HEALTHY IOWANS TOBACCO TRUST == APPROPRIATIONS 2 TO DEPARTMENTS. There is appropriated from the healthy Iowans 3 tobacco trust created in section 12.65 to the following 4 departments for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2006, and 5 ending June 30, 2007, the following amounts, or so much 6 thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes 1 7 designated: 1 8 1. To the department of human services: 1 9 a. To supplement the medical assistance program 1 10 appropriations for the fiscal year, including for 1 11 reimbursement of noninstitutional medical assistance providers 1 12 with the exception of anesthesia and dental providers and to 1 13 continue the resource=based relative value system of 1 14 reimbursement based upon the reimbursement rates established 1 15 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2006, and ending June 1 16 30, 2007, pursuant to 2006 Iowa Acts, House File 2734, if 1 17 enacted; for reimbursement of dental services, hospitals, home 1 18 health care services, critical access hospitals, expansion of 1 19 home health care services and habilitative day care for 1 20 children with special needs, and expansion of respite care 1 21 services provided through home and community=based waivers 1 22 based upon the reimbursement rates established for the fiscal 1 23 year beginning July 1, 2006, and ending June 30, 2007, 1 24 pursuant to 2006 Iowa Acts, House File 2734, if enacted; and 1 25 for provision of coverage to women who require treatment for 26 breast or cervical cancer as provided in section 249A.3, 27 subsection 2, paragraph "b": 1 29 Of the amount appropriated in this paragraph, \$50,000 shall 1 30 be used to continue the efforts of the Iowa chronic care 1 31 consortium pursuant to 2003 Iowa Acts, chapter 112, section 1 32 12, as amended by 2003 Iowa Acts, chapter 179, sections 166 1 33 and 167. 1 b. For child and family services and adoption subsidy 34 1 35 services including for reimbursement of rehabilitative 1 treatment and support services providers, adoption, 2 independent living, shelter care, and home studies services 3 providers, and other service providers under the purview of 4 the department of human services: 2 7 health insurance program appropriation: 8 \$ 200,00 9 d. For general administration of health=related programs: 2 2. To the Iowa department of public health:

2 19 sufficient resources to promote and ensure retailer compliance 2 20 with tobacco laws and ordinances relating to persons under 18 2 21 years of age, and shall prioritize the state's compliance in 2 22 the allocation of available funds to comply with 42 U.S.C. } 2 23 300x=26 and section 453A.2.

(2) Of the full=time equivalent positions funded in this 25 paragraph "a", two full=time equivalent positions shall be 26 utilized to provide for enforcement of tobacco laws, 27 regulations, and ordinances under a chapter 28D agreement 28 entered into between the Iowa department of public health and 29 the alcoholic beverages division of the department of 30 commerce.

31 (3) Of the funds appropriated in this paragraph "a", not 32 more than \$525,759 shall be expended on administration and 33 management of the program.

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(4) Of the funds appropriated in this paragraph "a", not 35 less than 80 percent of the amount expended in the fiscal year 1 beginning July 1, 2001, for community partnerships shall be 2 expended in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2006, for that 3 purpose.

The department shall 11 adopt a methodology for the awarding of the grants to the 3 12 health clinics based upon the order of receipt of 3 13 applications.

(5) The department shall use funds appropriated in this 32 paragraph "c" to develop a program to encourage individuals 33 who are successfully managing their substance abuse problems 34 to serve as role models.

(6) The department shall submit a report annually by March 1 1, to the governor and the general assembly delineating the 2 success rates of the substance abuse treatment programs that

receive funding under this paragraph "c".

(7) The department shall use the additional \$2,000,000 in 5 funds appropriated in this paragraph "c" to fund existing 6 substance abuse treatment programs.
