A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the military division and the homeland security and emergency management division of the department of public defense concerning the activation and use of the civil air patrol, the authority of the adjutant general to 5 enter into interstate agreements for use of national guard personnel, and the use of the national incident management system for state emergencies. 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA: 9 HF 716

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Section 1. Section 29A.1, Code 2005, is amended by adding 2 the following new subsection:

NEW SUBSECTION. OA. "Civil air patrol" means the civilian 4 auxiliary of the United States air force established by the 5 United States Congress in 36 U.S.C. } 40301 et seq., and 10 6 U.S.C. } 9441 et seq.

- 7 Sec. 2. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 29A.3A CIVIL AIR PATROL. 8 1. The civil air patrol may be used to support national 9 guard missions in support of civil authorities as described in 1 10 section 29C.5 or in support of noncombat national guard 11 missions under section 29A.8 or 29A.8A.
 12 2. Requests for activation of the civil air patrol shall
- 1 13 be made to the commander of the Iowa wing of the civil air 14 patrol. Missions shall be in accordance with laws and 1 15 regulations applicable to the United States air force and the 1 16 civil air patrol. Prior to activation of the civil air 1 17 patrol, the adjutant general or the Iowa civil air patrol wing 1 18 commander shall apply to the air force rescue coordination 1 19 center, the air force national security emergency preparedness 1 20 agency, or the civil air patrol national operations center for 1 21 federal mission status and funding.
- 3. If an operation or mission of the civil air patrol is 2.2 1 23 granted federal mission status and assigned an accompanying 24 federal mission number, the following shall apply: 25 a. The operation or mission shall be funded by the federal
- 1 26 government.
- b. When training or operating pursuant to a federal 28 mission number, members of the civil air patrol shall be 29 considered federal employees for the purposes of tort claims 1 30 arising from the performance of the mission or any actions 31 incident to the performance of the mission.
 - 4. If an operation or mission of the civil air patrol is 33 not granted federal mission status and is not assigned an 34 accompanying federal mission number, the following shall 35 apply:
 - Operations and administration of the civil air patrol а. 2 relating to missions not qualifying for federal mission status shall be funded by the state from moneys appropriated to the 4 homeland security and emergency management division of the 5 department of public defense for that purpose.
 - 6 When performing a mission that does not qualify for b. 7 federal mission status, members of the civil air patrol shall 8 be considered state employees for purposes of the Iowa tort 9 claims Act, as provided in chapter 669, and for purposes of 10 workers' compensation, as provided in chapter 85.

 11 Sec. 3. Section 29A.12, Code 2005, is amended to read as
 - 11 12 follows:
- 29A.12 POWERS AND DUTIES.

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The adjutant general shall have command and control of
2 15 the military division, and perform such duties as pertain to
2 16 the office of the adjutant general under law and regulations,
 17 pursuant to the authority vested in the adjutant general by
2 18 the governor. The adjutant general shall superintend the
2 19 preparation of all letters and reports required by the United
  20 States from the state, and perform all the duties prescribed 21 by law. The adjutant general shall have charge of the state
 22 military reservations, and all other property of the state
  23 kept or used for military purposes. The adjutant general
  24 shall cause an inventory to be taken at least once each year
  25 of all military stores, property and funds under the adjutant
  26 general's jurisdiction. In each year preceding a regular
  27 session of the general assembly the adjutant general shall
  28 prepare a detailed report of the transactions of that office,
 29 its expenses, and other matters required by the governor for
  30 the period since the last preceding report, and the governor
 31 may at any time require a similar report.
32 2. The adjutant general may enter into an agreement with
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 33 the secretary of defense to operate the water plant at Camp
  34 Dodge for the use and benefit of the United States,

 35 state of Iowa upon terms and conditions as approved by the
   1 governor. The adjutant general may also enter into an
   2 agreement with the national guard of another state for the use 3 of Iowa national guard personnel and equipment.
         3. The adjutant general may request activation of the
     civil air patrol to provide assistance to the national guard
     in accordance with section 29A.3A. The adjutant general is authorized to provide suitable space in national guard
  8 facilities to support the civil air patrol.

3 15 responsible for the administration of emergency planning
3 16 matters, including emergency resource planning in this state, 3 17 cooperation with, and support of, funding for, and tasking of
3 18 the civil air patrol for missions not qualifying for federal
  19 mission status as described in section 29A.3A, homeland
3 20 security activities, and coordination of available services in
3 21 the event of a disaster.

         Sec. 5. Section 29C.8, subsection 3, paragraph g, Code
3 23 2005, is amended to read as follows:
         g. <del>Develop, implement, Implement</del> and support a uniform the
  <u>25 national</u> incident <del>command</del> <u>management</u> system <u>as established by</u>
3 26 the United States department of homeland security to be used 3 27 by state agencies and local and tribal governments to
3 28 facilitate efficient and effective assistance to those
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3 29 affected by emergencies and disasters. This system shall be 30 consistent with the requirements of the United States 3 31 occupational safety and health administration and a national

3 32 incident management system.

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
