(SUCCESSOR TO SSB 1088)

**A BILL FOR**

1 An Act relating to voter registration, including voter  
2 registration file maintenance, applications for voter  
3 registration, and verification of voter eligibility.  
4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 47.7, subsection 2, Code 2025, is amended  
2 to read as follows:

3 2. a. ~~On or before January 1, 2006, the~~ The state registrar  
4 of voters shall implement in a uniform and nondiscriminatory  
5 manner, a single, uniform, official, centralized, interactive  
6 computerized statewide voter registration file defined,  
7 maintained, and administered at the state level that contains  
8 the name and registration information of every legally registered  
9 voter in the state and assigns a unique identifier to each  
10 legally registered voter in the state. The state voter  
11 registration system shall be coordinated with other agency  
12 databases within the state, including, but not limited to, state  
13 department of transportation driver's license records, judicial  
14 records of convicted felons and persons declared incompetent to  
15 vote, and department of health and human services records of  
16 deceased persons.

17 b. ~~On or after January 1, 2007, a~~ A county shall not  
18 establish or maintain a voter registration system separate from  
19 the state voter registration system. Each county shall provide  
20 to the state registrar the names, voter registration information,  
21 and voting history of each registered voter in the county in the  
22 form required by the state registrar.

23 c. A state or local election official may obtain immediate  
24 electronic access to the information contained in the  
25 computerized voter registration file. All voter registration  
26 information obtained by a local election official shall be  
27 electronically entered into the computerized voter registration  
28 file on an expedited basis at the time the information is  
29 provided to the local election official. The state registrar  
30 shall provide such support as may be required to enable local  
31 election officials to electronically enter the information into  
32 the computerized voter registration file on an expedited basis.  
33 The list generated from the computerized file shall serve as the  
34 official voter registration list for the conduct of all elections  
35 for federal office in the state.

1 d. The state registrar shall prescribe by rule the procedures  
2 for access to the state voter registration file, including all of  
3 the following:

4 (1) Access protocols for adding, changing, or deleting  
5 information from the state voter registration file.

6 (2) Training requirements for all state voter registration  
7 file users.

8 (3) Technology safeguards, including county information  
9 technology network requirements, necessary to access the state  
10 voter registration file.

11 (4) Breach incident response requirements and protocols on  
12 all matters related to elections.

13 e. The state registrar may rescind access to the statewide  
14 voter registration file from a user who is not in compliance with  
15 the prescribed rules.

16 f. ~~(1)~~ The state registrar shall, in the first quarter  
17 of each calendar year, conduct a verification of all voters  
18 in the statewide voter registration file, which shall include  
19 cross-referencing the records in the statewide voter registration  
20 file with similar records maintained by other states. The state  
21 registrar of voters shall cancel the registration of a voter  
22 found to be ineligible pursuant to section 48A.30. The state  
23 registrar shall submit a report to the general assembly by April  
24 30 of each year regarding the number of voter registrations  
25 canceled pursuant to this paragraph. The state registrar shall  
26 also publish this report on the internet site of the state  
27 registrar.

28 ~~(2)~~ g. The state registrar may contract with a third-party  
29 vendor, including state and federal government agencies and  
30 private entities, to develop or provide a program to allow the  
31 state registrar to verify the status of records in the statewide  
32 voter registration file and identify ineligible voters on an  
33 ongoing basis.

34 h. The state registrar may adopt rules pursuant to chapter  
35 17A for the use of federal and other state agency sources

1 of information. The state registrar and county commissioners  
2 of elections may use those sources of information for voter  
3 registration file maintenance.

4 i. The department of transportation shall transmit to the  
5 state registrar a list of each person seventeen years of age  
6 or older in the state who has submitted documentation indicating  
7 that the person is not a citizen of the United States.

8 Sec. 2. Section 48A.10A, subsections 1 and 2, Code 2025, are  
9 amended to read as follows:

10 1. The state registrar shall compare lists of persons who  
11 are registered to vote with the department of transportation's  
12 driver's license and files, nonoperator's identification card  
13 files, and noncitizen identification files, and shall, on an  
14 initial basis, issue a voter identification card to each active,  
15 registered voter whose name does not appear in the department  
16 of transportation's files. The voter identification card shall  
17 include the name of the registered voter, a signature line above  
18 which the registered voter shall sign the voter identification  
19 card, the registered voter's identification number assigned to  
20 the voter pursuant to section 47.7, subsection 2, an additional  
21 four-digit personal identification number assigned by the state  
22 commissioner, and the times during which polling places will be  
23 open on election days.

24 2. The commissioner shall issue voter identification cards  
25 on an ongoing basis as prescribed by the state registrar.  
26 The commissioner shall, as a part of the voter acknowledgment  
27 process required under sections 48A.26 and 48A.26A, issue  
28 a voter identification card to a registered voter under  
29 this subsection at the time of registration or update to  
30 registration if the registered voter's name does not appear  
31 in the department of transportation's driver's license, or  
32 nonoperator's identification card, or noncitizen identification  
33 files. A registered voter whose name appears in the  
34 department of transportation's driver's license, or nonoperator's  
35 identification card, or noncitizen identification files shall not

1 be issued a voter identification card pursuant to this section.

2 Sec. 3. Section 48A.18, subsection 1, Code 2025, is amended  
3 to read as follows:

4 1. a. Each Except as provided in paragraph "b", each state  
5 motor vehicle driver's license application, including any renewal  
6 application or application for a nonoperator's identification  
7 card, submitted to the office of driver services of the state  
8 department of transportation shall serve as an application for  
9 voter registration unless the applicant declines to register  
10 to vote. A completed voter registration form submitted to  
11 the office of driver services of the state department of  
12 transportation shall be considered to update any previous voter  
13 registration by the registrant.

14 b. An application for a state motor vehicle driver's license  
15 or nonoperator's identification card shall not serve as an  
16 application for voter registration if the applicant submits  
17 documentation demonstrating that the applicant is not a citizen  
18 of the United States.

19 Sec. 4. Section 48A.19, subsection 3, Code 2025, is amended  
20 to read as follows:

21 3. The Except as provided in subsection 7, the voter  
22 registration agency shall provide voter registration services  
23 with each application for services or assistance and with each  
24 recertification, renewal, or change of address form completed  
25 relating to the agency's services. The secretary of state shall  
26 adopt administrative rules in cooperation with voter registration  
27 agencies to carry out the requirements of this section.

28 Sec. 5. Section 48A.19, Code 2025, is amended by adding the  
29 following new subsection:

30 NEW SUBSECTION. 7. The voter registration agency shall not  
31 provide voter registration services to a person submitting an  
32 application for services or assistance or a recertification,  
33 renewal, or change of address form completed relating to  
34 the agency's services if the person submits documentation  
35 demonstrating that the person is not a citizen of the United

1 States.

2 Sec. 6. Section 48A.25A, Code 2025, is amended by adding the  
3 following new subsection:

4 NEW SUBSECTION. 2A. A voter registration record shall be  
5 designated as unconfirmed status if the registrant self-reports  
6 to be a noncitizen on the voter registration form and signs  
7 the portion of the form affirming the person's United States  
8 citizenship.

9 Sec. 7. Section 48A.30, subsection 1, Code 2025, is amended  
10 by adding the following new paragraph:

11 NEW PARAGRAPH. h. The registered voter submits documentation  
12 that indicates that the registered voter is not a citizen of the  
13 United States or reports to a state or federal agency that the  
14 registered voter is not a citizen of the United States.

15 Sec. 8. Section 48A.30, subsection 2, Code 2025, is amended  
16 to read as follows:

17 2. When a registration is canceled pursuant to subsection 1,  
18 paragraph "d", "e", ~~or "g"~~, or "h", the commissioner shall send a  
19 notice of the cancellation to the registered voter.

20 Sec. 9. Section 48A.37, subsection 2, Code 2025, is amended  
21 to read as follows:

22 2. Electronic shall include a status code designating  
23 whether the records are active, inactive, incomplete, pending,  
24 unconfirmed, or canceled.

25 a. Inactive records are records of registered voters to whom  
26 notices have been sent pursuant to section 48A.28, and who have  
27 not returned the card or otherwise responded to the notice,  
28 and those records have been designated inactive pursuant to  
29 section 48A.29. Inactive records are also records of registered  
30 voters to whom notices have been sent pursuant to section  
31 48A.26A and who have not responded to the notice. Incomplete  
32 records are records missing required information pursuant to  
33 section 48A.11, subsection 8. Pending records are records of  
34 applicants whose applications have not been verified pursuant to  
35 section 48A.25A. Unconfirmed records are records of registered

1 voters about whom the state registrar or county commissioner has  
2 received information from a reliable source indicating that the  
3 registered voter is not qualified. Canceled records are records  
4 that have been canceled pursuant to section 48A.30. All other  
5 records are active records.

6 b. An inactive record shall be made active when the  
7 registered voter requests an absentee ballot, votes at an  
8 election, registers again, or reports a change of name, address,  
9 telephone number, or political party or organization affiliation.  
10 An incomplete record shall be made active when a completed  
11 application is received from the applicant and verified pursuant  
12 to section 48A.25A. A pending record shall be made active upon  
13 verification or upon the voter providing identification pursuant  
14 to section 48A.8. An unconfirmed record shall be made active  
15 upon the registered voter providing evidence that the registered  
16 voter is qualified.

17 Sec. 10. Section 49.77, subsection 1, paragraph a, Code 2025,  
18 is amended to read as follows:

19 a. Any person desiring to vote shall sign a voter's  
20 declaration provided by the officials, in substantially the  
21 following form:

VOTER'S DECLARATION  
OF ELIGIBILITY

I do solemnly swear or affirm that I am a resident of  
the .... precinct, .... ward or township, city of .....,  
county of ....., Iowa. I am a citizen of the United States.  
I am a registered voter. I was born on the .... day of ....  
(month) .... (year). I have not voted and will not  
vote in any other precinct in said election.  
I understand that any false statement in this declaration is a  
criminal offense punishable as provided by law.

6 Sec. 11. Section 49.80, subsection 2, paragraph a, Code 2025,  
 7 is amended by adding the following new subparagraph:

8 NEW SUBPARAGRAPH. (5) The person's citizenship status.

9 Sec. 12. Section 50.22, subsection 2, Code 2025, is amended  
 10 to read as follows:

11 2. The decision to count or reject each ballot shall be  
 12 made upon the basis of the information given on the envelope  
 13 containing the provisional ballot, the evidence concerning  
 14 the challenge, the registration and the returned receipts of  
 15 registration. Ballots submitted to the board pursuant to section  
 16 49.78 or 49.81 that are not cured by the deadline provided in  
 17 section 49.81, subsection 6, shall be rejected.

18 EXPLANATION

19 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with  
 20 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

21 This bill relates to voter registration.

22 The bill specifies that the state registrar of voters may  
 23 contract with federal and state agencies and private entities  
 24 for voter registration verification purposes and allows the state  
 25 registrar to adopt rules regarding the use of federal and state  
 26 sources of information for voter registration file maintenance.

27 The bill requires the department of transportation (DOT) to  
 28 share with the state registrar of voters a list of each person  
 29 who has submitted documentation indicating that the person is not  
 30 a citizen of the United States and requires the state registrar  
 31 of voters to compare the list of registered voters with the  
 32 noncitizen identification information maintained by the DOT.

33 The bill prohibits the DOT and other voter registration  
 34 agencies from treating applications for driver's licenses,  
 35 nonoperator's identification cards, services, or assistance as

1 applications for voter registration if the applicant submits  
2 documentation demonstrating that the applicant is not a citizen  
3 of the United States.

4 The bill requires a voter registration to be marked as  
5 "unconfirmed" if a registrant marks on the voter registration  
6 form that the registrant is a noncitizen and also signs the  
7 portion of the form affirming that the registrant is a citizen of  
8 the United States or if the state registrar of voters or county  
9 commissioner of elections receives reliable information that the  
10 registered voter is not a citizen of the United States. The  
11 bill requires a voter registration to be changed from unconfirmed  
12 to active if the registered voter provides evidence that the  
13 registered voter is qualified to vote. The bill adds a statement  
14 regarding citizenship status to the declaration of eligibility  
15 signed by each voter prior to receiving a ballot.

16 The bill also requires a voter registration to be canceled  
17 if the registered voter submits documentation that indicates  
18 that the registered voter is not a citizen of the United States  
19 or reports to a state or federal agency that the registered  
20 voter is not a citizen of the United States. The bill allows  
21 a precinct election official to question a person about the  
22 person's citizenship status if the right of the person to vote  
23 is challenged at the time the person is offering to vote.

24 The bill requires the special precinct election board to  
25 reject provisional ballots that have not been cured by the  
26 statutory deadline.
