**A BILL FOR**

1 An Act relating to authorized uses of moneys in the victim  
2 compensation fund.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 915.41, subsection 1, Code 2025, is  
2 amended to read as follows:

3 1. The cost of a medical examination of a victim for the  
4 purpose of gathering evidence, the cost of the provision or  
5 reimbursement of a victim for emergency contraception or other  
6 health care treatment, including abortion, and the cost of  
7 treatment of a victim for the purpose of preventing venereal  
8 disease shall be paid from the fund established in section  
9 915.94.

10 Sec. 2. Section 915.94, subsection 1, unnumbered paragraph 1,  
11 Code 2025, is amended to read as follows:

12 A victim compensation fund is established as a separate fund  
13 in the state treasury. Moneys deposited in the fund shall be  
14 administered by the department and ~~dedicated to and used~~ are  
15 appropriated to the department for the purposes of section 915.41  
16 and this subchapter. In addition, ~~the department may use moneys~~  
17 from the fund are appropriated to the department for any of the  
18 following purposes:

19 Sec. 3. Section 915.94, subsection 1, Code 2025, is amended  
20 by adding the following new paragraph:

21 NEW PARAGRAPH. f. The provision or reimbursement of a victim  
22 of sexual assault for emergency contraception or other health  
23 care treatment, including abortion.

24 EXPLANATION

25 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with  
26 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

27 This bill provides that moneys in the victim compensation fund  
28 are appropriated to the department of justice for the provision  
29 or reimbursement of a victim of sexual assault for emergency  
30 contraception or other health care treatment, including abortion,  
31 among other purposes set forth under current law.
