

**Senate Study Bill 3095 - Introduced**

SENATE/HOUSE FILE \_\_\_\_\_  
BY (PROPOSED GOVERNOR BILL)

**A BILL FOR**

1 An Act requiring annual reports on antisemitism in community  
2 colleges, regents institutions, and public school districts.  
3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 256.7, Code 2026, is amended by adding the  
2 following new subsection:

3 NEW SUBSECTION. 36. Submit to the general assembly and  
4 governor, by October 1 of each year, a report identifying each  
5 complaint or incident of antisemitism that occurred at each  
6 community college, institution of higher education under the  
7 control of the state board of regents, and public school district  
8 from the prior academic year, and the findings and outcomes  
9 of any investigations conducted, as reported by each community  
10 college, institution of higher education, and public school  
11 district. For the purposes of this subsection, "antisemitism"  
12 means the same as defined in section 216F.1.

13 Sec. 2. Section 260C.14, Code 2026, is amended by adding the  
14 following new subsection:

15 NEW SUBSECTION. 27. Annually, by September 1, submit to the  
16 state board of education a report identifying each complaint or  
17 incident of antisemitism that occurred at the community college  
18 from the prior academic year, and the findings and outcomes of  
19 any investigations conducted. For purposes of this subsection,  
20 "antisemitism" means the same as defined in section 216F.1.

21 Sec. 3. NEW SECTION. **262.93A Annual report on**  
22 **antisemitism.**

23 The state board of regents shall submit to the state board  
24 of education, by September 1 of each year, a report identifying  
25 each complaint or incident of antisemitism that occurred at each  
26 of the institutions of higher education under the control of the  
27 board from the prior academic year, and the findings and outcomes  
28 of any investigations conducted. The board shall conduct an  
29 annual review of the policies of the regents institutions related  
30 to antisemitic actions and speech, and provide the findings  
31 of such review in the report. For purposes of this section,  
32 "antisemitism" means the same as defined in section 216F.1.

33 Sec. 4. NEW SECTION. **279.89 Annual report on**  
34 **antisemitism.**

35 The board of directors of each public school district shall

1 report annually to the state board of education, by September 1  
2 of each year, a report identifying each complaint or incident  
3 of antisemitism that occurred at the school district from  
4 the prior academic year, and the findings and outcomes of  
5 any investigations conducted. For purposes of this section,  
6 "antisemitism" means the same as defined in section 216F.1.

7 EXPLANATION

8 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with  
9 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

10 This bill requires the state board of education to submit an  
11 annual report to the general assembly and governor by October  
12 1 of each year, identifying each complaint or incident of  
13 antisemitism that occurred during the prior academic year at  
14 each community college, institution of higher education under  
15 the control of the state board of regents, and public school  
16 district. The bill requires the report to include the findings  
17 and outcomes of any investigations conducted. The bill requires  
18 the board of directors of each community college, the state board  
19 of regents, and the board of directors of each public school  
20 district to submit a report to the state board of education by  
21 September 1 of each year identifying each complaint or incident  
22 of antisemitism that occurred during the prior academic year  
23 at the respective institution for use in the state board of  
24 education's annual report.

25 The bill also requires the state board of regents to conduct  
26 an annual review of policies related to antisemitic actions and  
27 speech at regents institutions, and to include such findings in  
28 the report.
