- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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1 DIVISION I REBUILD IOWA INFRASTRUCTURE FUND 2 3 Section 1. REBUILD IOWA INFRASTRUCTURE FUND -4 APPROPRIATIONS. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa 5 infrastructure fund created in section 8.57 to the following 6 departments and agencies for the following fiscal years, the 7 following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be 8 used for the purposes designated: 9 1. For the demolition of the fleet building located at 307 10 11 East Seventh Street, Des Moines, Iowa, notwithstanding section 12 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph "c": 13 FY 2024-2025: 14 \$ 1,997,500 15 b. For major maintenance projects: 16 FY 2024-2025: 17 \$ 20,000,000 18 c. For elevator upgrades and replacement on the capitol 19 complex and Terrace Hill: 20 FY 2024-2025: 21 \$ 5,364,500 2. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND LAND STEWARDSHIP 22 23 a. (1) For deposit in the water quality initiative fund 24 created in section 466B.45 for purposes of supporting the 25 water quality initiative administered by the division of soil 26 conservation and water quality as provided in section 466B.42, 27 including salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous 28 purposes, notwithstanding section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph 29 °c": 30 FY 2024-2025: 31 \$ 8,200,000 (2) (a) The moneys appropriated in this lettered 32 33 paragraph shall be used to support demonstration projects in 34 subwatersheds as designated by the department that are part 35 of high-priority watersheds identified by the water resources

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1 coordinating council.

2 (b) The moneys appropriated in this lettered paragraph 3 shall be used to support demonstration projects in watersheds 4 generally, including regional watersheds, as designated by the 5 division and high-priority watersheds identified by the water 6 resources coordinating council.

7 (3) In supporting projects in watersheds and subwatersheds 8 as provided in subparagraph (2), all of the following apply:

9 (a) The demonstration projects must utilize water quality 10 practices as described in the latest revision of the document 11 entitled "Iowa Nutrient Reduction Strategy" initially presented 12 in November 2012 by the department of agriculture and land 13 stewardship, the department of natural resources, and Iowa 14 state university of science and technology.

(b) The division shall implement demonstration projects as provided in subparagraph division (a) by providing for participation by persons who hold a legal interest in agricultural land used in farming. To every extent practical, the division shall provide for collaborative participation by such persons who hold a legal interest in agricultural land located within the same subwatershed.

(c) The division shall implement demonstration projects on a cost-share basis as determined by the division. Except for edge-of-field practices, the state's share of the amount shall not exceed 50 percent of the estimated cost of establishing the practice as determined by the division or 50 percent of the ractual cost of establishing the practice, whichever is less. (d) The demonstration projects shall be used to educate other persons about the feasibility and value of establishing similar water quality practices. The division shall promote field day events for purposes of allowing interested persons to establish water quality practices on such persons' agricultural and.

34 (e) The division shall conduct water quality evaluations35 within supported subwatersheds. Within a reasonable period

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1 after accumulating information from such evaluations, the 2 division shall create an aggregated database of water quality 3 practices. Any information identifying a person holding a 4 legal interest in agricultural land or specific agricultural 5 land shall be a confidential record.

6 (4) The moneys appropriated in this lettered paragraph 7 shall be used to support education and outreach in a manner 8 that encourages persons who hold a legal interest in 9 agricultural land used for farming to implement water quality 10 practices, including the establishment of such practices in 11 watersheds generally, and not limited to subwatersheds or 12 high-priority watersheds.

13 (5) The moneys appropriated in this lettered paragraph 14 may be used to contract with persons to coordinate the 15 implementation of efforts provided in this paragraph.

16 (6) The moneys appropriated in this lettered paragraph 17 may be used by the department to support urban soil and water 18 conservation efforts, which may include but are not limited 19 to management practices related to bioretention, landscaping, 20 the use of permeable or pervious pavement, and soil quality 21 restoration. The moneys shall be allocated on a cost-share 22 basis as provided in chapter 161A.

(7) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the department may use moneys appropriated in this lettered paragraph to carry out the provisions of this paragraph on a cost-share basis in combination with other moneys available to the department from a state or federal source.

(8) Not more than 10 percent of the moneys appropriated in 30 this lettered paragraph may be used for costs of administration 31 and implementation of the water quality initiative administered 32 by the soil conservation division.

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1 This bill relates to and makes appropriations from the 2 rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund (RIIF) and the technology 3 reinvestment fund (TRF) and provides for related matters. The 4 bill is organized by divisions.

5 REBUILD IOWA INFRASTRUCTURE FUND. This division 6 appropriates project funding from RIIF for multiple fiscal 7 years for projects for the departments of administrative 8 services, agriculture and land stewardship, the blind, health 9 and human services, natural resources, public defense, public 10 safety, transportation, and veterans affairs, and for the 11 economic development authority, treasurer of state, board of 12 regents, and judicial branch. As part of an appropriation 13 from RIIF, the bill reduces a standing appropriation from the 14 general fund to the renewable fuel infrastructure fund to zero 15 for FY 2024-2025. The bill transfers moneys from RIIF to the 16 Iowa major events and tourism fund, if enacted by 2024 Iowa 17 Acts, Senate File 2419, or successor legislation.

18 TECHNOLOGY REINVESTMENT FUND. This division appropriates 19 project funding for FY 2024-2025 from TRF for projects for the 20 departments of justice, corrections, education, health and 21 human services, homeland security and emergency management, 22 management, revenue, and natural resources, and for the 23 secretary of state and treasurer of state.

CHANGES TO PRIOR APPROPRIATIONS. This division delays the reversion of all of the following: an FY 2019-2020 appropriation from TRF to the department of health and human services for the upgrade of the Medicaid management information system, an FY 2021-2022 appropriation from RIIF to the department of corrections for the remodel and expansion of the kitchen and visitation areas at the Clarinda treatment complex, an FY 2021-2022 appropriation from TRF to the department of inspections and appeals (currently the department of inspections, appeals, and licensing) for a registry of children receiving foster care, and an FY 2022-2023 appropriation from SRIIF to the department of corrections for kitchen equipment

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1 at the Clarinda treatment complex and various infrastructure 2 projects at correctional facilities. These provisions take 3 effect upon enactment.

4 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS. Code section 8.57C (TRF) is 5 amended to provide for an appropriation to TRF from RIIF for 6 FY 2024-2025.
