**A BILL FOR**

1 An Act relating to and making appropriations involving certain  
2 state departments, agencies, funds, and certain other  
3 entities, providing for regulatory authority, and providing  
4 for properly related matters.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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DIVISION I  
FY 2023-2024

Section 1. DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES.

1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the department of administrative services for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

a. For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes, and for not more than the following full-time equivalent positions:

25 unencumbered or unobligated moneys remaining in this workers'  
26 compensation fund at the end of the fiscal year shall not  
27 revert but shall remain available for expenditure for purposes  
28 of the fund in subsequent fiscal years.

29 Sec. 2. REVOLVING FUNDS. There is appropriated to the  
30 department of administrative services for the fiscal year  
31 beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024, from the  
32 revolving funds designated in [chapter 8A](#) and from internal  
33 service funds created by the department such amounts as the  
34 department deems necessary for the operation of the department  
35 consistent with the requirements of [chapter 8A](#).

1     Sec. 3. STATE EMPLOYEE HEALTH INSURANCE ADMINISTRATION  
2 CHARGE. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending  
3 June 30, 2024, the monthly per contract administrative charge  
4 which may be assessed by the department of administrative  
5 services shall be \$2.00 per contract on all health insurance  
6 plans administered by the department.

7     Sec. 4. AUDITOR OF STATE.

8     1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
9 to the office of the auditor of state for the fiscal year  
10 beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024, the following  
11 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the  
12 purposes designated:

13     For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous  
14 purposes, and for not more than the following full-time  
15 equivalent positions:

18     2. The auditor of state may retain additional full-time  
19 equivalent positions as is reasonable and necessary to  
20 perform governmental subdivision audits which are reimbursable  
21 pursuant to [section 11.20](#) or [11.21](#), to perform audits which are  
22 requested by and reimbursable from the federal government, and  
23 to perform work requested by and reimbursable from departments  
24 or agencies pursuant to [section 11.5A](#) or [11.5B](#). The auditor  
25 of state shall notify the department of management, the  
26 legislative fiscal committee, and the legislative services  
27 agency of the additional full-time equivalent positions  
28 retained.

29     3. The auditor of state shall allocate moneys from the  
30 appropriation in this section solely for audit work related to  
31 the annual comprehensive financial report, federally required  
32 audits, and investigations of embezzlement, theft, or other  
33 significant financial irregularities until the audit of the  
34 annual comprehensive financial report is complete.

35     Sec. 5. IOWA ETHICS AND CAMPAIGN DISCLOSURE BOARD. There

1 is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the  
2 Iowa ethics and campaign disclosure board for the fiscal year  
3 beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024, the following  
4 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the  
5 purposes designated:

14 cited regulations, the scope and severity of deficiencies  
15 identified, and federal and state fines assessed and collected  
16 concerning nursing and assisted living facilities and programs.

17 c. It is the intent of the general assembly that the  
18 department continuously solicit input from health facilities  
19 regulated by the department to assess and improve the  
20 department's level of collaboration and to identify new  
21 opportunities for cooperation.

22 5. EMPLOYMENT APPEAL BOARD

23 a. For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous

1 c. The employment appeal board may temporarily exceed and  
2 draw more than the amount appropriated in this subsection and  
3 incur a negative cash balance as long as there are receivables  
4 of federal funds equal to or greater than the negative balance  
5 and the amount appropriated in this subsection is not exceeded  
6 at the close of the fiscal year.

1 fee shall be paid by the petitioner of a claim. However,  
2 the fee can be taxed as a cost and paid by the losing party,  
3 except in cases where it would impose an undue hardship or be  
4 unjust under the circumstances. The moneys generated by the  
5 filing fee allowed under this paragraph are appropriated to  
6 the department to be used for purposes of administering the  
7 division of workers' compensation.

22 1. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending  
23 June 30, 2024, the department of inspections, appeals, and  
24 licensing shall collect any license or registration fees or  
25 electronic transaction fees generated during the fiscal year  
26 as a result of licensing and registration activities under  
27 chapters 99B, 137C, 137D, and 137F.

28 2. From the fees collected by the department under this  
29 section on behalf of a municipal corporation with which  
30 the department has an agreement pursuant to section 137F.3,  
31 through a statewide electronic licensing system operated by  
32 the department, notwithstanding section 137F.6, subsection 2,  
33 the department shall remit the amount of those fees to the  
34 municipal corporation for whom the fees were collected less  
35 any electronic transaction fees collected by the department to

1 enable electronic payment.

2 3. From the fees collected by the department under this  
3 section, other than those fees described in subsection 2, the  
4 department shall deposit the amount of \$\_\_\_\_\_ into the  
5 general fund of the state prior to June 30, 2024.

6 4. From the fees collected by the department under this  
7 section, other than those fees described in subsections 2 and  
8 3, the department shall retain the remainder of the fees for  
9 the purposes of enforcing the provisions of chapters 99B, 137C,  
10 137D, and 137F. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys retained  
11 by the department pursuant to this subsection that remain  
12 unencumbered or unobligated at the close of the fiscal year  
13 shall not revert but shall remain available for expenditure  
14 for the purposes of enforcing the provisions of chapters 99B,  
15 137C, 137D, and 137F during the succeeding fiscal year. The  
16 department shall provide an annual report to the department  
17 of management and the legislative services agency on fees  
18 billed and collected and expenditures from the moneys retained  
19 by the department in a format determined by the department  
20 of management in consultation with the legislative services  
21 agency.
