rate
- 19 not to exceed thirty-five cents per one thousand dollars of
- 20 assessed value of taxable property to be used for the support
- 21 of the local emergency management agency, except for special
- 22 or unique services and operations, and a countywide additional
- 23 levy certified and levied by the commission at a rate not to
- 24 exceed one dollar per one thousand dollars of assessed value of
- 25 taxable property to be used only for special or unique services
- 26 and operations approved by the commission. "Special or unique
- 27 services and operations" means any of the following:
- 28 (1) Joint emergency response communications services
- 29 through an agreement entered into under chapter 28E, as
- 30 authorized in section 29C.9, subsection 6.
- 31 (2) Support or equipment for a countywide hazardous
- 32 materials team.
- 33 (3) Support or equipment for a countywide community
- 34 emergency response team.
- 35 (4) Support or equipment for a countywide search, rescue,

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- 1 and recovery team.
- 2 (5) Support or equipment for a countywide incident
- 3 management support team.
- 4 b. One or more of the following options:
- 5 (1) Per capita allocation funded from city and county
- 6 general funds or by a combination of city and county special
- 7 levies which may be apportioned among the member jurisdictions.
- 8 c_{-} (2) An allocation computed as each jurisdiction's
- 9 relative share of the total assessed valuation within the
- 10 county.
- 11 d_{r} (3) A voluntary share allocation.
- 12 e, (4) Other funding sources allowed by law, excluding a
- 13 countywide levy.
- 3. A If a local emergency management agency is funded
- 15 under subsection 2, paragraph b'', a political subdivision may
- 16 appropriate additional funds for the purpose of supporting
- 17 commission expenses relating to special or unique matters
- 18 extending beyond the resources of the agency.
- Subject to chapter 24, the commission shall adopt,
- 20 certify, and provide a budget, on or before February 28 of
- 21 each year, to the funding entities determined pursuant to
- 22 subsection 2. The form of the budget shall be as prescribed
- 23 by the department of management. Any portion of a tax levied
- 24 by a county or city to support the local emergency management
- 25 agency shall be identified separately on tax statements issued
- 26 by the county treasurer. A tax levied by the commission under
- 27 subsection 2, paragraph a, shall be identified separately on
- 28 tax statements issued by the county treasurer.
- 29 Sec. 3. Section 29C.17, Code 2024, is amended by adding the
- 30 following new subsections:
- 31 NEW SUBSECTION. 7. If a commission is meeting the
- 32 financial obligations for implementation of its local emergency
- 33 management program and operation of the local emergency
- 34 management agency, the commission may reserve an amount
- 35 of unobligated and unencumbered funds, excluding amounts

- 1 reserved or obligated under the capital improvement plan under
- 2 subsection 8, for operations expenditure obligations in a
- 3 future fiscal year, not to exceed an amount equal to thirty
- 4 percent of the local emergency management agency's approved
- 5 budget for the fiscal year.
- 6 NEW SUBSECTION. 8. Each commission shall, as part of the
- 7 local emergency management agency's budgeting process, adopt
- 8 a capital improvement plan that identifies large expenditures
- 9 or capital improvement projects and the funding sources
- 10 and financing of such projects for at least the subsequent
- 11 five fiscal years. Amounts reserved or obligated under a
- 12 capital improvement plan are not subject to the reserve amount
- 13 limitation under subsection 7. The local emergency management
- 14 agency's annual budgeting process shall include evaluation
- 15 of the activities undertaken and the progress made under the
- 16 capital improvement plan.
- 17 Sec. 4. Section 331.424, subsection 1, paragraph a,
- 18 subparagraph (9), Code 2024, is amended to read as follows:
- 19 (9) The maintenance and operation of a local emergency
- 20 management agency established pursuant to chapter 29C, unless
- 21 the agency is funded under section 29C.17, subsection 2,
- 22 paragraph "a".
- 23 Sec. 5. Section 384.12, subsection 5, Code 2024, is amended
- 24 to read as follows:
- 25 5. A tax for the support maintenance and operation of
- 26 a local emergency management commission agency established
- 27 pursuant to chapter 29C, unless the agency is funded under
- 28 section 29C.17, subsection 2, paragraph "a".
- 29 Sec. 6. Section 422D.6, subsection 3, Code 2024, is amended
- 30 by adding the following new paragraph:
- 31 NEW PARAGRAPH. i. Salaries and benefits of emergency
- 32 medical care providers, as defined in section 147A.1.
- 33 Sec. 7. APPLICABILITY. This Act applies to budgets for
- 34 property taxes due and payable in fiscal years beginning on or
- 35 after July 1, 2025.

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1	EXPLANATION
2 3	The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
4	Under Code section 29C.17, a local emergency management
5	agency's approved budget is funded by one or any combination
6	of several funding options, as determined by the local
7	emergency management commission, including a countywide
8	special levy pursuant to Code section 331.424(1) under the
9	county's supplemental property tax levy authority in an amount
10	sufficient to pay for the maintenance and operation of the
11	local emergency management agency. This bill authorizes the
12	local emergency management commission to certify and levy the
13	countywide special levy for the support of the agency at a rate
14	not to exceed \$0.35 per \$1,000 of assessed value and limits
15	the county's authority to certify such a levy if the agency
16	is being funded with the countywide levy under the bill. The
17	bill also limits a city's authority to levy a tax under Code
18	section 384.12(5) to support an emergency management agency if
19	the agency is being funded through the countywide levy under
20	the bill.
21	The bill also authorizes the local emergency management
22	commission to certify and levy a countywide additional levy
23	not to exceed \$1.00 per \$1,000 of assessed value for special
24	or unique services and operations, as defined in the bill,
25	approved by the commission.
26	Code section 29C.9 establishes the composition of each
27	local emergency management commission to be a member of the
28	board of supervisors, the sheriff, and the mayor from each
29	city within the county. The bill modifies the composition of
30	each commission so that it includes each member of the board
31	of supervisors.
32	Code chapter 422D authorizes counties to impose a property
33	tax levy, an income surtax, or a combination of both taxes
34	within the county, excluding those areas within a benefited
35	emergency medical services district under Code chapter 357F, to

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- 1 be used for specified emergency medical services costs, if the
- 2 taxes are approved at election.
- 3 The bill adds salaries and benefits of emergency medical
- 4 care providers, as defined in Code section 147A.1, to the
- 5 eligible expenditures from the county emergency medical
- 6 services trust fund under Code section 422D.6.
- 7 The bill also provides that if a commission is meeting
- 8 the financial obligations for implementation of its local
- 9 emergency management program and operation of the local
- 10 emergency management agency, the commission may reserve an
- 11 amount of unobligated and unencumbered funds, excluding amounts
- 12 reserved or obligated under the capital improvement plan,
- 13 as required under the bill, for expenditure obligations in
- 14 a future fiscal year, not to exceed an amount equal to 30
- 15 percent of the local emergency management agency's approved
- 16 budget for the applicable fiscal year. In addition, the
- 17 bill allows the commission to reserve an amount not to
- 18 exceed 5 percent of the annual capital improvement budget for
- 19 operations expenditure obligations in a future fiscal year.
- 20 As part of the local emergency management agency's budgeting
- 21 process, the bill requires the commission to adopt a capital
- 22 improvement plan that identifies large expenditures or capital
- 23 improvement projects and the funding sources and financing
- 24 of such projects. The local emergency management agency's
- 25 annual budgeting process must also include evaluation of the
- 26 activities undertaken and the progress made under the capital
- 27 improvement plan.
- 28 The bill applies to budgets for property taxes due and
- 29 payable in fiscal years beginning on or after July 1, 2025.
