SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 2006

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A Joint Resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution of
2 the State of Iowa relating to medical treatment.
3 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of the
2 State of Iowa is proposed:

3 Article I of the Constitution of the State of Iowa is amended
4 by adding the following new section:

5 Sec. 26. **Medical treatment.** The right of a person to refuse
6 any medical procedure, treatment, injection, device, vaccine,
7 or prophylactic shall not be impeded or interfered with in any
8 manner. Equality of rights and liberty in the domain of public
9 accommodations shall not be denied, abridged, or restricted due
10 to the exercise of the right under this section.

11 Sec. 2. REFERRAL AND PUBLICATION. The foregoing proposed
12 amendment to the Constitution of the State of Iowa is referred
13 to the general assembly to be chosen at the next general election
14 for members of the general assembly, and shall be published as
15 provided by law for three consecutive months previous to the date
16 of that election.

17 **EXPLANATION**

18 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
19 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

20 This joint resolution proposes an amendment to the
21 Constitution of the State of Iowa providing that the right of
22 a person to refuse any medical procedure, treatment, injection,
23 device, vaccine, or prophylactic shall not be impeded or
24 interfered with in any manner. The proposed amendment also
25 provides that equality of rights and liberty in the domain
26 of public accommodations shall not be denied, abridged, or
27 restricted due to the exercise of this right.

28 The resolution, if adopted, would be published and then
29 referred to the next general assembly (92nd) for adoption before
30 being submitted to the electorate for ratification.
