A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to assaults on sports officials, making
- 2 penalties applicable, and including effective date
- 3 provisions.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 708.3A, subsections 1, 2, 3, and 4, Code
2 2023, are amended to read as follows:

1. A person who commits an assault, as defined in section 3 4 708.1, against a peace officer, jailer, correctional staff, 5 member or employee of the board of parole, health care 6 provider, employee of the department of human services, 7 employee of the department of revenue, national guard member 8 engaged in national guard duty or state active duty, civilian 9 employee of a law enforcement agency, civilian employee of a 10 fire department, or fire fighter, whether paid or volunteer, ll or sports official, with the knowledge that the person against 12 whom the assault is committed is a peace officer, jailer, 13 correctional staff, member or employee of the board of parole, 14 health care provider, employee of the department of human 15 services, employee of the department of revenue, national 16 guard member engaged in national guard duty or state active 17 duty, civilian employee of a law enforcement agency, civilian 18 employee of a fire department, or fire fighter, or sports 19 official, and with the intent to inflict a serious injury 20 upon the peace officer, jailer, correctional staff, member 21 or employee of the board of parole, health care provider, 22 employee of the department of human services, employee of 23 the department of revenue, national guard member engaged in 24 national guard duty or state active duty, civilian employee 25 of a law enforcement agency, civilian employee of a fire 26 department, or fire fighter, or sports official, is guilty of a 27 class "D" felony.

28 2. A person who commits an assault, as defined in section 29 708.1, against a peace officer, jailer, correctional staff, 30 member or employee of the board of parole, health care 31 provider, employee of the department of human services, 32 employee of the department of revenue, national guard member 33 engaged in national guard duty or state active duty, civilian 34 employee of a law enforcement agency, civilian employee of a 35 fire department, or fire fighter, whether paid or volunteer,

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1 or sports official, who knows that the person against whom the 2 assault is committed is a peace officer, jailer, correctional 3 staff, member or employee of the board of parole, health 4 care provider, employee of the department of human services, 5 employee of the department of revenue, national guard member 6 engaged in national guard duty or state active duty, civilian 7 employee of a law enforcement agency, civilian employee of a 8 fire department, or fire fighter, or sports official, and who 9 uses or displays a dangerous weapon in connection with the 10 assault, is guilty of a class "D" felony.

3. A person who commits an assault, as defined in section 11 12 708.1, against a peace officer, jailer, correctional staff, 13 member or employee of the board of parole, health care 14 provider, employee of the department of human services, 15 employee of the department of revenue, national guard member 16 engaged in national guard duty or state active duty, civilian 17 employee of a law enforcement agency, civilian employee of a 18 fire department, or fire fighter, whether paid or volunteer, 19 or sports official, who knows that the person against whom the 20 assault is committed is a peace officer, jailer, correctional 21 staff, member or employee of the board of parole, health 22 care provider, employee of the department of human services, 23 employee of the department of revenue, national guard member 24 engaged in national guard duty or state active duty, civilian 25 employee of a law enforcement agency, civilian employee of 26 a fire department, or fire fighter, or sports official, and 27 who causes bodily injury or mental illness, is guilty of an 28 aggravated misdemeanor.

4. Any other assault, as defined in section 708.1, committed against a peace officer, jailer, correctional staff, member in or employee of the board of parole, health care provider, employee of the department of human services, employee of the department of revenue, national guard member engaged in the department of revenue, national guard member engaged in ational guard duty or state active duty, civilian employee of a law enforcement agency, civilian employee of a fire

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LSB 2322XC (3) 90 as/rh 1 department, or fire fighter, whether paid or volunteer, or 2 sports official, by a person who knows that the person against 3 whom the assault is committed is a peace officer, jailer, 4 correctional staff, member or employee of the board of parole, 5 health care provider, employee of the department of human 6 services, employee of the department of revenue, national 7 guard member engaged in national guard duty or state active 8 duty, civilian employee of a law enforcement agency, civilian 9 employee of a fire department, or fire fighter, or sports 10 official, is a serious misdemeanor.

11 Sec. 2. Section 708.3A, subsection 5, Code 2023, is amended
12 by adding the following new paragraph:

NEW PARAGRAPH. Oh. "Sports official" means an individual who serves as a referee, umpire, or linesman, or in a similar capacity, at any athletic contest, and who is a member of or registered with a local, state, regional, or national organization that is engaged, in part, in providing education and training to referees, umpires, linesmen, or persons in similar capacities.

20 Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being deemed of immediate 21 importance, takes effect upon enactment.

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EXPLANATION

23The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with24the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

25 This bill relates to assaults on sports officials.

Current law provides that a person who commits an assault, as defined in Code section 708.1, with the knowledge that the other person is a peace officer, jailer, correctional staff, member or employee of the board of parole, health care provider, employee of the department of human services, employee of the department of revenue, national guard member engaged in national guard duty or state active duty, civilian employee of a law enforcement agency, civilian employee of a fire department, or fire fighter, whether paid or volunteer, is guilty of an offense with penalties ranging from an aggravated

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1 misdemeanor up to a class "D" felony. The bill adds "sports
2 officials" to the list of protected occupations.

The bill provides that a person who commits an assault 3 4 against a sports official, with the knowledge that the person 5 against whom the assault is committed is a sports official, 6 and with the intent to commit a serious injury, is quilty of a 7 class "D" felony. The bill provides that a person who commits 8 an assault against a sports official, who knows that the person 9 against whom the assault is committed is a sports official, and 10 who uses or displays a dangerous weapon in connection with the 11 assault, is guilty of a class "D" felony. The bill provides 12 that a person who commits an assault against a sports official, 13 who knows that the person against whom the assault is committed 14 is a sports official, and who causes bodily injury or mental 15 illness, is guilty of an aggravated misdemeanor. The bill 16 provides that any other assault committed against a sports 17 official by a person who knows that the person against whom 18 the assault is committed is a sports official is a serious 19 misdemeanor.

A class "D" felony is punishable by confinement for no nore than five years and a fine of at least \$1,025 but not more than \$10,245. An aggravated misdemeanor is punishable by confinement for no more than two years and a fine of at least \$855 but not more than \$8,540. A serious misdemeanor is punishable by confinement for no more than one year and a fine of at least \$430 but not more than \$2,560.

The bill defines "sports official" as an individual who serves as a referee, umpire, or linesman, or in a similar capacity, at any athletic contest, and who is a member of or registered with a local, state, regional, or national corganization that is engaged, in part, in providing education and training to sports officials.

33 The bill takes effect upon enactment.

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
