A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to the authority of a peace officer to make an 2 arrest anywhere within the state.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 804.7, Code 2023, is amended to read as
2 follows:

3 804.7 Arrests by peace officers.

A peace officer may make an arrest in obedience to a
warrant delivered to the peace officer; and without a warrant
under any of the following circumstances:

7 1. <u>a.</u> For a public offense committed or attempted in the 8 peace officer's presence.

9 2. <u>b.</u> Where a public offense has in fact been committed, 10 and the peace officer has reasonable <u>ground grounds</u> for 11 believing that the person to be arrested has committed it. 12 3. <u>c.</u> Where the peace officer has reasonable <u>ground grounds</u> 13 for believing that an indictable public offense has been 14 committed and has reasonable ground <u>grounds</u> for believing that 15 the person to be arrested has committed it.

16 4. <u>d.</u> Where the peace officer has received from the 17 department of public safety, or from any other peace officer of 18 this state or any other state or the United States an official 19 communication by bulletin, radio, telegraph, telephone, or 20 otherwise, informing the peace officer that a warrant has been 21 issued and is being held for the arrest of the person to be 22 arrested on a designated charge.

5. <u>e.</u> If the peace officer has reasonable grounds for
believing that domestic abuse, as defined in section 236.2,
has occurred and has reasonable grounds for believing that the
person to be arrested has committed it.

6. f. As required by section 236.12, subsection 2.
2. A peace officer, as defined in section 801.4, shall
29 have the authority to make an arrest, pursuant to subsection
30 1 anywhere within the state. However, a peace officer shall
31 not establish routine patrol outside of the jurisdiction of the
32 peace officer's employing agency.

1 This bill relates to the authority of a peace officer to make 2 an arrest anywhere within the state.

The bill provides that the authority of a peace officer 3 4 to make an arrest under the following conditions extends to 5 anywhere within the state: a public offense committed or 6 attempted in the peace officer's presence; where a public 7 offense has in fact been committed, and the peace officer has 8 reasonable grounds for believing that the person to be arrested 9 has committed it; where the peace officer has reasonable 10 grounds for believing that an indictable public offense 11 has been committed and that the person to be arrested has 12 committed it; where the peace officer has received an official 13 communication by bulletin, radio, telegraph, telephone, or 14 otherwise, informing the peace officer that a warrant has 15 been issued and is being held for the arrest of the person 16 to be arrested on a designated charge; the peace officer has 17 reasonable grounds for believing that domestic abuse has 18 occurred and has reasonable grounds for believing that the 19 person to be arrested has committed it; or as required by Code 20 section 236.12(2) (domestic abuse).

The bill provides that a peace officer shall not establish routine patrol outside of the jurisdiction of the peace officer's employing agency.

²⁴ "Peace officer", as defined in Code section 801.4, ²⁵ includes sheriffs and their regular deputies who are subject ²⁶ to mandated law enforcement training, marshals and police ²⁷ officers of cities, peace officer members of the department of ²⁸ public safety, parole officers, probation officers, special ²⁹ security officers employed by board of regents institutions, ³⁰ conservation officers, employees of the department of ³¹ transportation designated as peace officers by resolution of ³² the department, employees of an aviation authority designated ³³ as peace officers by the authority, and such persons as may be ³⁴ otherwise so designated by law.
