## A BILL FOR

An Act relating to criteria for and funding of approved local
 preschool programs and including applicability provisions.
 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 256C.3, subsection 3, paragraph f, Code
2 2023, is amended to read as follows:

*f.* A minimum of ten thirty hours per week of instruction 4 delivered on the skills and knowledge included in the student 5 learning standards developed for the preschool program.

6 Sec. 2. Section 256C.5, subsection 1, paragraph c, Code 7 2023, is amended to read as follows:

8 c. "Preschool budget enrollment" means the figure that is 9 equal to fifty percent of the actual enrollment of eligible 10 students in the preschool programming provided by a school 11 district approved to participate in the preschool program on 12 October 1 of the base year, or the first Monday in October if 13 October 1 falls on a Saturday or Sunday.

14 Sec. 3. Section 256C.5, subsection 2, paragraph a, Code 15 2023, is amended to read as follows:

*a.* For the initial school year for which a school district approved to participate in the preschool program receives that approval and implements the preschool program, the funding for the preschool foundation aid payable to that school district shall be paid from the appropriation made for that school year in section 256C.6, Code 2011, or in another appropriation made for purposes of this chapter. For that school year, the preschool foundation aid payable to the school district is the product of the regular program state cost per pupil for the school year multiplied by sixty percent of the school district's eligible student enrollment on the date in the school year determined by rule.

28 Sec. 4. APPLICABILITY. This Act applies to school budget 29 years beginning on or after July 1, 2024.

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EXPLANATION

The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

33 The statewide preschool program for four-year-old children 34 under Code chapter 256C imposes requirements for approved local 35 preschool programs including a minimum of 10 hours per week

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1 of instruction delivered on the skills and knowledge included 2 in the student learning standards developed for the preschool 3 program. This bill increases the minimum number of hours of 4 instruction from 10 to 30 per week.

5 The amount of state funding for each school district's 6 approved local program is determined using a preschool budget 7 enrollment that is equal to 50 percent of the actual enrollment 8 of eligible students in the preschool programming provided by 9 a school district on October 1 of the base year. The bill 10 changes the preschool budget enrollment used to determine 11 funding to an amount equal to 100 percent of the actual 12 enrollment of eligible students in the preschool programming 13 provided by a school district on October 1 of the base 14 year. The bill also modifies the funding calculation for the 15 initial school year for which a school district is approved to 16 participate in the program.

17 The bill applies to school budget years beginning on or after 18 July 1, 2024.

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
