## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to student chronic absenteeism in open
- 2 enrollment and including applicability provisions.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 282.18, Code 2023, is amended by adding 2 the following new subsection:
```

- NEW SUBSECTION. 11A. a. If a pupil participating in open 3 4 enrollment under this section exhibits chronic absenteeism in 5 the receiving school district, the receiving school district 6 may, following written notice to the pupil's parent or guardian 7 and an attempt to remedy the chronic absences through agreement 8 with the parent or quardian, revoke the pupil's open enrollment 9 in the school district and direct the pupil to enroll in the 10 school district of residence. In order to minimize additional 11 disruption to the pupil's academic progress, a revocation shall 12 occur as close as possible to the conclusion of a semester or 13 other applicable grading period. If a pupil's open enrollment 14 is revoked under this subsection and the pupil enrolls in the 15 district of residence for the remainder of the school year, the 16 receiving district shall pay to the district of residence the 17 prorated amount of the amount paid to the receiving district 18 under subsection 5 or 6 that corresponds to the remaining 19 portion of the school year.
- 20 b. For purposes of this subsection, "chronic absenteeism"
  21 means missing all or a portion of at least ten percent of
  22 school days for two or more consecutive grading periods, each
  23 grading period consisting of not less than nine weeks.
- Sec. 2. APPLICABILITY. This Act applies to school years 25 beginning on or after July 1, 2023.

## 26 EXPLANATION

- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- This bill amends Code section 282.18 relating to student open enrollment. Under the bill, if a pupil participating in open enrollment exhibits chronic absenteeism in the receiving school district, the receiving school district may, following written notice to the pupil's parent or guardian and an attempt to remedy the chronic absences through agreement with the parent or guardian, revoke the pupil's open enrollment in the

- 2 district of residence. The bill defines "chronic absenteeism"
- 3 to mean missing all or a portion of at least 10 percent of
- 4 school days for two or more consecutive grading periods, each
- 5 grading period consisting of not less than nine weeks.
- 6 Code section 282.18(13) provides that the director of the
- 7 department of education shall recommend rules to the state
- 8 board of education for the orderly implementation of the open
- 9 enrollment law and requires the state board to adopt rules as
- 10 needed for the implementation of the open enrollment law.
