## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to special elections to fill vacancies in
- 2 county boards of supervisors and city elective offices, and
- 3 including applicability provisions.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 331.306, subsection 1, Code 2023, is 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 l. a. If a petition of the voters is authorized by this
- 4 chapter, the petition is valid if signed by eligible electors
- 5 of the county equal in number to at least ten percent of the
- 6 votes cast in the county for the office of president of the
- 7 United States or governor at the preceding general election,
- 8 unless otherwise provided by state law, and except as provided
- 9 in paragraph "b". The petition shall include the signatures of
- 10 the petitioners, a statement of their place of residence, and
- 11 the date on which they signed the petition.
- 12 b. A petition to fill a vacancy in the office of county
- 13 supervisor by a special election filed pursuant to section
- 14 69.14A, subsection 1, must be signed by eligible electors of
- 15 the county equal in number to at least two percent of the
- 16 votes cast in the county for the office of president of the
- 17 United States or governor at the preceding general election or
- 18 the number of signatures required for nomination of a county
- 19 supervisor pursuant to section 45.1, whichever is greater.
- 20 Sec. 2. Section 372.13, subsection 2, paragraph a,
- 21 subparagraph (2), subparagraph divisions (a), (b), and (c),
- 22 Code 2023, are amended to read as follows:
- 23 (a) For a city with a population of ten thousand or less,
- 24 at least two hundred signatures or at least the number of
- 25 signatures equal to fifteen two percent of the voters who voted
- 26 for candidates for the office at the preceding regular election
- 27 at which the office was on the ballot, whichever number is
- 28 fewer.
- 29 (b) For a city with a population of more than ten thousand
- 30 but not more than fifty thousand, at least one thousand
- 31 signatures or at least the number of signatures equal to
- 32 fifteen two percent of the voters who voted for candidates
- 33 for the office at the preceding regular election at which the
- 34 office was on the ballot, whichever number is fewer.
- 35 (c) For a city with a population of more than fifty

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- 1 thousand, at least two thousand signatures or at least the
- 2 number of signatures equal to ten two percent of the voters who
- 3 voted for candidates for the office at the preceding regular
- 4 election at which the office was on the ballot, whichever
- 5 number is fewer.
- 6 Sec. 3. APPLICABILITY. This Act applies to vacancies in
- 7 county boards of supervisors and city elective offices arising
- 8 on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 9 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 12 This bill relates to special elections to fill vacancies in
- 13 county boards of supervisors and elective city offices. The
- 14 bill changes the number of signatures required on a petition to
- 15 fill a vacancy in the office of county supervisor by a special
- 16 election from 10 percent of the votes cast in the county
- 17 for office of president or governor at the preceding general
- 18 election to 2 percent or the number of signatures required for
- 19 nomination of a county supervisor, whichever is greater. The
- 20 bill also changes the signature requirements for a petition to
- 21 fill a vacancy in an elective city office to 2 percent of the
- 22 voters who voted for candidates for the office at the preceding
- 23 regular election at which the office was on the ballot. The
- 24 bill does not change alternate minimum signature requirements
- 25 based on city size.
- 26 The bill applies to vacancies in county boards of
- 27 supervisors and city elective offices arising on or after the
- 28 effective date of the bill.
