## A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to special elections to fill vacancies in
2 county boards of supervisors and city elective offices, and
3 including applicability provisions.
4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 331.306, subsection l, Code 2023, is amended to read as follows:
l. a. If a petition of the voters is authorized by this chapter, the petition is valid if signed by eligible electors of the county equal in number to at least ten percent of the votes cast in the county for the office of president of the United States or governor at the preceding general election, unless otherwise provided by state law, and except as provided in paragraph " $b$ ". The petition shall include the signatures of the petitioners, a statement of their place of residence, and the date on which they signed the petition.
b. A petition to fill a vacancy in the office of county supervisor by a special election filed pursuant to section 69.14A, subsection 1 , must be signed by eligible electors of the county equal in number to at least two percent of the votes cast in the county for the office of president of the United States or governor at the preceding general election or the number of signatures required for nomination of a county supervisor pursuant to section 45.1 , whichever is greater.

Sec. 2. Section 372.13 , subsection 2 , paragraph a, subparagraph (2), subparagraph divisions (a), (b), and (c), Code 2023, are amended to read as follows:
(a) For a city with a population of ten thousand or less, at least two hundred signatures or at least the number of signatures equal to fifteen two percent of the voters who voted for candidates for the office at the preceding regular election at which the office was on the ballot, whichever number is fewer.
(b) For a city with a population of more than ten thousand but not more than fifty thousand, at least one thousand signatures or at least the number of signatures equal to fifteen two percent of the voters who voted for candidates for the office at the preceding regular election at which the office was on the ballot, whichever number is fewer.
(c) For a city with a population of more than fifty
thousand, at least two thousand signatures or at least the number of signatures equal to ten two percent of the voters who 3 voted for candidates for the office at the preceding regular 4 election at which the office was on the ballot, whichever 5 number is fewer.
