## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to a Brady-Giglio list maintained by a
- 2 prosecuting agency, and including effective date provisions.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 80F.1, subsection 1, paragraph a, Code
- 2 2023, is amended to read as follows:
- 3 a. "Brady-Giglio list" means a list compiled by a
- 4 prosecuting agency containing the names and details of officers
- 5 who have sustained incidents of untruthfulness, criminal
- 6 convictions, candor issues, or some other type of issue which
- 7 places the officer's credibility into question. This paragraph
- 8 is repealed July 1, 2023 2024.
- 9 Sec. 2. Section 80F.1, subsection 24, paragraph i, Code
- 10 2023, is amended to read as follows:
- 11 *i*. This subsection is repealed July 1,  $\frac{2023}{2024}$  2024.
- 12 Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being deemed of immediate
- 13 importance, takes effect upon enactment.
- 14 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
- 16 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 17 This bill relates to a Brady-Giglio list maintained by a
- 18 prosecuting agency.
- 19 Current law in Code chapter 80F (peace officer, public
- 20 safety, and emergency personnel bill of rights) describes
- 21 procedural requirements that a prosecuting agency that
- 22 maintains a Brady-Giglio list must comply with and provides
- 23 a definition of "Brady-Giglio list". These requirements and
- 24 definition were set by the general assembly to be repealed on
- 25 July 1, 2023. The bill extends the future repeal provisions to
- 26 July 1, 2024.
- 27 The bill takes effect upon enactment.
