A BILL FOR

1 An Act to establish an interior design examining board, to provide for the registration of interior designers in order to use the title of registered interior designer, and to provide fees and penalties. 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA: 6 TLSB 6333HV 80

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Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 544C.1 DEFINITIONS.

As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise 3 requires:

"Board" means the interior design examining board 1. 5 established pursuant to this chapter.

2. "Division" means the professional licensing and 6

regulation division of the department of commerce.

3. "Interior design" means the performance of professional 1 8 1 9 services that include:

10 a. Analyzing the client's needs, goals, and life safety 11 requirements for interior spaces.

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b. Identification, verification, and analysis of 1 13 requirements for planning and design of interior spaces of a 1 14 building or structure.

c. Integrating requirements with knowledge of interior 1 16 design.

d. Formulating preliminary interior design concepts.e. Preparing documents to illustrate interior materials, 1 19 finishes, space planning, reflected ceiling plans, 1 20 furnishings, fixtures, and equipment.
1 21 f. Developing and presenting final interior design

1 22 recommendations and specifications.

- g. Preparing and filing with code enforcement officials 24 interior design construction documents for nonstructural 1 25 interior construction.
 - h. Obtaining building permits for nonstructural interior 27 construction.
- i. Collaborating with closely allied design professionals 1 29 who are licensed practitioners offering professional services. 30
 - j. Preparing and administering interior design bids as a

31 client's agent. 1 1 32

- k. Reviewing and evaluating the implementation and 33 completion of interior design projects as a representative of 34 and on behalf of the client.
 35 4. "Nonstructural" means interior elements or components
 - that are not load bearing and do not require design
- 2 computations for a building's structure.
 3 5. "Registered interior designer" means an interior 4 designer registered under this chapter who is a registered 5 design professional qualified by education, experience, and examination to affect the function, safety, and quality of 6 interior spaces.
- "Registrant" means an interior designer registered 6. 9 under this chapter.
- "Registration" means the certificate of registration 10 7. 11 issued by the board to an interior designer under this
- 12 chapter.

 13 8. "Space planning" means the analysis and design of 13 2 14 spatial requirements, including but not limited to space 15 layouts and final planning.
- 2 16 Sec. 2. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 2 17 DESIGN EXAMINING BOARD. 544C.2 ESTABLISHMENT OF INTERIOR
- 2 18 An interior design examining board is established within 2 19 the division. The board consists of seven members, five

2 20 members who are interior designers who possess registration 2 21 issued under this chapter, and who have been in the active 2 22 practice of interior design for not less than five years, the 2 23 last two of which shall have been in Iowa; and two members who 2 24 do not possess registration issued under this chapter and who 25 shall represent the general public. Members shall be 26 appointed by the governor subject to confirmation by the 27 senate. Professional associations or societies composed of interior 29 designers may recommend the names of potential board members 30 to the governor but the governor is not bound by the 31 recommendations. A board member is not required to be a 32 member of any professional association or society composed of 33 registered interior designers. 2 Appointments shall be for three=year terms and shall 35 commence and end as provided in section 69.19. Vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term by appointment of the governor and shall require senate confirmation. Members shall 3 serve no more than three terms or nine years, whichever is 3 4 less. Sec. NEW SECTION. 544C.3 PUBLIC MEMBERS' 6 PARTICIPATION. 3 The public members of the board shall be allowed to 8 participate in administrative, clerical, or ministerial 3 functions incident to giving the examination required in 9 10 section 544C.5, but shall not determine the content of the 11 examination or determine the correctness of the answers. Sec. 4. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 544C.4 OFFICERS. 3 13 At a time to be determined by the board, the board shall 3 14 elect from its membership officers to serve for a term not to 15 exceed one year. The division shall provide staff assistance. 16 Sec. 5. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 544C.5 DUTIES. 16 17 The board shall enforce this chapter, shall establish 18 requirements for the examination, education, and practical 3 19 training of applicants for registration, and, after public 3 20 notice, shall conduct or authorize representatives of the 21 board to conduct examinations of applicants for registration. 22 Examinations shall be given as often as deemed necessary, but 23 not less than annually. The board shall hold meetings each 24 year for the purpose of transacting business pertaining to the 25 affairs of the board. Action at a meeting shall not be taken 26 without the affirmative votes of a majority of the members of The board may adopt rules under chapter 17A, 27 the board. 28 necessary for the proper performance of its duties. The rules 29 may include, but are not limited to, standards and criteria 30 for examination, education, and practical training 31 requirements for registration, registration renewal, 32 professional conduct, discipline, and continuing education.
33 The administrator of the division shall hire and provide staff 34 to assist the board in its implementation of this chapter. Sec. 6. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 544C.6 RECORDS == ROSTER.

The board shall keep a record, open to public inspection at 2 all reasonable times, of its proceedings relating to the 3 issuance, refusal, renewal, suspension, and revocation of registration. This record shall also contain a roster 4 registration. indicating the name, place of business and residence, and the

6 date and number of the registration of every registrant.
7 Sec. 7. NEW SECTION. 544C.7 EXPENSES == COMPENSATION.

Sec. 7. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 544C.7 EXPENSES == COMPENSATION. The members of the board are entitled to be reimbursed for the actual expenses incurred in the performance of their 10 duties within the limits of the funds appropriated to the board. Each member of the board may also be eligible to 4 12 receive compensation as provided in section 7E.6.

NEW SECTION. 544C.8 QUALIFICATIONS FOR Sec. 8. 14 REGISTRATION.

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1. Each applicant for registration must meet the practical 16 training and education requirements relating to interior 17 design services adopted by rule by the board, and 18 satisfactorily have passed an examination in technical and 4 19 professional subjects relating to interior design services 20 prescribed by the board. Applications for registration shall 21 be on forms prescribed and furnished by the board. 22 The board may adopt as its rules relating to interior

23 design services criteria published by a national certification 24 body recognized by the board. The board shall adopt the 25 uniform standardized examination and grading procedures, and 26 the education and practical training requirements of the 27 national council for interior design qualification, or 28 equivalent procedures and requirements specified by the board. 29 The procedures and requirements adopted or specified shall 4 30 include, at a minimum, a four=year professional degree in

4 31 interior design or an equivalent education and practical 4 32 training requirement determined by the board; a structure 4 33 internship incorporating qualitative as well as quantitative 4 34 criteria; and an examination that is task=oriented, focused on 4 35 public safety, and validated by recognized testing agencies.

2. The examination adopted by the board may be conducted by representatives of the board. The identity of the applicant taking the examination shall be concealed until 2 by representatives of the board. 4 after the examination has been graded. The board shall adopt 5 rules regarding reexamination of applicants who failed to pass the examination. An applicant who has failed the examination may request in writing information from the board concerning 8 the applicant's examination grade and subject areas or questions which the applicant failed to answer correctly 10 except that if the board administers a uniform, standardized 11 examination, the board shall only be required to provide such 12 information concerning the applicant's examination results as 13 is available to the board.

The board may also grant registration by reciprocity. 15 An applicant applying to the board for registration by 16 reciprocity shall furnish satisfactory evidence that the 5 17 applicant meets both of the following requirements:

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Holds a valid registration or license issued by another 19 registration authority recognized by the board, where the 20 qualifications for registration or licensure were 21 substantially equivalent to those prescribed in this state on 22 the date of original registration or licensure with the other 23 registration authority.

b. Holds a current certificate number issued by the 25 national council for interior design qualification.

Sec. 9. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 544C.9 APPLICANT == CIVIL RIGHTS == 27 MORAL CHARACTER.

An applicant is not ineligible for registration because of 29 age, citizenship, sex, race, religion, marital status, or 30 national origin, although the application form may require 31 citizenship information. Character references may be 32 required.

33 The board may consider the following when investigating an 34 applicant's moral character:

- 1. An applicant's conviction for commission of a felony, but only if the felony relates directly to the practice of interior design.
- 3 2. An applicant's misstatement, omission, or 4 misrepresentation of a material fact in connection with the 5 applicant's application for registration in this state or 6 another jurisdiction.
- 3. An applicant's violation of a rule of conduct of a jurisdiction in which the applicant has previously engaged in the practice of interior design, provided that the rule of 10 conduct violated is substantially equivalent to a then= 11 existing or current rule of conduct required of registered 12 interior designers in this state.

If the applicant's background includes any of the 14 foregoing, the board may register the applicant on the basis 15 of suitable evidence of reform.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 10. 544C.10 REGISTRATION ISSUANCE. When the applicant has complied with the qualifications for 18 registration in sections 544C.8 and 544C.9 to the satisfaction 19 of a majority of the members of the board and has paid the 20 fees prescribed by the board pursuant to section 544C.12, the 21 secretary of the board shall enroll the applicant's name and 22 address in the roster of registered interior designers and 23 issue to the applicant a registration, signed by the officers 24 of the board. The certificate shall entitle the applicant to 25 use the title "registered interior designer" in this state. 26 Sec. 11. NEW SECTION. 544C.11 RENEWALS.

Registrations expire in multiyear intervals as determined 28 by the board. Registered interior designers shall renew their 29 registration and pay a renewal fee in the manner prescribed by 30 the board. The board shall prescribe the conditions and 31 reasonable penalties for renewal after a registration's 32 expiration date.

Sec. 12. NEW SECTION. 544C.12 FEES.

The board shall set the fees for registration as a 35 registered interior designer, for renewal of registration, for 1 reinstatement of registration, and for other activities of the 2 board pertaining to its duties. The fee for registration and 3 for renewal of registration shall be based upon the administrative costs of sustaining the board which shall include, but are not limited to, the costs for all of the 6 following:

Per diem, expenses, and travel for board members. 2. Office facilities, supplies, and equipment.

3. Staff assistance.

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7 10 All fees shall be deposited in the general fund of the 7 11 state.

NEW SECTION. 544C.13 REVOCATION OR SUSPENSION.

A registration may be revoked or suspended when a 14 registrant is found guilty of the following acts or offenses:

1. Fraud in procuring a certificate of registration.

Professional incompetency.

- 7 17 3. Knowingly making misleading, deceptive, untrue, or 7 18 fraudulent representations in the practice of the registrant's 7 19 profession or engaging in unethical conduct or practice 7 20 harmful or detrimental to the public. Proof of actual injury 21 need not be established.
 - Habitual intoxication or addiction to the use of drugs. 5.
 - 5. Conviction of a felony related to the profession or occupation of the registrant. A copy of the record of 24 conviction or plea of guilty shall be conclusive evidence of 25 the conviction.
 - 6.
 - Fraud in representations as to skill or ability. Use of untruthful or improbable statements in 7. advertisements.
 - 8. Unlawful use of the title of registered interior designer.
 - 9. Willful or repeated violations of the provisions of 33 this chapter.

10. Willful or repeated violations of one or more rules of 35 conduct adopted by the board.

The board may revoke or suspend any registration after thirty days' notice with grant of hearing to the holder if satisfactory proof is presented to the board.

Proceedings for the revocation or suspension of a 5 registration shall be initiated by filing written charges 6 against the accused with the board. Upon the filing of charges, the board may request the department of inspections 8 and appeals to conduct an investigation into the charges. department of inspections and appeals shall report its 10 findings to the board, and a time and place for the hearing of 11 the charges shall be fixed by the board if the board 12 determines that a hearing is warranted. A copy of the 13 charges, together with a notice of the time and place fixed 8 14 for the hearing, shall be served on the accused at least 8 15 thirty days before the date fixed for the hearing. 16 personal service or service through counsel cannot be 8 17 effected, service may be by publication. At the hearing, the 8 18 accused has the right to appear personally or be represented 19 by counsel, to produce evidence and witnesses in defense, and 20 to cross=examine witnesses. The board may subpoena witnesses, 21 administer oaths to witnesses, and employ counsel. The 22 shall make a written report of its findings, which is 23 conclusive, and may suspend or revoke the registration. The board 24 board may restore the registration to any person whose 25 registration has been revoked. Application for the 26 restoration of a certificate of registration shall be made in 8 27 such manner, form, and content as the board may prescribe.

8 28 Sec. 14. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 544C.14 UNLAWFUL USE OF TITLE OF 29 REGISTERED INTERIOR DESIGNER == VIOLATIONS == PENALTY == 30 CONSENT AGREEMENT.

- 1. It is unlawful for a person to use the title, or aid or 32 abet a person to use the title, of registered interior 33 designer or any title or device indicating that the person is 34 a registered interior designer unless the person has been 35 issued a certificate of registration as provided in this chapter. This section does not prohibit the provision of interior design services, or the use of the terms "interior 3 design" or "interior designer", by an architect or by a person 4 who is not registered as an interior designer.
- A person who violates this section is guilty of a 6 simple misdemeanor. The board, in its discretion and in lieu of prosecuting a first offense described in this section, may 8 enter into a consent agreement with a violator, or with a 9 person guilty of aiding or abetting a violator, which 10 acknowledges the violation and the violator's agreement to

11 refrain from any further violations. 12 Sec. 15. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 544C.15 544C.15 INJUNCTION.

In addition to any other remedies, and on the petition of 14 the board, any person violating this chapter may be restrained 15 and permanently enjoined from committing or continuing the 16 violations.

Sec. 16. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 544C.16 SCOPE OF CHAPTER.

9 18 This chapter does not apply to the following:

1. A person licensed to practice architecture pursuant to 9 20 the laws of this state who is exclusively engaged in the 9 21 practice of the person's profession and who does not represent 9 22 that the person is a "registered interior designer". 9 23

2. A person licensed as a professional engineer pursuant 24 to the laws of this state who is exclusively engaged in the practice of the person's profession and who does not represent 26 that the person is a "registered interior designer".

3. A person providing consultation services regarding 28 interior decoration or furnishings and who does not represent 29 that the person is a "registered interior designer".

4. A person who performs the following services: 31 selecting, or assisting in selecting personal property used in 32 connection with furnishings of interior spaces or fixtures 33 such as, but not limited to, furnishings, decorative 34 accessories, furniture, paint, wall coverings, window 35 treatments, floor coverings, cabinets, countertops, surface= 1 mounted lighting, or decorative materials for a retail sale; 2 or installing or coordinating installations as a part of the 3 prospective retail sale, or providing computer=aided or other 4 drawings for the purpose of retail sale if the drawings are 5 used for material listed for retail sale; and who does not 6 represent that the person is a "registered interior designer" 7 Sec. 17. NEW SECTION. 544C.17 DISCLOSURE OF CONFIDENTIA 544C.17 DISCLOSURE OF CONFIDENTIAL

INFORMATION == PENALTY.

A member of the board shall not disclose information relating to the following:

- 1. Criminal history or prior misconduct of the applicant.
 2. Information relating to the contents of the
- 10 13 examination.
- 3. Information relating to the examination results other 10 15 than the final score except for information about the results 10 16 of an examination which is given to the applicant who took the examination.

A member of the board who willfully communicates or seeks 10 19 to communicate such information is guilty of a simple 10 20 misdemeanor.

Sec. 18. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 544C.18 REGISTRATION NUMBER.

A registered interior designer may affix the Iowa 10 23 registration number and signature to interior design 10 24 construction documents if required by any state or local 10 25 building department for the purpose of obtaining a building 10 26 permit.

Sec. 19. NEW SECTION. 544C.19 TRANSITION PROVISIONS. For a period of two years from the effective date of this 10 29 Act, the board may issue a certificate as a registered 10 30 interior designer to a person who does not meet the 10 31 examination requirements specified in section 544C.8, if the 10 32 person submits evidence to the board demonstrating both of the 10 33 following:

- 1. Ten years of experience as an interior designer, or 10 35 eight years of experience as an interior designer and two 1 years of interior design education that is acceptable to the board.
 - 2. . Successful completion of the examination conducted with 4 regard to life safety codes and barrier=free requirements 5 prepared by the national council for interior design 6 qualification.
 - Sec. 20. INITIAL BOARD. The initial members of the 8 interior design examining board shall be appointed to the following terms:
 - 1. Two interior designer members shall be appointed for a term of three years.
 - 2. Two interior designer members and one public member shall be appointed for a term of two years.
 - 3. One interior designer member and one public member

11 15 shall be appointed for a term of one year.
11 16 4. The initial interior designer members need not meet the 11 17 requirements for registration, but shall have previously 11 18 passed the examination by the national council for interior 11 19 design qualification, and shall have been in active practice 11 20 for not less than five years, the last two of which shall have 11 21 been in Iowa.

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
