A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act modifying the periods of time to bring civil actions by
- 2 victims of sexual abuse.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. Section 614.1, Code 2023, is amended by adding
- 2 the following new subsection:
- 3 NEW SUBSECTION. 11A. Sexual abuse. No time limitation
- 4 shall apply to an action brought for damages for an injury
- 5 suffered as a result of sexual abuse as defined in section
- 6 709.1.
- 7 Sec. 2. Section 614.1, subsection 12, Code 2023, is amended
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 12. Sexual abuse or sexual exploitation by a counselor,
- 10 therapist, school employee, or adult providing training or
- 11 instruction. An action for damages for injury suffered as
- 12 a result of sexual abuse, as defined in section 709.1, by a
- 13 counselor, therapist, school employee, or adult providing
- 14 training or instruction, as defined in section 709.15, or as a
- 15 result of sexual exploitation by a counselor, therapist, school
- 16 employee, or adult providing training or instruction as defined
- 17 in section 709.15, shall be brought within five years of the
- 18 date the victim was last treated by the counselor or therapist,
- 19 or within five years of the date the victim was last enrolled
- 20 in or attended the school.
- 21 Sec. 3. Section 669.13, subsection 1, Code 2023, is amended
- 22 to read as follows:
- 23 1. Except as provided in section 614.1, subsection 11A,
- 24 and section 614.8, a claim or suit otherwise permitted under
- 25 this chapter shall be forever barred, unless within two years
- 26 after the claim accrued, the claim is made in writing and filed
- 27 with the director of the department of management under this
- 28 chapter. The time to begin a suit under this chapter shall be
- 29 extended for a period of six months from the date of mailing of
- 30 notice to the claimant by the attorney general as to the final
- 31 disposition of the claim or from the date of withdrawal of the
- 32 claim under section 669.5, if the time to begin suit would
- 33 otherwise expire before the end of the period.
- 34 Sec. 4. Section 670.5, unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 2023,
- 35 is amended to read as follows:

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- 1 Except as provided in section 614.1, subsection 11A,
- 2 and section 614.8, a person who claims damages from any
- 3 municipality or any officer, employee or agent of a
- 4 municipality for or on account of any wrongful death, loss, or
- 5 injury within the scope of section 670.2 or section 670.8 or
- 6 under common law shall commence an action therefor within two
- 7 years after the alleged wrongful death, loss, or injury.
- 8 Sec. 5. REPEAL. Section 614.8A, Code 2023, is repealed.
- 9 Sec. 6. REVIVAL.
- 10 1. Every claim or cause of action brought against any party
- 11 alleging intentional or negligent acts or omissions by a person
- 12 for physical, psychological, or other injury or condition
- 13 suffered as a result of conduct which would constitute sexual
- 14 abuse as defined in section 709.1, which is barred as of the
- 15 effective date of this Act because the applicable period of
- 16 limitation has expired or the plaintiff previously failed to
- 17 file a petition, is hereby revived.
- 18 2. Dismissal of such a previous action, ordered before the
- 19 effective date of this Act, on grounds that the action was
- 20 time-barred, or for failure of a party to file a petition,
- 21 shall not be grounds for dismissal of a revival action pursuant
- 22 to this section.
- 23 Sec. 7. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being deemed of immediate
- 24 importance, takes effect upon enactment.
- 25 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
- 27 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 28 This bill provides that there is no time limitation to bring
- 29 civil actions relating to sexual abuse.
- 30 Under current Code section 614.1(12), a civil action for
- 31 damages for injury suffered as result of sexual abuse or sexual
- 32 exploitation by a counselor, therapist, school employee, or
- 33 adult providing training or instruction can only be brought
- 34 within five years after the date that the victim was either
- 35 last treated by the counselor or therapist or last enrolled in

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- 1 or attended the school. Current Code section 614.8A provides a
- 2 four-year limitation for civil actions of sexual abuse against
- 3 a child not discovered until after the injured person is of the
- 4 age of majority. These provisions are stricken or repealed to
- 5 the extent they are duplicative or inconsistent with the bill.
- 6 If an action was previously dismissed before the effective date
- 7 of the bill on the grounds that it was time-barred or because
- 8 the party failed to file a petition, the bill provides the
- 9 party the right to file a revival action.
- 10 The bill also provides that state tort claims and tort
- 11 liability of governmental subdivisions statutes of limitations
- 12 do not apply to sexual abuse actions.
- 13 The bill takes effect upon enactment.
