## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to prescription authority for certain
- 2 psychologists and making penalties applicable.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 123.3, subsection 35, Code 2016, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 35. "Pharmacy" means a drug store in which drugs and
- 4 medicines are exposed for sale and sold at retail, or in which
- 5 prescriptions of licensed physicians and surgeons, dentists,
- 6 prescribing psychologists, or veterinarians are compounded and
- 7 sold by a registered pharmacist.
- 8 Sec. 2. Section 124.101, subsection 26, paragraph a, Code
- 9 2016, is amended to read as follows:
- 10 a. A physician, dentist, podiatric physician, prescribing
- 11 psychologist, veterinarian, scientific investigator or
- 12 other person licensed, registered, or otherwise permitted to
- 13 distribute, dispense, conduct research with respect to, or to
- 14 administer a controlled substance in the course of professional
- 15 practice or research in this state.
- 16 Sec. 3. Section 147.107, subsections 1 and 2, Code 2016, are
- 17 amended to read as follows:
- 18 1. A person, other than a pharmacist, physician,
- 19 dentist, podiatric physician, prescribing psychologist, or
- 20 veterinarian who dispenses as an incident to the practice of
- 21 the practitioner's profession, shall not dispense prescription
- 22 drugs or controlled substances.
- 23 2. a. A pharmacist, physician, dentist, or podiatric
- 24 physician, or prescribing psychologist who dispenses
- 25 prescription drugs, including but not limited to controlled
- 26 substances, for human use, may delegate nonjudgmental
- 27 dispensing functions to staff assistants only when verification
- 28 of the accuracy and completeness of the dispensing is
- 29 determined by the pharmacist or practitioner in the
- 30 pharmacist's or practitioner's physical presence. However, the
- 31 physical presence requirement does not apply when a pharmacist
- 32 or practitioner is utilizing an automated dispensing system or
- 33 when a pharmacist is utilizing a tech-check-tech program, as
- 34 defined in section 155A.3. When using an automated dispensing
- 35 system the pharmacist or practitioner shall utilize an

- 1 internal quality control assurance plan that ensures accuracy
- 2 for dispensing. When using a tech-check-tech program the
- 3 pharmacist shall utilize an internal quality control assurance
- 4 plan, in accordance with rules adopted by the board of
- 5 pharmacy, that ensures accuracy for dispensing. Verification
- 6 of automated dispensing and tech-check-tech accuracy and
- 7 completeness remains the responsibility of the pharmacist or
- 8 practitioner and shall be determined in accordance with rules
- 9 adopted by the board of pharmacy, the board of medicine, the
- 10 dental board, and the board of podiatry, and the board of
- ll psychology for their respective licensees.
- 12 b. A dentist, physician, or podiatric physician, or
- 13 prescribing psychologist who dispenses prescription drugs,
- 14 other than drug samples, pursuant to this subsection, shall
- 15 report the fact that they dispense prescription drugs with the
- 16 practitioner's respective board at least biennially.
- 17 c. A physician, dentist, or podiatric physician, or
- 18 prescribing psychologist who dispenses prescription drugs,
- 19 other than drug samples, pursuant to this subsection, shall
- 20 offer to provide the patient with a written prescription that
- 21 may be dispensed from a pharmacy of the patient's choice or
- 22 offer to transmit the prescription orally, electronically, or
- 23 by facsimile in accordance with section 155A.27 to a pharmacy
- 24 of the patient's choice.
- 25 Sec. 4. NEW SECTION. 148.13A Board authority over
- 26 physicians supervising certain psychologists.
- 27 The board of medicine shall, in consultation with the board
- 28 of psychology, establish by rule all of the following:
- 29 1. Specific minimum standards for the appropriate
- 30 supervision of a psychologist prescribing medication pursuant
- 31 to a conditional prescription certificate under chapter 154B.
- 32 Such standards shall include requiring a physician serving
- 33 as a supervising licensed physician to notify the board of
- 34 medicine of the identity of the psychologist the physician is
- 35 supervising and any change in the status of the supervisory

- 1 relationship.
- 2. The process for initiating and conducting disciplinary
- 3 proceedings under chapter 17A if a licensed physician
- 4 fails to adequately supervise a psychologist prescribing
- 5 psychotropic medications pursuant to a prescription certificate
- 6 under chapter 154B. The rule shall take into account the
- 7 deliberations of the board in making such a determination.
- 8 Sec. 5. Section 154B.1, Code 2016, is amended to read as
- 9 follows:
- 10 154B.1 Definition Definitions.
- 11 As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise
- 12 requires:
- 13 1. "Board" means the board of psychology created under
- 14 chapter 147.
- 2. "Collaborative practice agreement" means a written
- 16 agreement between a prescribing psychologist and a licensed
- 17 physician that establishes clinical protocols, practice
- 18 guidelines, and care plans relevant to the scope of the
- 19 collaborative practice. The practice guidelines may include
- 20 limitations on the prescribing of psychotropic medications
- 21 by psychologists and protocols for prescribing to special
- 22 populations including patients who are less than seventeen
- 23 years of age or over sixty-five years of age, patients who
- 24 are pregnant, and patients with serious medical conditions
- 25 including but not limited to heart disease, cancer, stroke,
- 26 seizures, and patients with developmental disabilities and
- 27 intellectual disabilities.
- 28 3. "Collaborative relationship" means a cooperative
- 29 working relationship between a prescribing psychologist or a
- 30 psychologist with a conditional prescription certificate and a
- 31 licensed physician in the provision of patient care, including
- 32 diagnosis and cooperation in the management and delivery of
- 33 physical and mental health care.
- 34 4. "Conditional prescription certificate" means a document
- 35 issued by the board to a licensed psychologist that permits

- 1 the holder to prescribe psychotropic medication under the
- 2 supervision of a licensed physician pursuant to this chapter.
- 3 5. "Practice of psychology" means the application of
- 4 established principles of learning, motivation, perception,
- 5 thinking, and emotional relations to problems of behavior
- 6 adjustment, group relations, and behavior modification,
- 7 by persons trained in psychology for compensation or other
- 8 personal gain. The application of principles includes, but
- 9 is not limited to: Counseling and the use of psychological
- 10 remedial measures with persons, in groups or individually,
- 11 with adjustment or emotional problems in the areas of work,
- 12 family, school, and personal relationships; measuring and
- 13 testing personality, intelligence, aptitudes, public opinion,
- 14 attitudes, and skills; and the teaching of such subject matter,
- 15 and the conducting of research on the problems relating to
- 16 human behavior.
- 17 6. "Prescribing psychologist" means a licensed psychologist
- 18 who holds a valid prescription certificate.
- 19 7. "Prescription certificate" means a document issued by the
- 20 board to a licensed psychologist that permits the holder to
- 21 prescribe psychotropic medication pursuant to this chapter.
- 22 8. "Psychotropic medication" means a controlled substance
- 23 or dangerous drug that shall not be dispensed or administered
- 24 without a prescription and that has been approved by the
- 25 federal food and drug administration for the treatment of
- 26 mental disorders, as defined by the most current diagnostic
- 27 and statistical manual of mental disorders published by the
- 28 American psychiatric association or the most current version
- 29 of the international classification of diseases, and that is
- 30 listed as a psychotherapeutic agent in the American hospital
- 31 formulary service. "Psychotropic medication" does not include
- 32 narcotics.
- 33 Sec. 6. NEW SECTION. 154B.9 Drugs medicine.
- 1. Except as provided in subsections 2 and 3, a psychologist
- 35 shall not administer or prescribe drugs or medicine.

- A licensed psychologist holding a conditional
- 2 prescription certificate may prescribe psychotropic medication
- 3 under the supervision of a licensed physician pursuant to this 4 chapter.
- 5 3. A prescribing psychologist may prescribe psychotropic 6 medication pursuant to this chapter.
- 7 Sec. 7. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **154B.10** Conditional prescription 8 certificate.
- 9 1. An applicant for a conditional prescription certificate 10 shall be granted a certificate by the board if the applicant 11 satisfies all of the following requirements:
- 12 a. Holds a current license to practice psychology in this 13 state.
- 14 b. Completed pharmacological training from an institution15 approved by the board or from a provider of continuing16 education approved by the board.
- 17 c. Passed a national certification examination approved by 18 the board that tested the applicant's knowledge of pharmacology 19 in the diagnosis, care, and treatment of mental disorders.
- 20 d. Within five years immediately preceding the date of21 application, successfully completed a post-doctoral master of
- 22 science degree in clinical psychopharmacology approved by the
- 23 board of psychology. The program shall at a minimum include
- 24 coursework in neuroscience, pharmacology, psychopharmacology,
- 25 physiology, and appropriate and relevant physical and
- 26 laboratory assessments.
- 27 e. Within five years immediately preceding the date of
- 28 application, has been certified by the applicant's supervising
- 29 physician as having successfully completed a supervised and
- 30 relevant clinical experience of no less than an eighty-hour
- 31 practicum in clinical assessment and pathophysiology and an
- 32 additional supervised practicum of at least four hundred
- 33 hours treating no fewer than one hundred patients with mental
- 34 disorders. The practica shall have been supervised by a
- 35 trained physician. The board shall determine whether the

- 1 practica is sufficient to competently train the applicant in
- 2 the treatment of a diverse patient population.
- 3 f. Possesses malpractice insurance that will cover the
- 4 applicant during the period the conditional prescription
- 5 certificate is in effect.
- 6 q. Meets all other requirements, as determined by rules
- 7 adopted by the board, for obtaining a conditional prescription
- 8 certificate.
- 9 2. A conditional prescription certificate is valid for four
- 10 years, at the end of which the holder may apply again pursuant
- 11 to the provisions of subsection 1.
- 12 3. A psychologist with a conditional prescription
- 13 certificate may prescribe psychotropic medication under the
- 14 supervision of a licensed physician subject to all of the
- 15 following conditions:
- 16 a. The psychologist shall continue to hold a current license
- 17 to practice psychology in this state and continue to maintain
- 18 malpractice insurance.
- 19 b. The psychologist shall inform the board of the name of
- 20 the physician under whose supervision the psychologist will
- 21 prescribe psychotropic medication and promptly inform the board
- 22 of any change of the supervising physician.
- 23 c. A physician supervising a psychologist prescribing
- 24 psychotropic medication pursuant to a conditional prescription
- 25 certificate shall be subject to disciplinary action pursuant to
- 26 section 148.13A for the acts and omissions of the psychologist
- 27 while under the physician's supervision. This provision
- 28 does not relieve the psychologist from liability for the
- 29 psychologist's acts and omissions.
- 30 Sec. 8. NEW SECTION. 154B.11 Prescription certificate.
- 31 1. An applicant for a prescription certificate shall be
- 32 granted a certificate by the board if the applicant satisfies
- 33 all of the following requirements:
- 34 a. Possesses a conditional prescription certificate and has
- 35 successfully completed two years of prescribing psychotropic

- 1 medication as certified by the supervising licensed physician.
- 2 An applicant for a prescription certificate who specializes
- 3 in the psychological care of children, elderly persons, or
- 4 persons with comorbid psychological conditions shall complete
- 5 at least one year prescribing psychotropic medications to such
- 6 populations as certified by the supervising licensed physician.
- 7 b. Holds a current license to practice psychology in this 8 state.
- 9 c. Possesses malpractice insurance that will cover the 10 applicant as a prescribing psychologist.
- 11 d. Meets all other requirements, as determined by rules
- 12 adopted by the board, for obtaining a prescription certificate.
- 2. A psychologist with a prescription certificate may
- 14 prescribe psychotropic medication pursuant to the provisions of
- 15 this chapter subject to the following conditions:
- 16 a. The psychologist continues to hold a current license to
- 17 practice psychology in this state and maintains malpractice
- 18 insurance.
- 19 b. The psychologist annually satisfies the continuing
- 20 education requirements for prescribing psychologists, as
- 21 determined by the board, which shall be no fewer than twenty
- 22 hours each year.
- 23 c. The psychologist has entered into a collaborative
- 24 practice agreement with a licensed physician.
- 25 Sec. 9. NEW SECTION. 154B.12 Prescribing practices.
- 26 l. A prescribing psychologist or a psychologist with
- 27 a conditional prescription certificate may administer and
- 28 prescribe psychotropic medication within the scope of the
- 29 psychologist's profession, including the ordering and review of
- 30 laboratory tests in conjunction with the prescription, for the
- 31 treatment of mental disorders.
- 32 2. When prescribing psychotropic medication for a
- 33 patient, the prescribing psychologist or the psychologist
- 34 with a conditional prescription certificate shall maintain
- 35 an ongoing collaborative relationship with the licensed

- 1 physician who oversees the patient's general medical care to
- 2 ensure that necessary medical examinations are conducted,
- 3 the psychotropic medication is appropriate for the patient's
- 4 medical condition, and significant changes in the patient's
- 5 medical or psychological condition are discussed.
- 6 3. A prescription written by a prescribing psychologist or a
- 7 psychologist with a conditional prescription certificate shall
- 8 meet all of the following requirements:
- 9 a. Comply with applicable state and federal laws.
- 10 b. Be identified as issued by the psychologist as
- 11 "psychologist certified to prescribe".
- 12 c. Include the psychologist's board-assigned identification
- 13 number.
- 4. A prescribing psychologist or a psychologist with
- 15 a conditional prescription certificate shall not delegate
- 16 prescriptive authority to any other person. Records of all
- 17 prescriptions shall be maintained in patient records.
- 18 5. When authorized to prescribe controlled substances, a
- 19 prescribing psychologist or a psychologist with a conditional
- 20 prescription certificate shall file with the board in a
- 21 timely manner all individual federal drug enforcement agency
- 22 registration and numbers. The board shall maintain current
- 23 records on every psychologist, including federal registration
- 24 and numbers.
- 25 Sec. 10. NEW SECTION. 154B.13 Board duties regarding
- 26 prescription certificates and conditional prescription
- 27 certificates.
- 28 1. The board shall, in consultation with the board of
- 29 medicine, adopt rules to carry out the provisions of this
- 30 chapter relating to prescribing psychologists. The rules shall
- 31 include but not be limited to all of the following:
- 32 a. Procedures to obtain a conditional prescription
- 33 certificate, a prescription certificate, and a renewal of
- 34 a prescription certificate. The board may set reasonable
- 35 application and renewal fees.

- 1 b. Grounds for the denial, suspension, or revocation of
- 2 a conditional prescription certificate and a prescription
- 3 certificate, including a provision for suspension or revocation
- 4 of a license to practice psychology upon suspension of a
- 5 conditional prescription certificate and a prescription
- 6 certificate.
- 7 c. The provision of an annual list of psychologists with
- 8 prescription certificates and psychologists with conditional
- 9 prescription certificates that contains the information agreed
- 10 to between the board and the board of medicine. The board
- 11 shall promptly notify the board of medicine of psychologists
- 12 who are added to or removed from the list.
- 13 d. Any other rules necessary for the administration of this 14 chapter.
- 15 2. The board shall appoint a prescribing psychologist rules
- 16 subcommittee comprised of a psychologist appointed by the
- 17 board, a physician appointed by the board of medicine, and a
- 18 member of the public appointed by the director of public health
- 19 to develop rules for consideration by the board pursuant to
- 20 this section.
- 21 Sec. 11. Section 155A.3, subsection 35, Code 2016, is
- 22 amended to read as follows:
- 23 35. "Practitioner" means a physician, dentist, podiatric
- 24 physician, prescribing psychologist, veterinarian, or other
- 25 person licensed or registered to distribute or dispense a
- 26 prescription drug or device in the course of professional
- 27 practice in this state or a person licensed by another state
- 28 in a health field in which, under Iowa law, licensees in this
- 29 state may legally prescribe drugs.
- 30 Sec. 12. Section 155A.23, subsection 1, paragraph c, Code
- 31 2016, is amended to read as follows:
- 32 c. For the purpose of obtaining a prescription drug or
- 33 device, falsely assuming the title of or claiming to be
- 34 a manufacturer, wholesaler, pharmacist, pharmacy owner,
- 35 physician, dentist, podiatric physician, prescribing

- 1 psychologist, veterinarian, or other authorized person.
- 2 Sec. 13. Section 155A.24, subsection 14, Code 2016, is
- 3 amended to read as follows:
- 4 14. This section does not prevent a licensed practitioner of
- 5 medicine, dentistry, podiatry, nursing, psychology, veterinary
- 6 medicine, optometry, or pharmacy from acts necessary in the
- 7 ethical and legal performance of the practitioner's profession.
