Senate Study Bill 1008 - Introduced

A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to the requirements for a prescribing
- 2 psychologist or a psychologist with a conditional
- 3 prescription certificate.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 154B.1, subsections 3 and 5, Code 2023,
 are amended to read as follows:

3 3. *Collaborative relationship* means a cooperative 4 working relationship between a prescribing psychologist or 5 a psychologist with a conditional prescription certificate 6 and a licensed physician in the provision of patient primary 7 care provider who oversees the patient's general medical care, 8 including diagnosis and cooperation in the management and 9 delivery of physical and mental health care.

10 5. "Physician" means a person licensed to practice medicine 11 and surgery or osteopathic medicine and surgery in this state 12 who is board-certified in family medicine, internal medicine, 13 pediatrics, psychiatry, or another specialty who prescribes 14 medications for the treatment of a mental disorder to patients 15 in the normal course of the person's clinical medical practice 16 pursuant to joint rules adopted by the board of psychology and 17 the board of medicine.

18 Sec. 2. Section 154B.10, subsection 1, paragraphs d and e, 19 Code 2023, are amended to read as follows:

20 d. Within five years immediately preceding the date of 21 application, successfully Successfully completed a postdoctoral 22 master of science degree in clinical psychopharmacology 23 approved by the board of psychology and the board of medicine 24 pursuant to joint rules adopted by both boards. The program 25 shall at a minimum include coursework in neuroscience, 26 pharmacology, psychopharmacology, physiology, and appropriate 27 and relevant physical and laboratory assessments.

e. Within five years immediately preceding the date
of application, has <u>Has</u> been certified by the applicant's
supervising physician as having successfully completed a
supervised and relevant clinical experience in clinical
assessment and pathophysiology and an additional supervised
practicum treating patients with mental disorders. The
practica shall have been supervised by a trained physician.
The board of psychology and the board of medicine, pursuant to

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1 joint rules adopted by the boards, shall determine sufficient 2 practica to competently train the applicant in the treatment of 3 a diverse patient population.

4 Sec. 3. Section 154B.12, subsection 2, Code 2023, is amended 5 to read as follows:

6 2. When prescribing psychotropic medication for a patient, 7 the prescribing psychologist or the psychologist with a 8 conditional prescription certificate shall maintain an ongoing 9 collaborative relationship with the licensed physician primary 10 <u>care provider</u> who oversees the patient's general medical care 11 to ensure that necessary medical examinations are conducted, 12 the psychotropic medication is appropriate for the patient's 13 medical condition, and significant changes in the patient's 14 medical or psychological condition are discussed. 15 EXPLANATION

16The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with17the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

18 Under current law, to be granted a conditional prescription 19 certificate, an applicant who holds a current license to 20 practice psychology in the state, among other requirements, 21 must within five years immediately preceding the date of 22 application, have both successfully completed a postdoctoral 23 master of science degree in clinical psychopharmacology 24 approved by the board of psychology and the board of medicine, 25 and have been certified by the applicant's supervising 26 physician as having successfully completed a supervised 27 and relevant clinical experience in clinical assessment and 28 pathophysiology and an additional supervised practicum treating 29 patients with mental disorders. This bill retains both of 30 these requirements but eliminates the condition that these 31 requirements must have been completed within the five years 32 immediately preceding the date of application for a conditional 33 prescription certificate.

34 Current law requires that when prescribing psychotropic 35 medication for a patient, the prescribing psychologist or

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1 the psychologist with a conditional prescription certificate
2 shall maintain an ongoing collaborative relationship with the
3 licensed physician in the provision of patient care. The bill
4 instead provides that the ongoing collaborative relationship
5 be with the patient's primary care provider who oversees the
6 patient's general medical care, rather than the patient's
7 licensed physician.

8 The bill also redefines "physician" for the purposes of Code 9 chapter 154B (psychology). Current law defines "physician" 10 to mean a person licensed to practice medicine and surgery 11 or osteopathic medicine and surgery in this state who is 12 board-certified in a speciality who prescribes medications 13 for the treatment of a mental disorder. The bill removes the 14 condition that the licensed person also be board-certified in 15 the speciality.

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
