- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 155A.46, subsection 1, paragraph a, Code 2 2023, is amended to read as follows:
- 3 a. A pharmacist may, pursuant to statewide protocols
- 4 developed by the board in consultation with the department of
- 5 public health and human services and consistent with subsection
- 6 2, order and administer the following to patients ages eighteen
- 7 years and older:

- 8 (1) Naloxone.
 - (2) Nicotine replacement tobacco cessation products.
- 10 (3) An immunization or vaccination recommended by the
- 11 United States centers for disease control and prevention
- 12 advisory committee on immunization practices in its approved
- 13 vaccination schedule for adults.
- 14 (4) An immunization or vaccination recommended by the
- 15 United States centers for disease control and prevention for
- 16 international travel.
- 17 (5) A Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, acellular pertussis)
- 18 vaccination in a booster application.
- 19 (6) Other emergency immunizations or vaccinations in
- 20 response to a public health emergency.
- 21 (7) An immunization or vaccination for COVID-19 as defined
- 22 in section 686D.2.
- 23 (8) Epinephrine auto-injectors.
- 24 EXPLANATION
- 25 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
- the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 27 This bill relates to the ordering and administering
- 28 of epinephrine auto-injectors by a pharmacist without a
- 29 prescription.
- 30 The bill provides that in accordance with statewide
- 31 protocols developed by the board of pharmacy in consultation
- 32 with the department of health and human services as well as
- 33 other requirements, a pharmacist may order and administer an
- 34 epinephrine auto-injector without a prescription to a person
- 35 who is at least 18 years of age.
