A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act creating a future ready Iowa Act to strengthen workforce
- 2 development by establishing a registered apprenticeship
- development program, a volunteer mentoring program, a summer
- 4 youth intern program, summer postsecondary courses for high
- 5 school students that are aligned with high-demand career
- 6 pathways, an employer innovation fund, and future ready Iowa
- 7 skilled workforce scholarship and grant programs and funds,
- 8 and including effective date provisions.
- 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 DIVISION I
- 2 TITLE OF ACT
- 3 Section 1. TITLE OF ACT. This Act shall be known and may be
- 4 cited as the "Future Ready Iowa Act".
- 5 DIVISION II
- 6 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY FUTURE READY IOWA REGISTERED
- 7 APPRENTICESHIP DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM
- 8 Sec. 2. Section 15.106A, subsection 2, paragraph a, Code
- 9 2018, is amended to read as follows:
- 10 a. That through this section and section 15.106B, the
- 11 authority has been granted broad general powers and specific
- 12 program powers over all of the authority's statutory programs,
- 13 including but not limited to the programs created pursuant to
- 14 chapters 15, 15A, 15B, 15C, 15E, and 15J.
- 15 Sec. 3. Section 15B.4, Code 2018, is amended by adding the
- 16 following new subsection:
- 17 NEW SUBSECTION. 5. An apprenticeship sponsor receiving
- 18 financial assistance under this chapter is ineligible for
- 19 financial assistance under section 15C.1 during the same fiscal
- 20 year.
- 21 Sec. 4. NEW SECTION. 15C.1 Future ready Iowa registered
- 22 apprenticeship development program.
- 23 l. Definitions. For purposes of this section, unless the
- 24 context otherwise requires:
- 25 a. "Applicant" means a new or existing apprenticeship
- 26 sponsor located in Iowa that has established an apprenticeship
- 27 program involving an eligible apprenticeable occupation that is
- 28 located in Iowa and approved by the United States department of
- 29 labor, office of apprenticeship.
- 30 b. "Apprentice" means a person who is at least sixteen
- 31 years of age, except where a higher minimum age is required by
- 32 law, who is employed in an apprenticeable occupation, and is
- 33 registered in Iowa with the United States department of labor,
- 34 office of apprenticeship.
- 35 c. "Apprenticeable occupation" means an occupation approved

- 1 for apprenticeship by the United States department of labor,
- 2 office of apprenticeship.
- 3 d. "Apprenticeship program" means a program registered
- 4 with the United States department of labor, office of
- 5 apprenticeship, which includes terms and conditions for the
- 6 qualification, recruitment, selection, employment, and training
- 7 of apprentices, including the requirement for a written
- 8 apprenticeship agreement.
- 9 e. "Apprenticeship sponsor" means an entity operating
- 10 an apprenticeship program or an entity in whose name an
- 11 apprenticeship program is being operated, which is registered
- 12 with or approved by the United States department of labor,
- 13 office of apprenticeship.
- 14 f. "Authority" means the economic development authority
- 15 created in section 15.105.
- 16 g. "Eligible apprenticeable occupation" means an
- 17 apprenticeable occupation identified by the workforce
- 18 development board or a community college pursuant to
- 19 section 84A.1B, subsection 13A, as a high-demand job, after
- 20 consultation with the authority.
- 21 h. "Financial assistance" means assistance provided only
- 22 from the funds, rights, and assets legally available to the
- 23 authority and includes but is not limited to assistance in the
- 24 form of a reimbursement grant to support the costs associated
- 25 with establishing a new eligible apprenticeable occupation
- 26 or an additional eligible apprenticeable occupation in an
- 27 applicant's apprenticeship program.
- 28 2. Program created. Subject to an appropriation of funds
- 29 by the general assembly for this purpose, a future ready Iowa
- 30 registered apprenticeship development program is created which
- 31 shall be administered by the authority. The purpose of the
- 32 program is to provide financial assistance to incentivize
- 33 small and medium-sized apprenticeship sponsors to establish
- 34 new or additional eligible apprenticeable occupations in the
- 35 apprenticeship sponsor's apprenticeship program in order to

- 1 support the growth of apprenticeship programs and expand
- 2 high-quality work-based learning experiences in high-demand
- 3 fields and careers for persons who are employed in eligible
- 4 apprenticeable occupations in Iowa.
- 5 3. Application requirements restriction. An
- 6 apprenticeship sponsor may apply to the authority, on
- 7 forms provided by the authority and in accordance with the
- 8 authority's instructions, to receive financial assistance under
- 9 the program. The authority shall provide upon request and on
- 10 the authority's internet site information about the program,
- 11 the application, application instructions, and the application
- 12 period established each year for funding available under the
- 13 program. The application shall include a description of how
- 14 the financial assistance awarded under this section would be
- 15 used to establish an apprenticeship program or add new or
- 16 additional apprenticeable occupations to the apprenticeship
- 17 sponsor's apprenticeship program and the anticipated program
- 18 expenses identified by the applicant.
- 19 a. An apprenticeship sponsor is eligible to apply for
- 20 financial assistance for a new or additional eligible
- 21 apprenticeable occupation, in addition to existing
- 22 apprenticeship occupations in the apprenticeship sponsor's
- 23 apprenticeship program, if all of the following conditions are
- 24 met:
- 25 (1) Twenty or fewer apprentices are registered in the
- 26 existing apprenticeship program as of December 31 of the
- 27 calendar year prior to the date the authority receives the
- 28 apprenticeship sponsor's application.
- 29 (2) More than seventy percent of the applicant's
- 30 apprentices shall be residents of Iowa, and the remainder
- 31 of the applicant's apprentices shall be residents of states
- 32 contiguous to Iowa. In determining the number of apprentices
- 33 in an applicant's apprenticeship program, the authority may
- 34 calculate the average number of apprentices in the program
- 35 within the most recent two-year period.

- 1 b. An apprenticeship sponsor receiving financial assistance
- 2 under chapter 15B is ineligible for financial assistance under
- 3 this section during the same fiscal year.
- 4 4. Rules. The authority shall adopt rules pursuant to
- 5 chapter 17A establishing a staff review and application
- 6 approval process, application scoring criteria, the minimum
- 7 score necessary for approval of financial assistance,
- 8 procedures for notification of an award of financial
- 9 assistance, the terms of agreement between the apprenticeship
- 10 sponsor and the authority, and any other rules deemed necessary
- 11 for the implementation and administration of this section.
- 12 5. Agreement. Prior to distributing financial assistance
- 13 under this section, the authority shall enter into an agreement
- 14 with the apprenticeship sponsor awarded financial assistance
- 15 in accordance with this section, and the financial assistance
- 16 recipient shall confirm the expenses for establishing the
- 17 program or adding the additional occupations as identified in
- 18 the approved application, and shall meet all terms established
- 19 by the authority for receipt of financial assistance under this
- 20 section.
- 21 6. Use of moneys appropriated administration.
- 22 a. The annual administrative expenditures as a percent of
- 23 the moneys appropriated for a fiscal year for purposes of this
- 24 section shall not exceed two percent.
- 25 b. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated to
- 26 the authority by the general assembly for purposes of this
- 27 section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the end of
- 28 the fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund but shall
- 29 remain available for expenditure for the purposes designated in
- 30 subsequent fiscal years.
- 31 DIVISION III
- 32 FUTURE READY IOWA VARIOUS PROGRAMS
- 33 Sec. 5. Section 15H.1A, Code 2018, is amended by adding the
- 34 following new subsection:
- 35 NEW SUBSECTION. 1A. "Commission" means the Iowa commission

1 on volunteer service created in section 15H.2.

- 2 Sec. 6. NEW SECTION. 15H.9 Volunteer mentor program.
- 3 1. Subject to an appropriation of funds by the general
- 4 assembly for this purpose, the commission shall establish a
- 5 volunteer mentor program to support implementation of the
- 6 future ready Iowa skilled workforce last-dollar scholarship
- 7 and the future ready Iowa skilled workforce grant programs
- 8 created in sections 261.131 and 261.132. The commission, in
- 9 collaboration with the department of workforce development and
- 10 the college student aid commission, shall adopt rules pursuant
- 11 to chapter 17A to implement and administer the volunteer
- 12 mentor program, and shall establish standards, guidelines, and
- 13 expectations for a productive and appropriate relationship
- 14 between mentors and mentees, including helping students
- 15 meet the future ready Iowa skilled workforce last-dollar
- 16 scholarship program or future ready Iowa skilled workforce
- 17 grant requirements, as appropriate; identify work-based
- 18 learning opportunities; and make career-related connections
- 19 that are advantageous to persons participating in the volunteer
- 20 mentor program.
- 21 2. The prospective volunteer mentor shall have successfully
- 22 passed a background investigation conducted by the division of
- 23 criminal investigation of the department of public safety and a
- 24 check of the national sex offender registry.
- 25 3. The commission shall enter into written agreements with
- 26 prospective mentors and mentees under the program. Under such
- 27 an agreement, prospective mentors and mentees agree to abide by
- 28 the standards, guidelines, and expectations established by the
- 29 commission pursuant to subsection 1.
- 30 4. The commission, in collaboration with the department of
- 31 workforce development and the college student aid commission,
- 32 and in cooperation with an eligible institution as defined
- 33 in section 261.131 or 261.132, as appropriate, shall assign
- 34 a student, who is a recipient of a future ready Iowa skilled
- 35 workforce last-dollar scholarship under section 261.131 or

- 1 a future ready Iowa skilled workforce grant under section
- 2 261.132, who requests the assignment of a mentor, and who
- 3 enters into an agreement under subsection 3, to a mentor
- 4 appropriate to the prospective mentee's field of study whenever
- 5 possible.
- 5. The commission shall maintain, and regularly update,
- 7 a list of the mentor and mentee pairings and the dates of
- 8 inception of the mentor and mentee pairings.
- 9 6. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated to the
- 10 economic development authority for allocation to the commission
- 11 for purposes of this section that remain unencumbered or
- 12 unobligated at the close of a fiscal year shall not revert but
- 13 shall remain available to be used for the purposes designated
- 14 in this section until the close of the succeeding fiscal year.
- 15 Sec. 7. Section 84A.1B, Code 2018, is amended by adding the
- 16 following new subsections:
- 17 NEW SUBSECTION. 13A. Create, and update as necessary, a
- 18 list of high-demand jobs statewide for purposes of the future
- 19 ready Iowa registered apprenticeship development program
- 20 created in section 15C.1, the summer youth intern pilot
- 21 program established under section 84A.12, the Iowa employer
- 22 innovation program established under section 84A.13, the
- 23 future ready Iowa skilled workforce last-dollar scholarship
- 24 program established under section 261.131, the future ready
- 25 Iowa skilled workforce grant program established under section
- 26 261.132, and postsecondary summer classes for high school
- 27 students as provided under section 261E.8, subsection 7A. In
- 28 addition to the list created by the workforce development
- 29 board under this subsection, each community college, in
- 30 consultation with regional career and technical education
- 31 planning partnerships, and with the approval of the board of
- 32 directors of the community college, may identify and maintain
- 33 a list of not more than five regional high-demand jobs in the
- 34 community college region, and shall share the lists with the
- 35 workforce development board. The lists submitted by community

- 1 colleges under the subsection may be used in that community
- 2 college region for purposes of programs identified under this
- 3 subsection. The workforce development board shall have full
- 4 discretion to select and prioritize statewide high-demand jobs
- 5 after consulting with business and education stakeholders,
- 6 as appropriate, and seeking public comment. For purposes of
- 7 this subsection, "high-demand job" means a job in the state for
- 8 which the board, or a community college in accordance with this
- 9 subsection, determines work opportunities are available and
- 10 qualified applicants are lacking.
- 11 NEW SUBSECTION. 13B. Compile an annual report, in an
- 12 aggregate form to protect the confidentiality of each eligible
- 13 program's participants, that includes the number of students
- 14 receiving scholarships under section 261.131, the number of
- 15 students receiving grants under section 261.132, the number
- 16 of scholarship and grant recipients completing a program
- 17 of study or major annually and in the prescribed timeframe
- 18 under sections 261.131 and 261.132, the number of eligible
- 19 institutions participating in the scholarship and grant
- 20 programs established under sections 261.131 and 261.132, the
- 21 number of written agreements entered into by the volunteer
- 22 mentor program under section 15H.9, statistics on employment
- 23 outcomes for future ready Iowa skilled workforce last-dollar
- 24 scholarship and future ready Iowa skilled workforce grant
- 25 program participants by industry, and other data as may be
- 26 deemed pertinent by the department or the college student aid
- 27 commission. The department shall submit the initial report by
- 28 January 15, 2021, and by January 15 annually thereafter, to the
- 29 governor and the general assembly.
- 30 Sec. 8. Section 84A.5, subsection 7, Code 2018, is amended
- 31 by adding the following new paragraph:
- 32 NEW PARAGRAPH. Od. The Iowa employer innovation program
- 33 established under section 84A.13.
- 34 Sec. 9. Section 84A.6, subsection 4, Code 2018, is amended
- 35 by striking the subsection.

- 1 Sec. 10. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **84A.12** Summer youth intern pilot 2 program.
- 3 1. A summer youth intern pilot program is established
- 4 within the department of workforce development to provide
- 5 youths who are at risk of not graduating from high school,
- 6 who are from low-income households, who are from communities
- 7 underrepresented in the Iowa workforce, or who otherwise face
- 8 barriers to success and upward mobility in the labor market,
- 9 with internship opportunities that allow these youths to
- 10 explore and prepare for high-demand careers, to gain work
- 11 experience, and to develop personal attributes necessary to
- 12 succeed in the workplace.
- 2. Subject to an appropriation of funds by the general
- 14 assembly for this purpose, the department of workforce
- 15 development shall award grants for summer youth intern
- 16 pilot projects on a competitive basis as provided in this
- 17 section. The department shall work with employers, nonprofit
- 18 organizations, and educational institutions to place youth in
- 19 internships primarily in high-demand career fields.
- 20 3. The department of workforce development shall annually
- 21 issue a request for proposals to the public, specifying the
- 22 expectations and requirements for summer youth intern pilot
- 23 project grant qualification, including but not limited to the
- 24 provision of facilities, programming, staffing, and outcomes.
- 25 4. The department of workforce development shall give
- 26 full and fair consideration to each proposal submitted under
- 27 subsection 3, and shall award grants after considering, at a
- 28 minimum, the following:
- 29 a. The bidder's history and experience in the community.
- 30 b. The capacity to serve a substantial number of youth.
- 31 c. The suitability of the available facilities.
- 32 d. The bidder's contacts and partnerships in the community
- 33 that can be leveraged to maximize opportunity for project
- 34 participants.
- 35 e. The capacity to provide employability skills, including

- 1 but not limited to training relating to soft skills, financial
- 2 literacy, and career development.
- 3 Sec. 11. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **84A.13** Iowa employer innovation
- 4 program fund.
- 5 l. For purposes of this section, "high-demand job" means
- 6 a job identified by the workforce development board or a
- 7 community college pursuant to section 84A.1B, subsection 13A,
- 8 as a high-demand job.
- 9 2. Subject to an appropriation of funds by the general
- 10 assembly for this purpose, the Iowa employer innovation program
- 11 is established in the department of workforce development.
- 12 The department shall administer the program in consultation
- 13 with the workforce development board. The purpose of the
- 14 Iowa employer innovation program is to expand opportunities
- 15 for credit and noncredit education and training leading to
- 16 high-demand jobs for the residents of Iowa and to encourage
- 17 Iowa employers, community leaders, and others to provide
- 18 leadership and support for regional workforce talent pools
- 19 throughout the state.
- 3. The department of workforce development shall adopt
- 21 rules under chapter 17A establishing a program application and
- 22 award process to match employer moneys and the criteria for
- 23 the allocation of moneys in the fund established pursuant to
- 24 subsection 4. An employer, employer consortium, community
- 25 organization, or other entity seeking matching moneys shall
- 26 submit an application and a proposal to the department. In
- 27 awarding matching moneys, the department shall take into
- 28 account various factors, including but not limited to all of
- 29 the following:
- 30 a. The range of high-demand jobs, innovative measures, and
- 31 geographic fairness and equity included in the proposal.
- 32 b. Whether the proposal increases the number of eligible
- 33 students receiving financial assistance under the future ready
- 34 Iowa skilled workforce last-dollar scholarship or future
- 35 ready Iowa skilled workforce grant programs established under

- 1 sections 261.131 and 261.132; or increases the donation of
- 2 books, transportation, child care, and other wrap-around
- 3 support to assist eligible students receiving financial
- 4 assistance under section 261.131 or 261.132.
- c. Whether the proposal includes performance-based
- 6 bonuses paid when high school students earn national
- 7 industry-recognized credentials aligned with high-demand jobs
- 8 that meet regional workforce needs.
- 9 d. Whether the proposal expands internships leading to
- 10 high-demand jobs.
- 11 e. Whether the proposal offers innovative ways of expanding
- 12 opportunities for credit and noncredit education and training
- 13 leading to high-demand jobs.
- 14 f. Whether the proposal addresses areas of workforce need
- 15 throughout the region.
- 16 4. An Iowa employer innovation fund is created in the
- 17 state treasury as a separate fund under the control of the
- 18 department of workforce development, in consultation with the
- 19 workforce development board. The fund shall consist of any
- 20 moneys appropriated by the general assembly and any other
- 21 moneys available to and obtained or accepted by the department
- 22 from the federal government. The assets of the fund shall be
- 23 used by the department only for purposes of this section. All
- 24 moneys deposited or paid into the fund are appropriated and
- 25 made available to the board to be used for purposes of this
- 26 section. Notwithstanding section 8.33, any balance in the fund
- 27 on June 30 of each fiscal year shall not revert to the general
- 28 fund of the state, but shall be available for purposes of this
- 29 section in subsequent fiscal years.
- 30 Sec. 12. NEW SECTION. 261.131 Future ready Iowa skilled
- 31 workforce last-dollar scholarship program.
- 32 l. Definitions. As used in this section, unless the context
- 33 otherwise requires:
- 34 a. "Commission" means the college student aid commission.
- 35 b. "Credential" means a postsecondary certificate, diploma,

- 1 or degree, conferring no more than an associate degree, awarded
- 2 by an eligible institution and earned in a program of study
- 3 that leads to a high-demand job and is authorized for federal
- 4 student aid under Tit. IV of the federal Higher Education Act
- 5 of 1965, as amended.
- 6 c. "Eligible institution" means a community college as
- 7 defined in section 260C.2 or an accredited private institution
- 8 as defined in section 261.9, that meets all of the following
- 9 criteria:
- 10 (1) Applies to and is approved by the commission to
- ll participate in the future ready Iowa skilled workforce
- 12 last-dollar scholarship program.
- 13 (2) Requires eligible students to complete and file
- 14 application forms required by the commission, apply for
- 15 all available state and federal financial aid, apply to the
- 16 eligible institution to participate in the program, attend
- 17 orientation in person or virtually, register for classes
- 18 with the assistance of an academic advisor, and participate
- 19 in academic and career advising sessions offered under the
- 20 program.
- 21 (3) Facilitates, in collaboration with the commission on
- 22 volunteer service created in section 15H.2, the assignment
- 23 of a volunteer mentor to each eligible student, based on the
- 24 eligible student's interest. The volunteer mentor shall have
- 25 successfully passed a background investigation and a check of
- 26 the national sex offender registry as required under section
- 27 15H.9, subsection 2, and both the eligible student and the
- 28 volunteer mentor shall have entered into a written agreement as
- 29 provided in section 15H.9, subsection 3.
- 30 (4) Facilitates connections through campus career centers
- 31 and services to internships and similar local, state, and
- 32 federal programs.
- 33 (5) Markets the eligible institution's future ready Iowa
- 34 program of study and optional incentives, which may include
- 35 but not be limited to credit for military experience, on the

- 1 eligible institution's internet site and to other relevant
- 2 agencies and organizations as recommended by the college
- 3 student aid commission, the commission on volunteer service, or
- 4 the department of workforce development.
- 5 (6) Submits annually information and data regarding the
- 6 eligible program operated by the eligible institution, the
- 7 students and volunteer mentors participating in the eligible
- 8 program, scholarship recipient eligible program completion
- 9 results, and statistics on employment outcomes for eligible
- 10 program participants by industry, to the commission in the
- 11 manner required by the commission.
- 12 d. "Eligible program" means a program of study or an
- 13 academic major jointly approved by the commission and the
- 14 department of workforce development, in consultation with an
- 15 eligible institution, that leads to a credential aligned with a
- 16 high-demand job designated by the workforce development board
- 17 or community college pursuant to section 84A.1B, subsection
- 18 13A. If the board or a community college removes a high-demand
- 19 job from a list created under section 84A.1B, subsection 13A,
- 20 an eligible student who received a scholarship for a program
- 21 based on that high-demand job shall continue to receive the
- 22 scholarship until achieving a postsecondary credential, up to
- 23 an associate degree, as long as the student continues to meet
- 24 all other eligibility requirements.
- 25 e. "Eligible student" means an Iowa resident who meets all
- 26 of the following requirements:
- 27 (1) Is either a new graduate of an Iowa high school who
- 28 enrolls full-time in an eligible program at an eligible
- 29 institution by the fall semester, or the equivalent,
- 30 following graduation from high school or completion of private
- 31 instruction under chapter 299A; or is an adult learner who has
- 32 received a high school diploma or a high school equivalency
- 33 diploma, who enrolls in an eligible program in an eligible
- 34 institution as a full-time or part-time student.
- 35 (2) Completes and submits application forms required by the

- 1 commission, including the free application for federal student
- 2 aid; applies for all available state and federal financial
- 3 aid; attends orientation in person or virtually; registers
- 4 for classes with the assistance of an academic advisor;
- 5 and participates in academic and career advising sessions
- 6 required under the eligible program. To receive a renewal of
- 7 a scholarship awarded under this section, an eligible student
- 8 must annually submit a new application to the commission for
- 9 reevaluation of eligibility.
- 10 (3) Is making satisfactory academic progress as defined by 11 the eligible institution.
- 12 (4) Remains continuously enrolled unless granted a leave of
- 13 absence by the eligible institution based on criteria adopted
- 14 by rule by the commission.
- 15 f. "Full-time" means enrollment in at least twelve semester
- 16 hours or the equivalent.
- 17 g. "Part-time" means enrollment in at least six but less
- 18 than twelve semester hours or the equivalent.
- 19 2. Allowable activities. An eligible student may work
- 20 with an assigned volunteer mentor to help the student meet the
- 21 requirements of this section or the requirements of an eligible
- 22 program, identify and participate in work-based learning
- 23 opportunities with the approval of the eligible institution,
- 24 and make other career-related connections.
- 25 3. Scholarship limitations requirements.
- 26 a. For an eligible student who is attending an eligible
- 27 institution that is a community college during the fall,
- 28 spring, or summer term of enrollment, and is pursuing a
- 29 postsecondary credential up to an associate degree, the annual
- 30 amount of a future ready Iowa skilled workforce last-dollar
- 31 scholarship, when combined with other state and federal
- 32 nonrepayable student aid, shall not exceed an amount equivalent
- 33 to the tuition and any mandatory institution-wide fees charged
- 34 by the community college for the eligible program. For an
- 35 eligible student pursuing a postsecondary credential up to

- l an associate degree at an eligible institution that is an
- 2 accredited private institution during the fall, spring, or
- 3 summer term of enrollment, the annual amount of a future ready
- 4 Iowa skilled workforce last-dollar scholarship, when combined
- 5 with other state and federal nonrepayable student aid, shall
- 6 not exceed an amount equivalent to the average tuition rate
- 7 plus the average institution-wide mandatory fees charged during
- 8 the same term of enrollment by the eligible institutions that
- 9 are community colleges.
- 10 b. If an eligible student receives nonrepayable financial
- 11 aid under any other state or federal program, the full amount
- 12 of that aid shall be considered part of the student's available
- 13 financial resources before determining the amount of the
- 14 student's future ready Iowa skilled workforce last-dollar
- 15 scholarship for the same period during which the student
- 16 receives other state or federal financial aid. However, each
- 17 eligible student enrolled full-time in an eligible program
- 18 shall receive at least five hundred dollars annually, and the
