## A BILL FOR

An Act relating to appropriations to the justice system.
 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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1 Section 1. DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE.

2 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state 3 to the department of justice for the fiscal year beginning July 4 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024, the following amounts, or 5 so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes 6 designated:

7 a. For the general office of attorney general for
8 salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes,
9 including the prosecuting attorneys training program, matching
10 funds for federal violence against women grant programs,
11 victim assistance grants, the office of drug control policy
12 prosecuting attorney program, and odometer fraud enforcement,
13 and for not more than the following full-time equivalent
14 positions:

17 As a condition of receiving the appropriation provided 18 in this lettered paragraph, the department of justice shall 19 maintain a record of the estimated time incurred representing 20 each agency or department.

The general office of attorney general may temporarily exceed and draw more than the amount appropriated in this lettered paragraph and incur a negative cash balance as long as there are receivables equal to or greater than the negative balances and the amount appropriated in this lettered paragraph is not exceeded at the close of the fiscal year.

27 b. For victim assistance grants:

The moneys appropriated in this lettered paragraph shall be 30 used to provide grants to care providers providing services to 31 crime victims of domestic abuse or to crime victims of rape and 32 sexual assault.

33 The balance of the victim compensation fund established 34 in section 915.94 may be used to provide salary and support 35 of not more than \_\_\_\_\_ full-time equivalent positions and to

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1 provide maintenance for the victim compensation functions 2 of the department of justice. In addition to the full-time 3 equivalent positions authorized pursuant to this paragraph, 4 full-time equivalent positions are authorized and shall 5 be used by the department of justice to employ one accountant 6 and four program planners. The department of justice may 7 employ the additional full-time equivalent positions 8 authorized pursuant to this paragraph that are in excess of the 9 number of full-time equivalent positions authorized only if 10 the department of justice receives sufficient federal moneys 11 to maintain employment for the additional full-time equivalent 12 positions during the current fiscal year. The department 13 of justice shall only employ the additional full-time 14 equivalent positions in succeeding fiscal years if sufficient 15 federal moneys are received during each of those succeeding 16 fiscal years.

Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in this lettered paragraph that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the close of the succeeding fiscal year.

The department of justice shall obtain the moneys 22 necessary to reimburse the Iowa law enforcement academy to 23 employ such an instructor from unrestricted moneys from either 24 the victim compensation fund established in section 915.94 or 25 the human trafficking victim fund established in section 915.95 26 or the human trafficking enforcement fund established in 2015 27 Iowa Acts, chapter 138, section 141.

Sec. 2. OFFICE OF CONSUMER ADVOCATE. It is the intent of the general assembly that each 10 lease negotiated by the department of corrections with a 11 private corporation for the purpose of providing private 12 industry employment of inmates in a correctional institution 13 shall prohibit the private corporation from utilizing inmate 14 labor for partisan political purposes for any person seeking 15 election to public office in this state and that a violation 16 of this requirement shall result in a termination of the lease 17 agreement.

b. It is the intent of the general assembly that as a condition of receiving the appropriation provided in this subsection the department of corrections shall not enter into a lease or contractual agreement pursuant to section 904.809 with a private corporation for the use of building space for the purpose of providing inmate employment without providing that the terms of the lease or contract establish safeguards to restrict, to the greatest extent feasible, access by inmates working for the private corporation to personal identifying information of citizens.

 safety while providing maximum rehabilitation to the offender.
 A judicial district department of correctional services may
 also establish a day program.

10 4. The office of drug control policy of the department 11 of public safety shall consider federal grants made to the 12 department of corrections for the benefit of each of the eight 13 judicial district departments of correctional services as local 14 government grants, as defined pursuant to federal regulations. 15 5. The department of corrections shall continue to contract 16 with a judicial district department of correctional services to 17 provide for the rental of electronic monitoring equipment which 18 shall be available statewide.

19 6. The public safety assessment shall not be utilized 20 in pretrial hearings when determining whether to detain or 21 release a defendant before trial, and the use of the public 22 safety assessment pilot program shall be terminated as of the 23 effective date of this subsection, until such time the use of 24 the public safety assessment has been specifically authorized 25 by the general assembly.

Sec. 6. DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS — REALLOCATION OF APPROPRIATIONS. Notwithstanding section 8.39, within the moneys appropriated in this Act to the department of corrections, the department may reallocate the moneys appropriated and allocated as necessary to best fulfill the needs of the correctional institutions, administration of the department, and the judicial district departments of correctional services. However, in addition to complying with the requirements of sections 904.116 and 905.8 and providing notice to the legislative services agency, the department

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1 of corrections shall also provide notice to the department 2 of management, prior to the effective date of the revision 3 or reallocation of an appropriation made pursuant to this 4 section. The department of corrections shall not reallocate an 5 appropriation or allocation for the purpose of eliminating any 6 program.

7 Sec. 7. INTENT — REPORTS.

8 1. The department of corrections, in cooperation with 9 townships, the Iowa cemetery associations, and other nonprofit 10 or governmental entities, may use inmate labor during the 11 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, to restore or preserve 12 rural cemeteries and historical landmarks. The department, in 13 cooperation with the counties, may also use inmate labor to 14 clean up roads, major water sources, and other water sources 15 around the state.

16 2. On a quarterly basis, the department shall provide 17 a status report regarding private-sector employment to the 18 general assembly beginning on July 1, 2023. The report shall 19 include the number of offenders employed in the private sector, 20 the combined number of hours worked by the offenders, the 21 total amount of allowances, and the distribution of allowances 22 pursuant to section 904.702, including any moneys deposited in 23 the general fund of the state.

Sec. 8. ELECTRONIC MONITORING REPORT. The department of corrections shall submit a report on electronic monitoring to the general assembly by January 15, 2024. The report shall specifically address the number of persons being electronically monitored and break down the number of persons being electronically monitored by offense committed. The report shall also include a comparison of any data from the prior fiscal year with the current fiscal year.

32 Sec. 9. STATE AGENCY PURCHASES FROM PRISON INDUSTRIES.
33 1. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise
34 requires, "state agency" means the government of the state
35 of Iowa, including but not limited to all executive branch

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1 departments, agencies, boards, bureaus, and commissions, the 2 judicial branch, the general assembly and all legislative 3 agencies, institutions within the purview of the state board of 4 regents, and any corporation whose primary function is to act 5 as an instrumentality of the state.

6 2. State agencies are encouraged to purchase products from 7 Iowa state industries, as defined in section 904.802, when 8 purchases are required and the products are available from 9 Iowa state industries. State agencies shall obtain bids from 10 Iowa state industries for purchases of office furniture during 11 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, exceeding \$5,000 or 12 in accordance with applicable administrative rules related to 13 purchases for the agency.

14 Sec. 10. IOWA LAW ENFORCEMENT ACADEMY.

15 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the 16 state to the Iowa law enforcement academy for the fiscal year 17 beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024, the following 18 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the 19 purposes designated:

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1 of by public auction, and the Iowa law enforcement academy 2 may exchange any automobile owned by the academy for each 3 automobile selected if the selected automobile is used in 4 training law enforcement officers at the academy. However, any 5 automobile exchanged by the academy shall be substituted for 6 the selected vehicle of the department of public safety and 7 sold by public auction with the receipts being deposited in the 8 depreciation fund maintained pursuant to section 8A.365 to the 9 credit of the department of public safety, division of state 10 patrol.

11 3. The Iowa law enforcement academy shall provide training 12 for domestic abuse and human trafficking-related issues 13 throughout the state. The training shall be offered at no 14 cost to the attendees and the training shall not replace any 15 existing domestic abuse or human trafficking training offered 16 by the academy.
