A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to childhood lead poisoning.
- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. Section 135.101, Code 2023, is amended to read 2 as follows:
- 3 135.101 Childhood lead poisoning prevention program.
- 4 There is established a childhood lead poisoning prevention
- 5 program within the lowa department of public health. The
- 6 department shall implement and review programs necessary to
- 7 eliminate potentially dangerous toxic lead levels in children
- 8 in Iowa in a year for which funds are appropriated to the
- 9 department for this purpose. The program guidelines shall be
- 10 based on the maximum blood lead level in children as specified
- 11 by rule of the department and shall provide for responsive
- 12 action, including but not limited to case management services
- 13 for children and the provision of available home intervention
- 14 and target housing resources, when the maximum level is met
- 15 or exceeded in accordance with the most recent recommended
- 16 actions based on blood lead level published by the centers for
- 17 disease control and prevention of the United States department
- 18 of health and human services.
- 19 Sec. 2. Section 135.102, subsections 3 and 6, Code 2023, are
- 20 amended to read as follows:
- 21 3. Maximum The maximum blood lead levels level in children
- 22 living in targeted rental dwelling units that is the level of
- 23 lead in the bloodstream that equals or exceeds the lower of
- 24 three and one-half micrograms of lead per deciliter of blood,
- 25 or an amount identified in the most recent recommendations by
- 26 the centers for disease control and prevention of the United
- 27 States department of health and human services, and that
- 28 necessitates the undertaking of responsive action, including
- 29 but not limited to case management services for children and
- 30 the provision of available home intervention and target housing
- 31 resources.
- Model regulations Guidelines, as specified in section
- 33 135.105B, for lead hazard remediation to be used by the
- 34 state and in local programs in instances in which a child is
- 35 confirmed as lead poisoned. The department shall make the

- 1 model regulations guidelines available to local boards of
- 2 health and shall promote the adoption of the regulations to be
- 3 used at the local level, in cities and counties implementing
- 4 lead hazard remediation programs to provide consistency
- 5 throughout the state. Nothing in this subsection shall be
- 6 construed as requiring the adoption of the model regulations.
- 7 Sec. 3. Section 135.103, Code 2023, is amended to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 135.103 Grant program.
- 10 The department shall implement a childhood lead poisoning
- 11 prevention grant program which provides federal, state, or
- 12 other funds to local boards of health or cities and counties
- 13 for the program after standards and requirements for the
- 14 local program are developed consistent with the most recent
- 15 recommendations regarding the maximum blood lead level and
- 16 recommended actions based on blood lead level published by
- 17 the centers for disease control and prevention of the United
- 18 States department of health and human services. The department
- 19 may also use federal, state, or other funds provided for the
- 20 childhood lead poisoning prevention grant program to purchase
- 21 environmental and blood testing services from a public health
- 22 laboratory.
- 23 Sec. 4. Section 135.105B, Code 2023, is amended by striking
- 24 the section and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
- 25 135.105B Guidelines for local lead hazard remediation
- 26 programs.
- 27 l. The department shall develop guidelines to be used by
- 28 local programs that administer lead hazard remediation programs
- 29 to address the health and environmental needs of children who
- 30 are confirmed as lead poisoned.
- 31 2. The quidelines shall be based on the most recent
- 32 guidelines published by the centers for disease control and
- 33 prevention of the United States department of health and human
- 34 services for recommended actions based on blood lead level and
- 35 shall reflect the maximum blood lead level specified by rule

1 of the department.

- A city or county may elect to administer a local program
- 3 through a city or county health department on a city, county,
- 4 or multicounty basis or may request that the state develop and
- 5 administer the local program.
- 6 EXPLANATION
- 7 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 9 This bill amends provisions relating to the childhood lead
- 10 poisoning prevention program (program) in the department of
- 11 health and human services (HHS) to align maximum blood lead
- 12 level provisions and program activities with the most recent
- 13 maximum lead level in children specified by the centers for
- 14 disease control and prevention (CDC) and the recommended
- 15 actions based on the CDC blood lead level.
- 16 The bill requires HHS guidelines for the program to be based
- 17 on the maximum blood lead level in children as specified by
- 18 rule of HHS and shall provide for responsive action, including
- 19 but not limited to case management services for children
- 20 and the provision of available home intervention and target
- 21 housing resources, when the maximum level is met or exceeded in
- 22 accordance with the most recent recommended actions published
- 23 by the CDC.
- 24 The bill requires HHS to adopt rules for the program that
- 25 specify the maximum blood lead level in children as the level
- 26 of lead in the bloodstream that equals or exceeds the lower of
- 27 3.5 micrograms of lead per deciliter of blood, or an amount
- 28 identified in the most recent recommendations by the CDC,
- 29 and that necessitates the undertaking of responsive action,
- 30 including but not limited to case management services for
- 31 children and the provision of home intervention and target
- 32 housing resources.
- 33 The bill also requires the guidelines for lead hazard
- 34 remediation used for both state and local programs in instances
- 35 in which a child is confirmed as lead poisoned, to be based on

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- 1 the CDC guidelines and consistent throughout the state.
- 2 The bill provides that the grant program requirements,
- 3 providing federal, state, or other funds, are to be consistent
- 4 with the most recent CDC-recommended maximum blood lead level
- 5 and actions.
- 6 The bill requires the HHS guidelines used by local lead
- 7 hazard remediation programs to be based on the most recent CDC
- 8 guidelines for recommended actions based on blood lead level
- 9 and reflect the maximum blood lead level specified by rule of
- 10 HHS. The bill continues the current option under the program
- 11 for a city or county to elect to administer a local program
- 12 through a city or county health department on a city, county,
- 13 or multicounty basis or to request that the state develop and
- 14 administer the local program.
