- 1 An Act relating to the waiver of certain fees for child care
- 2 providers participating in the state child care assistance
- 3 program.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 237A.4, Code 2023, is amended to read as
2 follows:

3 237A.4 Inspection and evaluation.

<u>1.</u> The department shall make periodic inspections
 of licensed centers to ensure compliance with licensing
 requirements provided in this chapter, and the local boards of
 health may make periodic inspections of licensed centers to
 ensure compliance with health-related licensing requirements
 provided in this chapter.

10 <u>2.</u> The department may inspect records maintained by a 11 licensed center and may inquire into matters concerning these 12 centers and the persons in charge.

13 <u>3.</u> The department shall require that the center be inspected 14 by the state fire marshal or a designee for compliance with 15 rules relating to fire safety before a license is granted or 16 renewed.

17 <u>4.</u> The department or a designee may periodically visit 18 registered child development homes for the purpose of 19 evaluation of an inquiry into matters concerning compliance 20 with rules adopted under section 237A.12.

21 <u>5.</u> Evaluation of child development homes under this section 22 may include consultative services provided pursuant to section 23 237A.6.

<u>6. The department shall not require a fee or payment for an</u>
<u>inspection pursuant to this section from a child care provider</u>
<u>participating in the state child care assistance program</u>
established in section 237A.13.

28 Sec. 2. Section 237A.4A, Code 2023, is amended by adding the 29 following new subsection:

30 <u>NEW SUBSECTION</u>. 6. The department shall not require a 31 fee or payment for the licensure of a child care provider 32 participating in the state child care assistance program 33 established in section 237A.13.

34 Sec. 3. Section 237A.5, Code 2023, is amended by adding the 35 following new subsection:

The department shall not require a fee or payment for a record check of personnel employed by a child care provider participating in the state child care assistance program established in section 237A.13.

5 Sec. 4. Section 237A.12, subsection 3, Code 2023, is amended 6 to read as follows:

7 3. <u>a.</u> Rules relating to fire safety <u>or sanitation</u> for 8 child care centers shall be adopted under this chapter by the 9 state fire marshal in consultation with the department. Rules 10 adopted by the state fire marshal for a building which is 11 owned or leased by a school district or accredited nonpublic 12 school and used as a child care facility shall not differ 13 from standards adopted by the state fire marshal for school 14 buildings under chapter 100. Rules relating to sanitation 15 shall be adopted by the department in consultation with the 16 director of public health. All rules shall be developed in 17 consultation with the state child care advisory committee. The 18 state fire marshal shall inspect the facilities.

Rules adopted by the state fire marshal and the 20 department shall not require a fee or payment for the 21 inspection of a child care facility owned or operated by a 22 child care provider participating in the state child care 23 assistance program established in section 237A.13. 24 EXPLANATION

The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

27 This bill relates to the waiver of certain fees for child 28 care providers participating in the state child care assistance 29 program.

The bill prohibits the department of health and human services (HHS) from requiring a fee or payment for an inspection to ensure compliance with child care facility licensing requirements or for the licensure of a child care facility from a child care provider participating in the state child care assistance (CCA) program.

 the record check of personnel employed by a child care provider
 participating in the CCA program.

4 The bill prohibits the state fire marshal and HHS from 5 adopting rules that would require a fee or payment for the 6 inspection of a child care facility owned or operated by a 7 child care provider registered to accept reimbursement from the 8 CCA program.

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
