A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to hospitals, ambulatory surgical centers, and
- 2 health care facilities, including information and reporting
- 3 requirements.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. Section 135.61, Code 2023, is amended by adding
- 2 the following new subsection:
- 3 NEW SUBSECTION. 1A. "Ambulatory surgical center" means the
- 4 same as defined in section 147.163.
- 5 Sec. 2. Section 135.61, subsection 14, paragraph d, Code
- 6 2023, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 d. An outpatient ambulatory surgical facility center.
- 8 Sec. 3. Section 135.61, subsection 21, Code 2023, is amended
- 9 by striking the subsection.
- 10 Sec. 4. NEW SECTION. 135.75A Additional annual reports
- 11 by hospitals, ambulatory surgical centers, and health care
- 12 facilities.
- 13 In addition to any other information and reporting required
- 14 under this subchapter, the department shall require all of the
- 15 following:
- 16 l. Hospitals and ambulatory surgical centers shall annually
- 17 report all of the following to the department and to the board
- 18 of medicine in a format required by the department:
- 19 a. Surgical, medical, anesthesia-related, or other
- 20 complications from surgeries or treatment provided to patients
- 21 by the hospital or ambulatory surgical center.
- 22 b. The type and number of each type of surgery performed in
- 23 the prior calendar year.
- 24 c. Return visit and readmission rates related to a previous
- 25 treatment or surgery, not including scheduled follow-up
- 26 appointments.
- 27 d. Findings from surveys on patient safety culture conducted
- 28 by the federal agency for healthcare research and quality for
- 29 the prior calendar year.
- 30 2. Hospitals and ambulatory surgical centers shall provide
- 31 patient education related to the top five most common surgeries
- 32 performed in the state. The education materials shall be
- 33 developed by the department in consultation with the board of
- 34 medicine, the Iowa hospital association, and the university of
- 35 Iowa hospitals and clinics.

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- 3. Hospitals, ambulatory surgical centers, and health care 2 facilities shall do all of the following:
- 3 a. Post information about the regulatory functions of the 4 department and the health care professional licensing boards,
- 5 including how to contact the department or licensing boards.
- 6 b. Provide information to patients and residents regarding 7 the actual reimbursement received from a third party for any 8 charges imposed on a patient or resident.
- 9 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

- 16 and reporting required under Code chapter 135, subchapter
- 17 VI, relating to the health facilities council, hospitals and
- 18 ambulatory surgical centers shall annually report all of the
- 19 following to the department of health and human services (HHS)
- 20 and to the board of medicine in a format required by HHS:
- 21 surgical, medical, anesthesia-related, or other complications
- 22 from surgeries or treatment provided to patients by the
- 23 hospital or ambulatory surgical center; the type and number
- 24 of each type of surgery performed in the prior calendar year;
- 25 the return visit and readmission rates related to a previous
- 26 treatment or surgery, not including scheduled follow-up
- 27 appointments; and the findings from surveys on patient safety
- 28 culture conducted by the federal agency for healthcare research
- 29 and quality for the prior calendar year.
- 30 The bill requires hospitals and ambulatory surgical centers
- 31 to provide patient education related to the top five most
- 32 common surgeries performed in the state. The education
- 33 materials shall be developed by HHS in consultation with the
- 34 board of medicine, the Iowa hospital association, and the
- 35 university of Iowa hospitals and clinics.

- 2 and health care facilities to post information about the
- 3 regulatory functions of HHS, the department of inspections
- 4 and appeals, and health care professional licensing boards,
- 5 including how to contact the departments or licensing boards;
- 6 and to provide information to patients and residents regarding
- 7 the actual reimbursement received from a third party for any
- 8 charges imposed on a patient or resident.
