1 An Act relating to a single point of entry long=term living resources system. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA: 4 TLSB 1555YH 82 5 pf/je/5

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LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS == SINGLE POINT OF ENTRY Section 1. 2 LONG=TERM LIVING RESOURCES SYSTEM.

3 1. The general assembly finds that access to information 4 regarding all components of the long-term living resources 5 system is necessary to empower consumers in planning, 6 evaluating, and making decisions to appropriately meet their 7 individual long-term living needs. This access should be 8 provided through a single point of entry into an integrated, 9 seamless system that facilitates navigation of the variety of 10 private and public resources available, minimizes service 11 fragmentation, reduces duplication of administrative paperwork 1 12 and procedures, enhances individual choice, supports informed 1 13 decision making, and increases the cost=effectiveness of long= 1 14 term living services and support systems.

- 2. a. A single point of entry long=term living resources 1 15
- 1 16 system team is created, consisting of the following members: 1 17 (1) The director of the department of elder affairs, or
- 1 18 the director's designee. 1 19 (2) The director of the department of human services, or 1 20 the director's designee.
- (3) The director of public health, or the director's 21 1 22 designee.
  - (4) The director of the department of inspections and
- 24 appeals, or the director's designee. 25 (5) The commissioner of insurance, or the commissioner's 1 26 designee.
  - (6) The executive director of the Iowa finance authority, 28 or the executive director's designee.
- 1 29 (7) The director of the department of veterans affairs, or 30 the director's designee.
  - 31 (8) The director of the department of workforce
- 1 32 development, or the director's designee.
  - (9) A representative of the office of the governor.(10) The director of an area agency on aging or the
  - 35 director's designee and a consumer member selected by the 1 director.
    - (11)The state director of the AARP Iowa chapter or the 3 state director's designee and a consumer member selected by 4 the state director.
    - The chairperson of the older Iowans legislature or (12)the chairperson's designee and a consumer member selected by 6 the chairperson.
      - (13) A representative of the Iowa hospital association.
      - (14)
      - A representative of the Iowa pharmacy association. A representative of the Iowa health care association. (15)
  - 10 A representative of the Iowa association of community (16)12 providers.
- 2 2 13 (17) A representative of the Iowa association of homes and 2 14 services for the aging.
- 2 (18) A representative of the Iowa association of home 15 16 care.
- (19) 2 17 The director of the university of Iowa center on 2 18 aging, or the director's designee.
- (20) Two members of the senate and two members of the

2 20 house of representatives, with not more than one member from 2 21 each chamber being from the same political party.

- 2 22 b. The legislative members of the team shall serve in an 23 ex officio, nonvoting capacity. The two senators shall be 24 appointed by the president of the senate, after consultation 25 with the leaders of the senate, and the two representatives 26 shall be appointed by the speaker of the house, after 27 consultation with the majority leader and the minority leader 2 28 of the house of representatives.
  - 2.9 c. Public members shall receive actual expenses incurred 30 while serving in their official capacity and may also be 31 eligible to receive compensation as provided in section 7E.6. 32

The team shall do all of the following:

- 33 (1)Hold at least four public meetings in at least four 34 geographically balanced venues around the state to receive 35 input regarding access to the long=term living resources system and recommendations for improved access.
- (2) Make recommendations regarding the structure of and 3 best means of providing a single point of entry to the long= 4 term living resources system.
- (3) Submit a report of the team's findings from the 6 meetings described in subparagraph (1) and the team's recommendations for establishing a single point of entry to 8 the long=term living resources system to the general assembly 9 on or before December 1, 2008. The recommendations may 10 provide for multiple access sites that are standardized and 11 coordinated to provide for access to the single point of 12 entry, a management information system that links the 3 13 resources available in order to provide a single electronic 3 14 point of entry to the long=term living resources system, a 15 telephonic single point of entry, or suggestions for 3 16 colocation or integration of long-term living resources system 3 17 administration and services. The report shall also include 18 recommendations for funding the single point of entry to the 3 19 long=term living resources system through available grants or 3 20 other sources.

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
