- 1 An Act relating to certain education programs and tax credits
- 2 and including effective date, applicability, and retroactive
- 3 applicability provisions.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 DIVISION I TUITION AND TEXTBOOK TAX CREDIT 2 3 Section 1. Section 422.12, subsection 2, paragraph b, Code 4 2023, is amended to read as follows: 5 b. A tuition credit equal to twenty-five percent of the 6 first two thousand dollars which the taxpayer has paid to 7 others for each dependent in grades kindergarten through 8 twelve, for tuition and textbooks of each dependent who 9 is receiving private instruction or who is attending an 10 elementary or secondary school situated in Iowa, which school 11 is accredited or approved under section 256.11, which is not 12 operated for profit, and which adheres to the provisions of 13 the federal Civil Rights Act of 1964 and chapter 216. Amounts 14 paid from an account in the education savings account fund 15 under section 257.11B, as enacted by 2023 Iowa Acts, House File 16 68, section 7, shall not be eligible for the credit under this 17 paragraph. Notwithstanding any other provision, all other 18 credits allowed under this subsection shall be deducted before 19 the tuition credit under this paragraph. The department, when 20 conducting an audit of a taxpayer's return, shall also audit 21 the tuition tax credit portion of the tax return. Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This division of this Act, being 22 23 deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment. 24 Sec. 3. RETROACTIVE APPLICABILITY. This division of this 25 Act applies retroactively to tax years beginning on or after 26 January 1, 2023. 27 DIVISION II 28 SCHOOL TUITION ORGANIZATION GRANTS 29 Sec. 4. Section 422.11S, subsection 6, paragraph c, Code 30 2023, is amended by adding the following new subparagraph: NEW SUBPARAGRAPH. (05) For eligible students participating 31 32 in the education savings account program under section 257.11B, 33 as enacted by 2023 Iowa Acts, House File 68, section 7, only 34 provides tuition grants in amounts not to exceed the tuition

35 amount for which the parent or guardian is responsible for

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1 payment following application of amounts paid using moneys from 2 the student's account in the education savings account fund. Sec. 5. Section 422.11S, subsection 8, paragraph a, 3 4 subparagraph (2), Code 2023, is amended to read as follows: "Total approved tax credits" means for the 2006 calendar 5 (2) 6 year, two million five hundred thousand dollars, for the 7 2007 calendar year, five million dollars, for calendar years 8 beginning on or after January 1, 2008, but before January 1, 9 2012, seven million five hundred thousand dollars, for calendar 10 years beginning on or after January 1, 2012, but before January 11 1, 2014, eight million seven hundred fifty thousand dollars, 12 for calendar years beginning on or after January 1, 2014, but 13 before January 1, 2019, twelve million dollars, for calendar 14 years beginning on or after January 1, 2019, but before 15 January 1, 2020, thirteen million dollars, for calendar years 16 beginning on or after January 1, 2020, but before January 17 1, 2022, fifteen million dollars, and for calendar years 18 beginning on or after January 1, 2022, but before January 1, 19 2024, twenty million dollars, for the calendar year beginning 20 January 1, 2024, seventeen million dollars, and for calendar 21 years beginning on or after January 1, 2025, fourteen million 22 dollars. 23 Sec. 6. APPLICABILITY. The section of this division of 24 this Act amending section 422.11S, subsection 6, paragraph "c", 25 applies to tuition grants made for school years beginning on 26 or after July 1, 2023. 27 DIVISION III EDUCATION SAVINGS ACCOUNTS - ADMINISTRATION OF FUNDS 28 29 Sec. 7. Section 257.11B, subsection 6, paragraph c, as 30 enacted by 2023 Iowa Acts, House File 68, section 7, is amended 31 to read as follows: c. Moneys remaining in a pupil's individual account upon 32 33 conclusion of the fiscal year shall remain in the pupil's 34 individual account for the payment of qualified educational 35 expenses in future consecutive fiscal years during which the

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1 pupil participates in the program until the pupil becomes 2 ineligible under the program or until the remaining amounts are 3 transferred to the state general fund under subsection 8. If 4 moneys remain in a pupil's individual account upon conclusion 5 of the fiscal year and the pupil does not participate in the 6 program during the immediately succeeding fiscal year, the 7 department of education or third-party entity shall close the 8 pupil's account in the fund, and transfer any remaining moneys 9 in the account for deposit in the general fund of the state. 10 Sec. 8. Section 257.11B, subsection 7, as enacted by 2023 11 Iowa Acts, House File 68, section 7, is amended to read as

12 follows:

13 7. a. A person who makes a false claim for the purpose of 14 obtaining an education savings account payment or who knowingly 15 receives the payment or makes a payment from an individual 16 account within the fund without being legally entitled to do 17 so is guilty of a fraudulent practice under chapter 714. The 18 false claim for an education savings account or a payment from 19 an individual account shall be disallowed. The department of 20 education or third-party entity shall also close the pupil's 21 individual account in the fund and transfer any remaining 22 moneys in the account for deposit in the general fund of the 23 state. If the improperly obtained amounts have been disbursed 24 from the applicable individual account, the department of 25 education or third-party entity shall recover such amounts 26 from the parent or guardian, including by initiating legal 27 proceedings to recover such amounts, if necessary. A parent or 28 guardian who commits a fraudulent practice under this section 29 is prohibited from participating in the education savings 30 account program in the future.

31 <u>b.</u> (1) If, prior to the end of the required attendance 32 period of the school year, a pupil who receives an education 33 savings account payment withdraws from enrollment in the 34 nonpublic school or is expelled, the nonpublic school shall 35 notify the department of education or third-party entity in

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1 writing of the pupil's withdrawal or expulsion. 2 (2) Upon receipt of a notice of expulsion, the department 3 of education or third-party entity shall cease disbursements 4 of remaining moneys in the pupil's account, close the pupil's 5 account in the fund, and transfer any remaining moneys in the 6 account for deposit in the general fund of the state. (3) Upon receipt of a notice of withdrawal and a 7 8 determination that the pupil did not enroll in a different 9 nonpublic school in this state for the remainder of the school 10 year, the department of education or third-party entity shall 11 cease disbursements of remaining moneys in the pupil's account 12 in the fund, close the pupil's account, and transfer any moneys 13 remaining in the pupil's account for deposit in the general 14 fund of the state. EFFECTIVE DATE. This division of this Act, being 15 Sec. 9. 16 deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment. Sec. 10. RETROACTIVE APPLICABILITY. This division of this 17 18 Act applies retroactively to January 24, 2023. 19 DIVISION IV 20 NONPUBLIC SCHOOL PUPIL TEXTBOOK SERVICES 21 Sec. 11. Section 301.1, subsections 2 and 3, Code 2023, are 22 amended by striking the subsections. 23 Sec. 12. EFFECTIVE DATE. This division of this Act takes 24 effect July 1, 2025. 25 DIVISION V 26 EDUCATION SAVINGS ACCOUNTS - CORRECTIONS 27 Sec. 13. Section 257.11B, subsection 2, paragraph a, 28 subparagraph (1), subparagraph division (c), as enacted by 2023 29 Iowa Acts, House File 68, section 7, is amended to read as 30 follows: (c) A resident pupil who is eligible to enroll in grades one 31 32 through twelve and was enrolled in a nonpublic school for the 33 school year immediately preceding the school year for which the 34 education savings account payment is requested if the pupil's 35 household has an annual income less than or equal to three

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1 hundred percent of the most recently revised poverty income 2 guidelines published by the United States department of health 3 and human services.

Sec. 14. Section 257.46, subsection 3, Code 2023, as amended 4 5 by 2023 Iowa Acts, House File 68, section 16, is amended to 6 read as follows:

If any portion of the gifted and talented program budget 7 3. 8 remains unexpended at the end of the budget year, the remainder 9 shall be carried over to the subsequent budget year and added 10 to the gifted and talented program budget for that year. At 11 the end of a fiscal year beginning on or after July 1, 2022, 12 the school district may use all or a portion of funds for 13 the purposes authorized under section 257.10, subsection 9, 14 paragraph d''.

15 Sec. 15. EFFECTIVE DATE. This division of this Act, being 16 deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment. Sec. 16. RETROACTIVE APPLICABILITY. This division of this 17 18 Act applies retroactively to January 24, 2023. 19

EXPLANATION

20 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly. 21

22 This bill relates to certain education programs and tax 23 credits.

24 DIVISION I - TUITION AND TEXTBOOK TAX CREDIT. Code section 25 422.12(2)(b) provides an income tax tuition credit equal to 26 25 percent of the first \$2,000 which the taxpayer has paid to 27 others for each dependent in grades kindergarten through 12, 28 for tuition and textbooks of each dependent who is receiving 29 private instruction or who is attending an elementary or 30 secondary school situated in Iowa meeting certain criteria. 31 The bill specifies that amounts paid from an account in the 32 education savings account fund under Code section 257.11B, as 33 enacted by 2023 Iowa Acts, House File 68, shall not be eligible 34 for the credit.

35 Division I takes effect upon enactment and applies

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1 retroactively to tax years beginning on or after January 1,
2 2023.

DIVISION II - SCHOOL TUITION ORGANIZATION GRANTS. 3 4 Code sections 422.11S and 422.33 provide a school tuition 5 organization tax credit against the individual income tax 6 and corporate income tax, respectively, for contributions 7 made by the taxpayer during the tax year to a school tuition 8 organization. The bill adds a requirement to the criteria for 9 a school tuition organization by specifying that for eligible 10 students participating in the education savings account program 11 under Code section 257.11B, the organization only provides 12 tuition grants in amounts not to exceed the tuition amount 13 for which the parent or guardian is responsible for payment 14 following application of amounts paid using moneys from the 15 student's account in the education savings account fund. This 16 provision applies to tuition grants made for school years 17 beginning on or after July 1, 2023.

18 The bill also reduces the total annual amount of available 19 school tuition organization tax credits for the calendar year 20 beginning January 1, 2024, from \$20 million to \$17 million, and 21 to \$14 million for calendar years beginning on or after January 22 1, 2025.

DIVISION III — EDUCATION SAVINGS ACCOUNTS — ADMINISTRATION OF FUNDS. Code section 257.11B, as enacted by 2023 Iowa Acts, House File 68, section 7, specifies that moneys remaining in a pupil's individual account upon conclusion of the fiscal year random for the payment of qualified educational expenses in future fiscal years during which the pupil participates in the program until the pupil becomes ineligible under the program or until the remaining amounts are transferred to the state general fund as required in that Code section. The bill provides that such remaining moneys are available for future consecutive fiscal years during which the pupil participates in the program. The bill further provides that if moneys remain in a pupil's individual account

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1 upon conclusion of the fiscal year and the pupil does not 2 participate in the program during the immediately succeeding 3 fiscal year, the department of education or third-party entity 4 shall close the pupil's account in the fund, and transfer any 5 remaining moneys in the account for deposit in the general fund 6 of the state.

The bill also amends the education savings account program 7 8 under Code section 257.11B by providing that if, prior to the 9 end of the required attendance period of the school year, 10 a pupil who receives an education savings account payment ll withdraws from enrollment in the nonpublic school or is 12 expelled, the nonpublic school shall notify the department 13 of education or third-party entity in writing of the pupil's 14 withdrawal or expulsion. Under the bill, upon receipt of a 15 notice of expulsion, the department of education or third-party 16 entity shall cease disbursements of remaining moneys in the 17 pupil's account, close the pupil's account in the fund, and 18 transfer any remaining moneys in the account for deposit in 19 the general fund of the state. Additionally, upon receipt of 20 a notice of withdrawal and a determination that the pupil did 21 not enroll in a different nonpublic school in this state for 22 the remainder of the school year, the department of education 23 or third-party entity shall cease disbursements of remaining 24 moneys in the pupil's account in the fund, close the pupil's 25 account, and transfer any moneys remaining in the pupil's 26 account for deposit in the general fund of the state. 27 Division III takes effect upon enactment and applies

28 retroactively to January 24, 2023.

DIVISION IV — NONPUBLIC SCHOOL PUPIL TEXTBOOK SERVICES. Code section 301.1 authorizes each school board to adopt textbooks for the district, and to contract for and buy such books and any and all other necessary school supplies at contract prices, and to sell them to the pupils of their respective districts at cost, loan such textbooks to such pupils free, or rent them to pupils. In addition, Code section

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1 301.1, subsections 2 and 3, provides that textbooks adopted 2 and purchased by a school district shall, to the extent funds 3 are appropriated by the general assembly, be made available to 4 pupils attending accredited nonpublic schools upon request of 5 the pupil or the pupil's parent under comparable terms as made 6 available to pupils attending public schools. The bill strikes 7 those subsections of Code section 301.1 relating to a school 8 district making such textbooks available to pupils attending 9 nonpublic schools.

10 Division IV takes effect July 1, 2025.

11 DIVISION V — EDUCATION SAVINGS ACCOUNTS — CORRECTIONS. 12 Division V corrects errors and omissions in Code section 13 257.11B, as enacted by 2023 Iowa Acts, House File 68, section 14 7.

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15 Division V takes effect upon enactment and applies 16 retroactively to January 24, 2023.
