21 resources by making appropriations for FY 2023-2024 to support
22 related entities, including the department of agriculture and
23 land stewardship (DALS), the department of natural resources
24 (DNR), Iowa state university (ISU), and the university of Iowa
25 (UI).
26
      The bill primarily appropriates moneys to DALS and DNR.
27 The appropriations are made to support those departments for
28 administration, regulation, and support of programs.
29 requires the departments to submit quarterly reports to the
30 general assembly and department of management regarding the
31 expenditure of appropriated moneys. The bill also provides
32 moneys to support specific programs or projects administered by
33 those departments.
     The bill primarily appropriates moneys from the state
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35 general fund (GF) and the environment first fund (EFF) to

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- 1 support DALS and DNR, but also UI and ISU, and to support
- 2 a number of designated activities, projects, and programs
- 3 administered by those agencies. General appropriations are
- 4 made from other major sources, including the state fish and
- 5 game protection fund (SFGPF) and the groundwater protection
- 6 fund (GPF), both administered by DNR. Finally, appropriations
- 7 are made from and to a number of dedicated sources, including
- 8 the resources enhancement and protection (REAP) fund
- 9 administered by DNR, and the renewable fuel infrastructure
- 10 fund (RFIF) and the water quality initiative fund (WQIF)
- 11 administered by DALS.
- 12 DALS GF APPROPRIATIONS. The bill appropriates moneys
- 13 to DALS from the GF in order to support its administrative
