1 AUTHORITY. This bill reduces the standing appropriations for 2 FY 2023-2024 for instructional support state aid, state aid for 3 area education agencies, and payments under Code section 441.21 4 relating to certain property assessment limitations. The bill 5 authorizes salary adjustments to be funded as determined by the 6 department of management (DOM) from unappropriated moneys in 7 certain special funds.

8 The bill provides that for FY 2022-2023, moneys in excess 9 of the maximum balance of the Iowa economic emergency fund 10 shall not be distributed as provided in Code section 8.55(2), 11 but shall instead be distributed as provided in the bill. 12 Under the bill, moneys are first transferred to the general 13 fund of the state in an amount equal to the difference in 14 foundation property tax statewide based on 2023 Iowa Acts, 15 Senate File 181, to pay foundation aid under Code chapter 257 16 for FY 2023-2024. The amount that would be distributed to 17 the taxpayer relief fund under current law is reduced by the 18 transferred amount. The transferred amount is to be determined These provisions take effect upon enactment. 19 by DOM. 20 CORRECTIVE PROVISIONS. The bill makes technical corrections 21 to, or as the result of, legislation enacted or considered 22 during the 2023 legislative session. Certain provisions take 23 effect upon enactment and apply retroactively to the effective 24 date of the amended legislation.
