Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 701.11 EVIDENCE OF SIMILAR 2 OFFENSES == SEXUAL ABUSE.

1. In a criminal prosecution in which a defendant has been 4 charged with sexual abuse, evidence of the defendant's 5 commission of another sexual abuse is admissible and may be 6 considered for its bearing on any matter for which the 7 evidence is relevant. This evidence, though relevant, may be 8 excluded if the probative value of the evidence is 9 substantially outweighed by the danger of unfair prejudice, 1 10 confusion of the issues, or misleading the jury, or by 1 11 considerations of undue delay, waste of time, or needless 1 12 presentation of cumulative evidence. This evidence is not 1 13 admissible unless the state presents clear proof of the 1 14 commission of the prior act of sexual abuse.

1 15 If the prosecution intends to offer evidence pursuant 1 16 to this section, the prosecution shall disclose such evidence 1 17 to the defendant, including statements of witnesses or a 1 18 summary of the substance of any testimony that is expected to 1 19 be offered, ten days prior to the scheduled date of trial. 1 20 The court may for good cause shown permit disclosure less than 21 ten days prior to the scheduled date of trial.
22 3. For purposes of this section, "sexual abuse" means any

1 23 commission of or conviction for a crime defined in chapter 24 709. "Sexual abuse" also means any commission of or 25 conviction for a crime in another jurisdiction under a statute 1 26 that is substantially similar to any crime defined in chapter 1 27 709.

Sec. 2. Section 708.2, Code 2003, is amended by adding the 29 following new subsection:

NEW SUBSECTION. 4A. A person who commits an assault, as defined in section 708.1, and who uses any object to penetrate the genitalia or anus of another person, is guilty of a class 1 33 "C" felony.
