A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the development and commercialization of businesses in the targeted industry areas of advanced manufacturing, bioscience, and information technology and including a contingent effective date provision.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 15.411 TARGETED INDUSTRIES 2 DEVELOPMENT FUND == FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE. 3 1. A targeted industries development fund is created in 4 the state treasury under the control of the department and 1 1 5 consisting of any moneys appropriated by the general assembly 1 6 and any other moneys available to and obtained or accepted by 7 the department for placement in the fund. The fund shall be 1 8 used to provide financial assistance under this section. 1 9 Payments of interest, repayments of moneys loaned pursuant to 1 10 this section, and recaptures of financial assistance shall be 1 11 deposited in the fund. Moneys in the fund are not subject to 1 12 section 8.33. Notwithstanding section 12C.7, interest or 13 earnings on moneys in the fund shall be credited to the fund.
14 2. The department shall provide financial assistance to 1 14 1 15 encourage research and development activities that have a 1 16 clear potential to lead to commercially viable products or 1 17 services within a reasonable period of time in the industries 1 18 of advanced manufacturing, bioscience, and information 1 19 technology. Financial assistance shall be awarded on a per 20 project basis. A recipient shall not receive financial 21 assistance for more than one hundred fifty thousand dollars. 1 22 In order to receive financial assistance, an applicant must 23 demonstrate the ability to secure one dollar of nonstate 24 moneys for every two dollars received from the fund. 1 1 25 Financial assistance shall be provided from the targeted 1 26 industries development fund created in subsection 1. The department shall provide financial assistance for 1 1 28 up to seven initiatives designed to encourage joint research 29 and development work between insurance or financial services 30 companies in the state and information technology and software 31 companies in the state. Financial assistance shall not exceed 1 32 one hundred thousand dollars per project. In order to receive 1 33 financial assistance, an applicant must demonstrate the 1 34 ability to secure two dollars of nonstate moneys for every 35 dollar received from the fund. Financial assistance shall be 1 awarded to projects that will result in technologies being 2 developed as commercial products for sale by Iowa companies 3 rather than as custom applications for proprietary use by a 2 4 participating insurance or financial services company. Financial assistance shall be provided from the targeted 2 6 industries development fund created in subsection 1. The department shall provide financial assistance to 8 information technology businesses for purposes of upgrading 9 existing employees skills. Financial assistance shall be 10 provided from the targeted industries development fund created 2 11 in subsection 1. In order to receive financial assistance, an 12 applicant must demonstrate the ability to secure two dollars 13 of nonstate moneys for every one dollar received from the 14 fund.

Sec. 2. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 15.412 LEAN MANUFACTURING

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The department of economic development shall establish a 2 18 lean manufacturing institute for purposes of providing 2 19 executive level, in=depth training assistance to manufacturing 2 20 entities in the state. The department of economic development 2 21 may seek nonstate moneys for purposes of supporting the lean 22 manufacturing institute.

Sec. 3. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 15.413 STATEWIDE COMMERCIALIZATION

24 DEVELOPMENT SERVICES ENTITY.

Through a request for proposals process, the department 26 shall contract with a provider for services related to 27 statewide commercialization development in the industries of 28 advanced manufacturing, bioscience, and information 29 technology. The services provided by the provider shall 30 include all of the following:

- Assistance provided directly to businesses by 32 experienced serial entrepreneurs for all of the following 33 activities:
 - a. Business plan development.
 - b. Due diligence.
 - c. Market assessments.
 - Technology assessments. d.
 - e. Other planning activities.
- Operation and coordination of various available 2. 5 competitive seed and prototype development funds.
 - 3. Connecting businesses to private angel investors and the venture capital community.
- 4. Assistance in obtaining access to an experienced pool of managers and operations talent that can staff, mentor, or 10 advise start=up enterprises.
- 5. Support and advice for accessing sources of early stage 12 financing.
- NEW SECTION. 15.414 TARGETED INDUSTRIES Sec. 4. 3 14 INTERNSHIP PROGRAM == FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE.

The department shall establish and administer a targeted 3 16 industries internship program. A community college, private 3 17 college, or an institution of higher learning under the 18 control of the state board of regents and an employer may 3 19 enter into an agreement for purposes of providing internship 3 20 opportunities to students of the community college, private 21 college, or university. Upon entering into such an agreement, 22 the employer may apply to the department for financial 23 assistance. An employer may receive financial assistance in 24 an amount of one dollar for every one dollar spent by the 25 employer. An employer shall not receive financial assistance 26 of more than three thousand one hundred dollars per student. 27 In order to be eligible to receive moneys under this section, 28 the employer must have five hundred or fewer employees and 29 must be engaged in an advanced manufacturing, bioscience, or 30 information technology industry

Sec. 5. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 15.415 MATH AND SCIENCE EDUCATOR 32 STIPENDS

Each fiscal year, a public or private secondary school may 34 apply to the department for a one hundred fifty dollar per day 35 stipend, not to exceed seven hundred fifty dollars, to pay a 1 teacher at the school for attending an educational workshop 2 designed to enhance the ability of the teacher to incorporate 3 math and science in the daily instruction of students. 4 Sec. 6. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 15.416 RULES.

The board shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 17A 6 necessary for the administration of this part.

Section 262B.22, Code 2007, is repealed. STATEWIDE SUPPLIER CAPACITY AND PRODUCT DATABASE. Sec. 8. The department of economic development shall contract with a 10 third party to create a statewide supplier capacity and 11 product database to assist the department in linking suppliers 12 to Iowa=based advanced manufacturing companies. The 4 13 department shall select the third party through a request for

14 proposals process. Sec. 9. CONTINGENT EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act shall take

16 effect when moneys appropriated to the department of economic 4 17 development are deposited in the targeted industries 4 18 development fund. The department shall notify the Code editor

4 19 regarding the date of the deposit.

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
