

**House Study Bill 707 - Introduced**

**A BILL FOR**

1 An Act relating to the suspension of a person's driver's  
2 license for unlawful or fraudulent uses, and including  
3 applicability provisions.  
4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 321.210, subsection 1, paragraph a,  
2 subparagraph (4), Code 2026, is amended to read as follows:

3 (4) Has unlawfully or fraudulently used or permitted an  
4 unlawful or fraudulent use of the a license.

5 Sec. 2. Section 321.212, subsection 1, paragraph a,  
6 subparagraph (2), Code 2026, is amended to read as follows:

7 (2) ~~A suspension~~ The department shall suspend a license for  
8 six months under section 321.210, subsection 1, paragraph "a",  
9 subparagraph (4), for a violation of section 321.216, 321.216A,  
10 321.216B shall not exceed six months, or 321.216C. As soon as  
11 practicable after the period of suspension has expired, but  
12 not later than six months after the date of expiration, the  
13 department shall expunge information regarding the suspension  
14 from the person's driving record if the suspension was for a  
15 violation of section 321.216B or 321.216C.

16 Sec. 3. Section 321.215, subsection 1, paragraph b, Code  
17 2026, is amended to read as follows:

18 b. However, a temporary restricted license shall not be  
19 issued to a person whose license is revoked pursuant to a court  
20 order issued under section 321.209, subsections 1 through 5; to  
21 a juvenile whose license has been suspended or revoked pursuant  
22 to a dispositional order under section 232.52, subsection 2,  
23 paragraph "a", for a violation of chapter 124 or 453B or section  
24 126.3; to a person whose license has been suspended pursuant to  
25 section 321.210, subsection 1, paragraph "a", subparagraph (4);  
26 to a juvenile whose license has been suspended under section  
27 321.213B; or to a person whose license has been suspended  
28 pursuant to a court order under section 714.7D. A temporary  
29 restricted license may be issued to a person whose license is  
30 revoked under section 321.209, subsection 6, only if the person  
31 has no previous drag racing convictions. A person holding a  
32 temporary restricted license issued by the department under  
33 this section shall not operate a motor vehicle for pleasure.

34 Sec. 4. Section 321.215, subsection 2, unnumbered paragraph  
35 1, Code 2026, is amended to read as follows:

1 Upon conviction and the suspension or revocation of a  
2 person's noncommercial driver's license under section 321.209,  
3 subsection 5, 6, or 7, ~~or~~ section 321.210, subsection 1,  
4 paragraph "a", subparagraph (1), (2), (3), (5), (6), or (7), or  
5 section 321.210A, or 321.513; or upon the denial of issuance  
6 of a noncommercial driver's license under section 321.560,  
7 based solely on offenses enumerated in section 321.555,  
8 subsection 1, paragraph "c", or section 321.555, subsection  
9 2; or upon suspension or revocation of a juvenile's driver's  
10 license pursuant to a dispositional order under section 232.52,  
11 subsection 2, paragraph "a", for a violation of chapter 124  
12 or 453B, or section 126.3; or upon suspension of a driver's  
13 license pursuant to a court order under section 714.7D, the  
14 person may apply to the department for a temporary restricted  
15 license to operate a motor vehicle for the limited purpose or  
16 purposes specified in subsection 1. The application may be  
17 granted only if all of the following criteria are satisfied:  
18 Sec. 5. APPLICABILITY. This Act applies to driver's license  
19 suspensions for the unlawful or fraudulent use of a driver's  
20 license on or after July 1, 2027.

21 EXPLANATION

22 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with  
23 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

24 Under current law, the department of transportation (DOT)  
25 is authorized to adopt rules providing for the suspension of  
26 a person's driver's license for up to one year upon 30 days'  
27 notice and without preliminary hearing upon a showing by the  
28 DOT's records or other sufficient evidence that the person has,  
29 among other things, permitted an unlawful or fraudulent use of  
30 the person's license. However, if the suspension is due to a  
31 person under the age of 21 altering, displaying, or possessing  
32 a fictitious or fraudulently altered driver's license or  
33 nonoperator's identification card to obtain alcohol, the DOT is  
34 authorized to suspend the license for up to six months.

35 This bill requires the DOT to suspend, for six months,

1 a person's driver's license if the person unlawfully or  
2 fraudulently used or permitted an unlawful or fraudulent use  
3 of a license in violation of Code section 321.216 (unlawful  
4 use of license or nonoperator's identification card), 321.216A  
5 (falsifying driver's licenses, nonoperator's identification  
6 cards, or forms), 321.216B (use of driver's license or  
7 nonoperator's identification card by underage person to  
8 obtain alcohol), or 321.216C (use of driver's license or  
9 nonoperator's identification card by underage person to obtain  
10 tobacco, tobacco products, alternative nicotine products,  
11 vapor products, or cigarettes). The bill also prohibits  
12 the DOT from issuing a temporary restricted license while a  
13 person's driver's license is suspended pursuant to the bill,  
14 and prevents a person from applying for a temporary restricted  
15 license due to hardship or circumstances where alternative  
16 means of transportation do not exist.

17 The bill does not amend the requirement for the DOT to  
18 expunge, as soon as practicable after the period of suspension  
19 has expired but not later than six months after the date of  
20 expiration, information regarding the suspension from the  
21 person's driving record if the suspension was for a violation  
22 of Code section 321.216B. The bill extends this expungement  
23 requirement to violations of Code section 321.216C.

24 A driver's license that has been suspended is eligible for  
25 reinstatement following the period of suspension upon payment  
26 of a \$20 reinstatement fee.

27 The bill applies to suspensions for the unlawful or  
28 fraudulent use of a driver's license on or after July 1, 2027.
