A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to and making appropriations involving state
2 government entities associated with agriculture, natural
3 resources, and environmental protection, and including
4 contingent effective date provisions.

DIVISION I
DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND LAND STEWARDSHIP
PART A
GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS

Section 1. GENERAL FUND.

1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2026, and ending June 30, 2027, the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

For purposes of supporting the department, including its divisions, for administration, regulation, and programs; for salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes; and for not more than the following full-time equivalent positions:
..... \$ 20,727,294
..... FTEs 420.00

2. Of the amount appropriated in subsection 1, the following amount is transferred to Iowa state university of science and technology to be used for the university's midwest grape and wine industry institute:

..... \$ 325,000

3. The department shall submit a report each quarter of the fiscal year to the general assembly and the department of management. The report must describe in detail the expenditure of moneys appropriated in this section to support the department's administration, regulation, and programs.

Sec. 2. UNCLAIMED PARI-MUTUEL WAGERING WINNINGS — HORSE AND DOG RACING. There is appropriated from the moneys available under [section 99D.13](#) to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2026, and ending June 30, 2027, the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

For purposes of supporting the department's administration and enforcement of horse and dog racing law pursuant to section

1 99D.22, including for salaries, support, maintenance, and
2 miscellaneous purposes:
3 \$ 305,516

4 Sec. 3. RENEWABLE FUEL INFRASTRUCTURE FUND — MOTOR
5 FUEL INSPECTION. There is appropriated from the renewable
6 fuel infrastructure fund created in [section 159A.16](#) to the
7 department of agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal
8 year beginning July 1, 2026, and ending June 30, 2027, the
9 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
10 used for the purposes designated:

11 For purposes of the inspection of motor fuel, including
12 salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:
13 \$ 500,000

14 Sec. 4. SPECIAL APPROPRIATIONS FROM GENERAL FUND. There
15 is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the
16 department of agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal
17 year beginning July 1, 2026, and ending June 30, 2027, the
18 following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
19 used for the purposes designated:

20 1. DAIRY REGULATION
21 a. For purposes of performing functions pursuant to section
22 192.109, including conducting a survey of grade "A" milk and
23 certifying the results to the secretary of agriculture:
24 \$ 189,196

25 b. Notwithstanding [section 8.33](#), moneys appropriated in
26 this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
27 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
28 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
29 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

30 2. LOCAL FOOD AND FARM PROGRAM
31 a. For purposes of supporting the local food and farm
32 program pursuant to [chapter 267A](#):
33 \$ 125,000

34 b. The department shall enter into a cost-sharing agreement
35 with Iowa state university of science and technology to support

1 the local food and farm program coordinator position as part of
2 the university's cooperative extension service in agriculture
3 and home economics pursuant to [chapter 267A](#).

4 c. Notwithstanding [section 8.33](#), moneys appropriated in
5 this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
6 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
7 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
8 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

9 3. AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION

10 a. For purposes of allocating moneys to an Iowa association
11 affiliated with a national organization that promotes
12 agricultural education providing for future farmers:

13 \$ 150,000

14 b. Notwithstanding [section 8.33](#), moneys appropriated in
15 this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
16 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
17 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
18 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

19 4. FOREIGN ANIMAL DISEASES AFFLICTING LIVESTOCK

20 For deposit in the foreign animal disease preparedness and
21 response fund created in [section 163.3B](#):

22 \$ 1,050,000

23 5. FARMERS WITH DISABILITIES PROGRAM

24 a. For purposes of supporting a program for farmers with
25 disabilities:

26 \$ 230,000

27 b. The moneys appropriated in this subsection shall be
28 used for the public purpose of providing a grant to a national
29 nonprofit organization with over 80 years of experience in
30 assisting children and adults with disabilities and special
31 needs. The moneys shall be used to support a nationally
32 recognized program that began in 1986 and has been replicated
33 in at least 30 other states, but is not available through
34 any other entity in this state, and that provides assistance
35 to farmers with disabilities in all 99 counties to allow the

1 farmers to remain in their own homes and be gainfully engaged
2 in farming through provision of agricultural worksite and home
3 modification consultations, peer support services, services
4 to families, information and referral, and equipment loan
5 services.

6 c. Notwithstanding [section 8.33](#), moneys appropriated in
7 this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
8 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
9 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
10 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

11 6. LOESS HILLS DEVELOPMENT AND CONSERVATION FUND

12 a. For deposit in the loess hills development and
13 conservation fund created pursuant to [section 161D.2](#):
14 \$ 300,000

15 b. (1) Of the amount appropriated in this subsection,
16 \$260,000 shall be allocated to the fund's hungry canyons
17 account.

18 (2) Not more than 10 percent of the moneys allocated in this
19 paragraph may be used for administrative costs.

20 c. (1) Of the amount appropriated in this subsection,
21 \$40,000 shall be allocated to the fund's loess hills alliance
22 account.

23 (2) Not more than 10 percent of the moneys allocated in this
24 paragraph may be used for administrative costs.

25 7. SOUTHERN IOWA DEVELOPMENT AND CONSERVATION FUND

26 a. For deposit in the southern Iowa development and
27 conservation fund created pursuant to [section 161D.12](#):
28 \$ 100,000

29 b. Not more than 10 percent of the moneys appropriated in
30 this subsection may be used for administrative costs.

31 8. GRAIN REGULATION

32 For the administration and enforcement of [chapters 203](#)
33 and [203C](#), including salaries, support, maintenance, and
34 miscellaneous purposes:

35 \$ 350,000

1 9. CHOOSE IOWA FUND

2 a. For deposit in the choose Iowa fund created in section
3 187.201:

4 \$ 1,813,000

5 b. (1) Of the amount appropriated in this subsection,
6 the department shall use at least \$500,000 to support the
7 value-added agricultural grant program created in section
8 187.321.

9 (2) Of the amount appropriated in this subsection, the
10 department may use up to \$813,000 to support the choose Iowa
11 promotional program as provided in chapter 187, subchapter III,
12 part 1.

13 (3) Of the amount appropriated in this subsection, the
14 department shall use at least \$500,000 to support the dairy
15 innovation and revitalization program created in section
16 187.311.

17 c. The department may increase or decrease the amount of
18 moneys used to support a program described in paragraph "b"
19 based on the amount of moneys awarded to persons participating
20 in the program. The department shall publish a notice of the
21 department's action to increase or decrease the amount on the
22 department's internet site where the programs are advertised at
23 least thirty days prior to the day that the department takes
24 such action.

25 10. CHOOSE IOWA FOOD BANK PURCHASING PROGRAM

26 a. For purposes of supporting the choose Iowa food
27 bank purchasing program to assist eligible participants in
28 purchasing qualified food products pursuant to [section 187.331](#):
29 \$ 200,000

30 b. Notwithstanding [section 8.33](#), moneys appropriated in
31 this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
32 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
33 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
34 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

35 PART B

1 CONTINGENT APPROPRIATIONS

2 Sec. 5. CHOOSE IOWA SCHOOL PURCHASING PROGRAM. There
3 is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the
4 department of agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal
5 year beginning July 1, 2026, and ending June 30, 2027, the
6 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
7 used for the purposes designated:

8 For purposes of supporting the choose Iowa school purchasing
9 program to assist eligible schools and school districts in
10 purchasing qualified food products pursuant to section 187.307:
11 \$ 200,000

12 Sec. 6. CONTINGENT EFFECTIVE DATE. This part of this
13 division of this Act takes effect July 1, 2026, if 2026 Iowa
14 Acts, House File 2748, or successor legislation, is enacted.

15 DIVISION II

16 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

17 Sec. 7. GENERAL FUND.

18 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
19 to the department of natural resources for the fiscal year
20 beginning July 1, 2026, and ending June 30, 2027, the following
21 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the
22 purposes designated:

23 For purposes of supporting the department, including its
24 divisions, for administration, regulation, and programs; for
25 salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes; and
26 for not more than the following full-time equivalent positions:
27 \$ 12,816,738
28 FTEs 1,145.95

29 2. Of the number of full-time equivalent positions
30 authorized to the department pursuant to subsection 1, 50.00
31 full-time equivalent positions shall be allocated by the
32 department for seasonal employees for purposes of providing
33 maintenance, upkeep, and sanitary services at state parks.
34 This subsection shall not impact conservation officer, park
35 ranger, or park manager positions within the department.

1 3. The department shall submit a report each quarter of
2 the fiscal year to the general assembly and the department of
3 management. The report must describe in detail the expenditure
4 of moneys appropriated under this section to support the
5 department's administration, regulation, and programs.

6 Sec. 8. STATE FISH AND GAME PROTECTION FUND — REGULATION
7 AND ADVANCEMENT OF OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES.

8 1. There is appropriated from the state fish and game
9 protection fund created pursuant to [section 456A.17](#) to the
10 department of natural resources for the fiscal year beginning
11 July 1, 2026, and ending June 30, 2027, the following amount,
12 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes
13 designated:

14 For purposes of supporting the regulation or advancement of
15 hunting, fishing, or trapping, or the protection, propagation,
16 restoration, management, or harvest of fish or wildlife,
17 including for administration, regulation, law enforcement, and
18 programs; and for salaries, support, maintenance, equipment,
19 and miscellaneous purposes:

20 \$ 51,404,790

21 2. Notwithstanding [section 455A.10](#), the department may use
22 the unappropriated balance remaining in the state fish and game
23 protection fund to provide for the funding of health and life
24 insurance premium payments from unused sick leave balances
25 of conservation peace officers employed in a protection
26 occupation, as described in [section 97B.49B](#), who retire.

27 3. Notwithstanding [section 455A.10](#), the department may
28 use the unappropriated balance remaining in the state fish
29 and game protection fund for the fiscal year beginning July
30 1, 2026, and ending June 30, 2027, as is necessary to fund
31 salary adjustments for departmental employees for which the
32 general assembly has made an operating budget appropriation in
33 subsection 1.

34 Sec. 9. GROUNDWATER PROTECTION FUND — WATER QUALITY. There
35 is appropriated from the groundwater protection fund created

1 in section 455E.11 to the department of natural resources for
2 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2026, and ending June 30,
3 2027, from those moneys that are not allocated pursuant to
4 that section, the following amount, or so much thereof as is
5 necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

6 For purposes of supporting the department's protection
7 of the state's groundwater, including for administration,
8 regulation, and programs, and for salaries, support,
9 maintenance, equipment, and miscellaneous purposes:

10 \$ 3,455,850

11 Sec. 10. GROUNDWATER PROTECTION FUND — INTEREST AND
12 EARNINGS — WATER QUALITY.

13 1. There is appropriated from interest and earnings on
14 moneys in the groundwater protection fund created in section
15 455E.11 and accounts therein, as described in section 455E.11,
16 subsection 1, paragraph "a", to the department of natural
17 resources for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2026, and
18 ending June 30, 2027, the following amount, or so much thereof
19 as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

20 For purposes of supporting the department's protection
21 of the state's groundwater, including for administration,
22 regulation, and programs, and for salaries, support,
23 maintenance, equipment, and miscellaneous purposes:

24 \$ 254,150

25 2. Notwithstanding subsection 1, the amount appropriated
26 in this section shall not exceed the total amount of interest
27 and earnings on moneys in the groundwater protection fund and
28 accounts therein accrued during the fiscal year beginning
29 July 1, 2026. In addition, the amount appropriated in this
30 section shall only be made available after the maximum amount
31 of such interest and earnings appropriated in this Act is
32 made available to the state university of Iowa to support
33 groundwater monitoring.

34 Sec. 11. SPECIAL SNOWMOBILE FUND — SNOWMOBILE
35 PROGRAM. There is appropriated from the special snowmobile

1 fund created under [section 321G.7](#) to the department of natural
2 resources for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2026, and
3 ending June 30, 2027, the following amount, or so much thereof
4 as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

5 For purposes of administering and enforcing the state
6 snowmobile programs:

7 \$ 100,000

8 Sec. 12. SPECIAL APPROPRIATIONS FROM GENERAL FUND. There
9 is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the
10 department of natural resources for the fiscal year beginning
11 July 1, 2026, and ending June 30, 2027, the following amounts,
12 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes
13 designated:

14 1. FLOODPLAIN MANAGEMENT AND DAM SAFETY

15 a. For purposes of supporting floodplain management and dam
16 safety:

17 \$ 1,510,000

18 b. Of the amount appropriated in this subsection, up to
19 \$400,000 may be used by the department to acquire or install
20 stream gages for purposes of tracking and predicting flood
21 events and for compiling necessary data to improve flood
22 frequency analysis.

23 c. Notwithstanding [section 8.33](#), moneys appropriated in
24 this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
25 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
26 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
27 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

28 2. FORESTRY HEALTH MANAGEMENT

29 a. For purposes of providing for forestry health management
30 programs:

31 \$ 525,000

32 b. Notwithstanding [section 8.33](#), moneys appropriated in
33 this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
34 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
35 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the

1 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

2 3. STATE PARK OPERATIONS

3 For supporting operations at state parks, including
4 maintenance and repair of grounds and facilities:

5 \$ 1,000,000

6 4. STATE PARK MAINTENANCE

7 For structural and infrastructural repairs in state parks:

8 \$ 300,000

9 DIVISION III

10 IOWA STATE UNIVERSITY

11 Sec. 13. SPECIAL APPROPRIATIONS FROM GENERAL FUND. There
12 is appropriated from the general fund of the state to Iowa
13 state university of science and technology for the fiscal year
14 beginning July 1, 2026, and ending June 30, 2027, the following
15 amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the
16 purposes designated:

17 1. VETERINARY DIAGNOSTIC LABORATORY

18 a. For purposes of supporting the college of veterinary
19 medicine for the operation of the veterinary diagnostic
20 laboratory, and for not more than the following full-time
21 equivalent positions:

22 \$ 4,799,898

23 FTEs 51.00

24 b. (1) Iowa state university of science and technology
25 shall not reduce the amount that it allocates to support the
26 college of veterinary medicine from any other source due to the
27 appropriation made in this subsection.

28 (2) Subparagraph (1) does not apply to a reduction made
29 to support the college of veterinary medicine if the same
30 percentage of reduction imposed on the college of veterinary
31 medicine is also imposed on all of Iowa state university of
32 science and technology's budget units.

33 2. MANAGEMENT OF PRIVATE FORESTS

34 a. For purposes of supporting the Iowa cooperative
35 extension service in agriculture and home economics in

1 providing technical support to landowners and loggers regarding
2 the management of private forests in northeast Iowa, and for
3 not more than the following full-time equivalent positions:

4 \$ 150,000
5 FTEs 1.00

6 b. The department of natural resources shall cooperate with
7 the Iowa cooperative extension service in agriculture and home
8 economics in administering this subsection.

9 3. LIVESTOCK DISEASE RESEARCH

10 a. For deposit in the livestock disease research fund
11 created in [section 267.8](#):

12 \$ 291,390

13 b. Moneys appropriated under this subsection shall be used
14 by Iowa state university of science and technology to support
15 animal disease research in areas of importance to livestock
16 producers.

17 Sec. 14. IOWA NUTRIENT RESEARCH FUND — VETERINARY
18 DIAGNOSTIC LABORATORY. Notwithstanding [section 466B.46](#), there
19 is appropriated from the Iowa nutrient research fund created
20 in [section 466B.46](#) to Iowa state university of science and
21 technology for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2026, and
22 ending June 30, 2027, the following amount, or so much thereof
23 as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

24 For purposes of supporting the college of veterinary
25 medicine for the operation of the veterinary diagnostic
26 laboratory:

27 \$ 120,000

28 DIVISION IV

29 STATE UNIVERSITY OF IOWA

30 Sec. 15. IOWA'S CENTER FOR AGRICULTURAL SAFETY AND HEALTH
31 (I-CASH).

32 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
33 to the state university of Iowa for the fiscal year beginning
34 July 1, 2026, and ending June 30, 2027, the following amount,
35 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes

1 designated:

2 For supporting the operations of Iowa's center for
3 agricultural safety and health, as part of the university's
4 college of public health, and in cooperation with the
5 department of agriculture and land stewardship, to anticipate,
6 recognize, and prevent occupational illness and injury among
7 members of the agricultural community:
8 \$ 128,154

9 2. a. As a condition of the appropriation made in
10 subsection 1, the state university of Iowa shall retain the
11 director of Iowa's center for agricultural safety and health
12 employed on the effective date of this division of this Act for
13 at least the same number of hours for the fiscal year beginning
14 July 1, 2026, as worked by the director during the fiscal year
15 beginning July 1, 2025.

16 b. As a condition of the appropriation made in subsection
17 1, the state university of Iowa shall not reduce the amount
18 allocated to support Iowa's center for agricultural safety and
19 health from any other source due to the appropriation made in
20 subsection 1.

21 3. If moneys appropriated in subsection 1 revert as required
22 pursuant to [section 8.33](#), the state university of Iowa shall
23 transfer to the general fund of the state from any otherwise
24 unencumbered or unobligated moneys from any other general
25 fund appropriation or from any moneys available from other
26 funding sources an amount equal to the amount appropriated in
27 subsection 1 less any amount that reverted to the general fund
28 of the state pursuant to [section 8.33](#).

29 Sec. 16. GROUNDWATER PROTECTION FUND — IIHR —
30 HYDROSCIENCE AND ENGINEERING — GROUNDWATER MONITORING.

31 1. There is appropriated from interest and earnings on
32 moneys in the groundwater protection fund created in section
33 455E.11 and accounts therein, as described in section 455E.11,
34 subsection 1, paragraph "a", to the state university of Iowa
35 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2026, and ending June 30,

1 2027, the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary,
2 to be used for the purposes designated:

3 To support groundwater monitoring as administered by the
4 IIHR — hydrosience and engineering within the college of
5 engineering of the state university of Iowa:
6 \$ 300,000

7 2. Notwithstanding subsection 1, the amount appropriated
8 in this section shall not exceed the total amount of interest
9 and earnings on moneys in the groundwater protection fund and
10 accounts therein accrued during the fiscal year beginning July
11 1, 2026.

12 Sec. 17. Section 16.153, subsection 1, Code 2026, is amended
13 by adding the following new paragraph:

14 NEW PARAGRAPH. d. (1) There is appropriated from the fund
15 to the state university of Iowa for the fiscal year beginning
16 July 1, 2026, and for each fiscal year thereafter, two hundred
17 fifty thousand dollars to be used by the Iowa geological survey
18 as provided in subparagraph (2).

19 (2) The moneys appropriated in subparagraph (1) shall
20 be used by the Iowa geological survey to map and assess the
21 condition of this state’s aquifers. The Iowa geological survey
22 may measure the volume of the groundwater that is available
23 for various uses, the current and predicted allocations of
24 groundwater to support those uses, the recharge rate for the
25 aquifers, and the development of models for budgeting this
26 state’s water resources.

27 (3) This paragraph is repealed July 1, 2030.

28 DIVISION V

29 ENVIRONMENT FIRST FUND — GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS

30 Sec. 18. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND LAND

31 STEWARDSHIP. There is appropriated from the environment first
32 fund created in [section 8.57A](#) to the department of agriculture
33 and land stewardship for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
34 2026, and ending June 30, 2027, the following amounts, or so
35 much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes

1 designated:

2 1. CONSERVATION RESERVE ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM (CREP)

3 a. For the conservation reserve enhancement program to
4 restore and construct wetlands for the purposes of intercepting
5 tile line runoff, reducing nutrient loss, improving water
6 quality, and enhancing agricultural production practices:

7 \$ 1,000,000

8 b. Not more than 10 percent of the moneys appropriated
9 in paragraph "a" may be used for costs of administration and
10 implementation of soil and water conservation practices.

11 c. Notwithstanding section 8.57A, subsection 3, or any
12 other provision of law to the contrary, the department may use
13 moneys appropriated in this subsection, in combination with
14 other appropriate environment first fund appropriations, for
15 cost sharing to match United States department of agriculture,
16 natural resources conservation service, wetlands reserve
17 enhancement program (WREP) funding available to Iowa.

18 2. WATERSHED PROTECTION

19 a. For continuation of a program that provides
20 multiobjective resource protections for flood control, water
21 quality, erosion control, and natural resource conservation:

22 \$ 900,000

23 b. Not more than 10 percent of the moneys appropriated
24 in paragraph "a" may be used for costs of administration and
25 implementation of soil and water conservation practices.

26 3. CONSERVATION RESERVE PROGRAM (CRP)

27 a. To encourage and assist farmers in enrolling in and the
28 implementation of the federal conservation reserve program and
29 to work with them to enhance their revegetation efforts to
30 improve water quality and habitat:

31 \$ 900,000

32 b. Not more than 10 percent of the moneys appropriated
33 in paragraph "a" may be used for costs of administration and
34 implementation of soil and water conservation practices.

35 4. SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION

1 a. For use by the department in providing for soil and water
2 conservation:

3 \$ 8,325,000

4 b. (1) Of the amount appropriated in paragraph "a", for
5 transfer to the hungry canyons account of the loess hills
6 development and conservation fund created in [section 161D.2](#):

7 \$ 140,000

8 (2) Not more than 10 percent of the moneys transferred in
9 subparagraph (1) may be used for administrative costs.

10 c. Of the remaining amount appropriated in paragraph "a",
11 for use by the department in providing for soil and water
12 conservation administration, the conservation of soil and
13 water resources, or the support of soil and water conservation
14 districts:

15 \$ 8,185,000

16 d. Of the amount appropriated in paragraph "c" that the
17 department allocates to a soil and water conservation district,
18 the first \$15,000 may be expended by the district for the
19 purpose of providing financial incentives under [section 161A.73](#)
20 to establish management practices for the control of soil
21 erosion on land that is row-cropped, including but not limited
22 to nontill planting, ridge-till planting, and contouring

25 persons who hold a legal interest in agricultural land used in

30 c. The division shall implement a demonstration project on
31 a cost-share basis as determined by the division. However,

31 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
32 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

33 This bill relates to and makes appropriations for FY
34 2026-2027 involving state government entities associated
35 with agriculture, natural resources, and environmental

1 protection, including the department of agriculture and land
2 stewardship (DALs), department of natural resources (DNR), Iowa
3 state university of science and technology (ISU), and state
4 university of Iowa (UI).

5 DALs. The bill appropriates moneys from the general fund
6 of the state (GF) to DALs for general operations, ISU's
7 midwest grape and wine industry institute, dairy regulation,
8 the local food and farm program, agricultural education,
9 foreign animal disease preparedness and response, the farmers
10 with disabilities program, loess hills development and
11 conservation, southern Iowa development and conservation, grain
12 regulation, the choose Iowa fund, and the choose Iowa food
13 bank purchasing program. The bill also appropriates moneys to
14 DALs from pari-mutuel wagering winnings for administration and
15 enforcement of horse and dog racing, and from the renewable
16 fuel infrastructure fund for motor fuel inspections. The bill
17 appropriates moneys from the general fund of the state to DALs
18 for the choose Iowa school purchasing program contingent on the
19 enactment of legislation creating the program.

20 DNR. The bill appropriates moneys from the GF to DNR for
21 general operations, floodplain management and dam safety,
22 forestry health management, and state park operations and
23 maintenance. The bill also appropriates moneys to DNR from the
24 state fish and game protection fund for various activities,
25 from the groundwater protection fund for DNR's groundwater
26 protection activities, and from the special snowmobile fund for
27 snowmobile programs.

28 ISU. The bill appropriates moneys from the GF to ISU for
29 the veterinary diagnostic laboratory, management of private
30 forests, and livestock disease research. The bill also
31 appropriates moneys from the Iowa nutrient research fund to ISU
32 for the veterinary diagnostic laboratory.

33 UI. The bill appropriates moneys from the GF to UI for the
34 center for agricultural safety and health, from the groundwater
35 protection fund to UI for purposes of groundwater monitoring,

1 and from the water quality financing program fund to UI for
2 mapping and assessing the condition of Iowa's aquifers by the
3 Iowa geological survey.

4 ENVIRONMENT FIRST FUND. The bill appropriates moneys from
5 the environment first fund (EFF) to DALs for the conservation
6 reserve enhancement program, watershed protection, the
7 conservation reserve program, soil and water conservation,
8 and the water quality initiative fund; to DNR for state park
9 maintenance and operations, the geographic information system,
10 water quality monitoring, the public water supply system
11 account, regulation of animal feeding operations, floodplain
12 management and dam safety, and ambient air quality; and to
13 UI for Iowa geological survey operations and water resource
14 management.

15 RESOURCES ENHANCEMENT AND PROTECTION. For FY 2026-2027, the
16 bill appropriates moneys from the EFF to the Iowa resources
17 enhancement and protection (REAP) fund in lieu of the standing
18 GF appropriation. The bill also allows certain moneys in the
19 open spaces account of the REAP fund to be used by DNR for
20 state park maintenance, development, operations, and facility
21 refurbishment.

22 ANIMAL DISEASE PREPAREDNESS AND RESPONSE. The bill
23 appropriates moneys from the Iowa animal disease prevention
24 fund to DALs and ISU to support various activities relating to
25 animal disease preparedness and response.
