**A BILL FOR**

- 1 An Act relating to student access to broad-spectrum cannabidiol
- 2 products from school nurses during the school day.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. **280.16B Broad-spectrum cannabidiol**  
2 **products.**

3 1. For purposes of this section, unless the context otherwise  
4 requires:

5 a. "*Broad-spectrum cannabidiol*" means any pharmaceutical  
6 grade cannabinoid found in the plant *Cannabis sativa* L. or  
7 *Cannabis indica* or any other preparation thereof that contains  
8 no tetrahydrocannabinol. "*Broad-spectrum cannabidiol*" does not  
9 include "*medical cannabidiol*" as defined in section 124E.2.

10 b. "*Broad-spectrum cannabidiol product*" means a product  
11 that contains broad-spectrum cannabidiol and contains no  
12 tetrahydrocannabinol.

13 c. "*Licensed health care professional*" means the same as  
14 provided in section 280.16, subsection 1.

15 d. "*School nurse*" means the same as provided in section  
16 280.16A, subsection 1.

17 2. The board of directors of each school district and  
18 the authorities in charge of each accredited nonpublic school  
19 shall establish procedures for a school nurse to provide  
20 a broad-spectrum cannabidiol product to a student. The  
21 procedures must provide that a school nurse shall only provide  
22 a broad-spectrum cannabidiol product to a student if the product  
23 was provided to the school district or accredited nonpublic  
24 school by the parent or guardian of the student and if the  
25 product is provided in accordance with written instructions  
26 provided by the parent or guardian. The procedures shall provide  
27 for the broad-spectrum cannabidiol product to be stored in a  
28 secure location when not in use.

29 3. The procedures established pursuant to subsection 2 must  
30 provide for a form for a parent or guardian that shall be filled  
31 out to the satisfaction of the school district or accredited  
32 nonpublic school and signed before the broad-spectrum cannabidiol  
33 product is provided to the student. The form must include all of  
34 the following:

35 a. Instructions to the school district or accredited

1 nonpublic school on the use of the broad-spectrum cannabidiol  
2 product, including the specific circumstances under which the  
3 product is to be provided and, if applicable, the time and  
4 frequency for providing the product and the expiration date of  
5 the product.

6 b. Authorization for the school district or accredited  
7 nonpublic school to provide the broad-spectrum cannabidiol  
8 product to the student in accordance with the instructions.

9 c. Certification that the product provided by the parent or  
10 guardian is a broad-spectrum cannabidiol product.

11 d. Contact information for the parent or guardian and for a  
12 licensed health care professional who provides medical care for  
13 the student.

14 4. The parent or guardian shall include with the form written  
15 documentation that the product provided by the parent or guardian  
16 is a broad-spectrum cannabidiol product, which shall include  
17 documentation from the manufacturer of the product specifically  
18 indicating that the product contains no tetrahydrocannabinol.

19 EXPLANATION

20 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with  
21 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

22 This bill requires school boards and authorities in charge  
23 of accredited nonpublic schools to establish procedures for a  
24 school nurse to provide a broad-spectrum cannabidiol product to a  
25 student. The procedures shall provide that a school nurse shall  
26 only provide a broad-spectrum cannabidiol product to a student  
27 if the product was provided to the school district or accredited  
28 nonpublic school by the parent or guardian of the student and if  
29 the product is provided in accordance with written instructions  
30 provided by the parent or guardian.

31 The bill defines "broad-spectrum cannabidiol" as any  
32 pharmaceutical grade cannabinoid found in the plant Cannabis  
33 sativa L. or Cannabis indica or any other preparation thereof  
34 that contains no tetrahydrocannabinol (THC). The bill defines  
35 "broad-spectrum cannabidiol product" as a product that contains

1 broad-spectrum cannabidiol and contains no THC.

2 The bill requires that the procedures provide for a form  
3 for a parent or guardian that shall be filled out to the  
4 satisfaction of the school district or accredited nonpublic  
5 school and signed before the broad-spectrum cannabidiol product  
6 is provided to the student. The bill includes required content  
7 for the form, including instructions on use of the broad-spectrum  
8 cannabidiol product, authorization for such use, certification  
9 that the product provided by the parent or guardian is a  
10 broad-spectrum cannabidiol product as defined in the bill, and  
11 contact information for the parent or guardian and a licensed  
12 health care professional who provides medical care for the  
13 student.

14 The bill requires a parent or guardian to include with the  
15 form written documentation that the product provided by the  
16 parent or guardian is a broad-spectrum cannabidiol product, which  
17 shall include documentation from the manufacturer of the product  
18 specifically indicating that the product contains no THC.
