A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to participation in school activities by
- 2 students enrolled in charter schools.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 256E.13 Students receiving
- 2 instruction over the internet participation in activities in
- 3 district of residence.
- 4 A student enrolled in a charter school who receives
- 5 educational instruction and course content primarily over the
- 6 internet may participate in any cocurricular or extracurricular
- 7 activities offered to children in the student's grade or group
- 8 and sponsored by the district of residence under the same
- 9 conditions and requirements as the students enrolled in the
- 10 district of residence. The student may participate in not more
- 11 than two cocurricular or extracurricular activities during a
- 12 school year unless the resident district approves the student's
- 13 participation in additional activities. The student shall
- 14 comply with the eligibility, conduct, and other requirements
- 15 relating to the activity that are established by the district
- 16 of residence for any student who applies to participate or who
- 17 is participating in the activity.
- 18 Sec. 2. Section 280.13A, subsection 1, Code 2024, is amended
- 19 to read as follows:
- 20 l. If a school district, or nonpublic school, or charter
- 21 school operating under section 256E.5 does not provide an
- 22 interscholastic activity for its students, the board of
- 23 directors of that school district, or the authorities in
- 24 charge of the nonpublic school, or governing board of the
- 25 charter school may complete an agreement with another school
- 26 district, or nonpublic school, or charter school operating
- 27 under section 256E.5 to provide for the eligibility of its
- 28 students in interscholastic activities provided by that other
- 29 school district, or nonpublic school, or charter school. A
- 30 copy of each agreement completed under this section shall be
- 31 filed with the appropriate organization as organization is
- 32 defined in section 280.13 not later than April 30 of the school
- 33 year preceding the school year in which the agreement takes
- 34 effect, unless an exception is granted by the organization
- 35 for good cause. An agreement completed under this section

- 1 shall be deemed approved unless denied by the organization
- 2 within ten days after its receipt. The organization shall
- 3 determine whether an agreement would substantially prejudice
- 4 the interscholastic activities of other schools. An agreement
- 5 denied by the organization under this section may be appealed
- 6 to the state board of education under chapter 290.
- 7 EXPLANATION
- 8 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with 9 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 10 This bill authorizes a student enrolled in a charter school
- 11 under Code chapter 256E who receives educational instruction
- 12 and course content primarily over the internet to participate
- 13 in any cocurricular or extracurricular activities offered
- 14 to children in the student's grade or group and sponsored
- 15 by the district of residence under the same conditions and
- 16 requirements as students enrolled in the district of residence.
- 17 The student shall comply with applicable eligibility,
- 18 conduct, and other requirements established by the district of
- 19 residence.
- 20 The bill authorizes a charter school operating under the
- 21 founding group-state board model to complete an agreement with
- 22 a school district, public school, or other charter school
- 23 operating under the founding-group-state board model providing
- 24 for student eligibility for interscholastic activities not
- 25 provided by the charter school but provided by the other
- 26 school. Existing procedures applicable to such agreements are
- 27 applicable to agreements authorized by the bill.
