A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act to allow therapeutically certified optometrists to
- 2 supply pharmaceutical-delivering contact lenses.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 147.108, subsection 2, Code 2009, is 2 amended to read as follows:
- After contact lenses have been adequately adapted and
- 4 the patient released from initial follow-up care by a person
- 5 licensed under chapter 148 or 154, the patient may request
- 6 a copy, at no cost, of the contact lens prescription from
- 7 that licensed person. A person licensed under chapter 148 or
- 8 154 shall not withhold a contact lens prescription after the
- 9 requirements of this section have been met. The prescription,
- 10 at the option of the prescriber, may be given orally only to a
- 11 person who is actively practicing and licensed under chapter
- 12 148, 154, or 155A. The contact lens prescription shall contain
- 13 an expiration date, at the discretion of the prescriber, but
- 14 not to exceed eighteen months. The contact lens prescription
- 15 shall contain the necessary requirements of the ophthalmic
- 16 lens, and the prescription validation requirements as defined
- 17 by rules adopted pursuant to this section. The prescription
- 18 may contain adapting and material guidelines and may also
- 19 contain specific instructions for use by the patient. For
- 20 the purpose of this section, "ophthalmic lens" means one which
- 21 has been fabricated to fill the requirements of a particular
- 22 contact lens prescription, including pharmaceutical-delivering
- 23 contact lenses as defined in section 154.1, subsection 4.
- 24 Sec. 2. Section 154.1, subsection 4, Code 2009, is amended
- 25 to read as follows:
- 26 4. a. Therapeutically certified optometrists may employ
- 27 all diagnostic and therapeutic pharmaceutical agents for the
- 28 purpose of diagnosis and treatment of conditions of the human
- 29 eye and adnexa pursuant to this subsection, excluding the
- 30 use of injections other than to counteract an anaphylactic
- 31 reaction, and notwithstanding section 147.107, may without
- 32 charge supply any of the above pharmaceuticals to commence a
- 33 course of therapy.
- 34 b. Therapeutically certified optometrists may
- 35 employ and, notwithstanding section 147.107, supply

- 1 pharmaceutical-delivering contact lenses for the purpose
- 2 of treatment of conditions of the human eye and adnexa.
- 3 For purposes of this paragraph, "pharmaceutical-delivering
- 4 contact lenses " means contact lenses that contain one or more
- 5 therapeutic pharmaceutical agents authorized for employment
- 6 by this section for the purpose of treatment of conditions of
- 7 the human eye and adnexa and that deliver such agents into the
- 8 wearer's eye.
- 9 c. Therapeutically certified optometrists may prescribe
- 10 oral steroids for a period not to exceed fourteen days
- 11 without consultation with a physician. Therapeutically
- 12 certified optometrists shall not prescribe oral Imuran or oral
- 13 Methotrexate.
- 14 d. Therapeutically certified optometrists may be authorized,
- 15 where reasonable and appropriate, by rule of the board, to
- 16 employ new diagnostic and therapeutic pharmaceutical agents
- 17 approved by the United States food and drug administration on
- 18 or after July 1, 2002, for the diagnosis and treatment of the
- 19 human eye and adnexa.
- 20 e. The board shall not be required to adopt rules relating
- 21 to topical pharmaceutical agents, oral antimicrobial agents,
- 22 oral antihistamines, oral antiglaucoma agents, and oral
- 23 analgesic agents. Superficial foreign bodies may be removed
- 24 from the human eye and adnexa.
- 25 f. The therapeutic efforts of a therapeutically certified
- 26 optometrist are intended for the purpose of examination,
- 27 diagnosis, and treatment of visual defects, abnormal
- 28 conditions, and diseases of the human eye and adnexa, for
- 29 proper optometric practice or referral for consultation or
- 30 treatment to persons licensed under chapter 148.
- 31 g. A therapeutically certified optometrist is an optometrist
- 32 who is licensed to practice optometry in this state and who
- 33 is certified by the board to use the agents and procedures
- 34 authorized pursuant to this subsection.
