A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to and making appropriations to state
2 departments and agencies from the rebuild Iowa
3 infrastructure fund, the state bond repayment fund, the
4 technology reinvestment fund, and the revenue bonds capitals
5 fund, providing for related matters, and including effective
6 date provisions.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

DIVISION I

REBUILD IOWA INFRASTRUCTURE FUND

Section 1. REBUILD IOWA INFRASTRUCTURE FUND —

4 APPROPRIATIONS. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
5 infrastructure fund to the following departments and agencies
6 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June
7 30, 2018, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is
8 necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

9 1. DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES

10 For major maintenance projects:

11 \$ 11,510,000

12 Of the moneys appropriated in this subsection, \$2,000,000
13 is allocated for the cost to modernize, upgrade, or replace
14 elevator systems in facilities on the state capitol complex.
15 The department shall give priority for projects modernizing
16 elevator systems wherever possible.

17 2. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND LAND STEWARDSHIP

18 a. (1) For deposit in the water quality initiative fund
19 created in section 466B.45 for purposes of supporting the
20 water quality initiative administered by the division of soil
21 conservation and water quality as provided in section 466B.42,
22 including salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous
23 purposes, notwithstanding section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph
24 "c":

25 \$ 5,200,000

26 (2) (a) The moneys appropriated in this lettered
27 paragraph shall be used to support demonstration projects in
28 subwatersheds as designated by the department that are part
29 of high-priority watersheds identified by the water resources
30 coordinating council.

31 (b) The moneys appropriated in this lettered paragraph
32 shall be used to support demonstration projects in watersheds
33 generally, including regional watersheds, as designated by the
34 division and high-priority watersheds identified by the water
35 resources coordinating council.

1 (3) In supporting projects in watersheds and subwatersheds
2 as provided in subparagraph (2), subparagraph divisions (a) and
3 (b), all of the following shall apply:

4 (a) The demonstration projects shall utilize water quality
5 practices as described in the latest revision of the document
6 entitled "Iowa Nutrient Reduction Strategy" initially presented
7 in November 2012 by the department of agriculture and land
8 stewardship, the department of natural resources, and Iowa
9 state university of science and technology.

10 (b) The division shall implement demonstration projects
11 as provided in subparagraph division (a) by providing
12 for participation by persons who hold a legal interest in
13 agricultural land used in farming. To every extent practical,
14 the division shall provide for collaborative participation by
15 such persons who hold a legal interest in agricultural land
16 located within the same subwatershed.

17 (c) The division shall implement demonstration projects on
18 a cost-share basis as determined by the division. However,
19 the state's share of the amount, except for edge-of-field
20 practices, shall not exceed 50 percent of the estimated cost
21 of establishing the practice as determined by the division or
22 50 percent of the actual cost of establishing the practice,
23 whichever is less.

24 (d) The demonstration projects shall be used to educate
25 other persons about the feasibility and value of establishing
26 similar water quality practices. The division shall promote
27 field day events for purposes of allowing interested persons to
28 establish water quality practices on their agricultural land.

29 (e) The division shall conduct water quality evaluations
30 within supported subwatersheds. Within a reasonable period
31 after accumulating information from such evaluations, the
32 division shall create an aggregated database of water quality
33 practices. Any information identifying a person holding a
34 legal interest in agricultural land or specific agricultural
35 land shall be a confidential record.

1 (4) The moneys appropriated in this lettered paragraph
2 shall be used to support education and outreach in a manner
3 that encourages persons who hold a legal interest in
4 agricultural land used for farming to implement water quality
5 practices, including the establishment of such practices in
6 watersheds generally, and not limited to subwatersheds or
7 high-priority watersheds.

8 (5) The moneys appropriated in this lettered paragraph
9 may be used to contract with persons to coordinate the
10 implementation of efforts provided in this paragraph.

11 (6) The moneys appropriated in this lettered paragraph
12 may be used by the department to support urban soil and water
13 conservation efforts, which may include but are not limited
14 to management practices related to bioretention, landscaping,
15 the use of permeable or pervious pavement, and soil quality
16 restoration. The moneys shall be allocated on a cost-share
17 basis as provided in chapter 161A.

18 (7) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the
19 contrary, the department may use moneys appropriated in
20 this lettered paragraph to carry out the provisions of this
21 paragraph on a cost-share basis in combination with other
22 moneys available to the department from a state or federal
23 source.

24 (8) Not more than 10 percent of the moneys appropriated in
25 this lettered paragraph may be used for costs of administration
26 and implementation of the water quality initiative administered
27 by the soil conservation division.

28 b. For deposit in the agricultural drainage well water
29 quality assistance fund created in section 460.303 for
30 purposes of supporting the agricultural drainage well water
31 quality assistance program as provided in section 460.304,
32 notwithstanding section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph "c":
33 \$ 1,875,000

34 Not more than 10 percent of the moneys appropriated in this
35 lettered paragraph may be used for costs of administration and

1 implementation of soil conservation practices.
2 c. For deposit in the renewable fuels infrastructure fund
3 created in section 159A.16 for renewable fuel infrastructure
4 programs:
5 \$ 3,000,000
6 3. DEPARTMENT FOR THE BLIND
7 For elevator improvements:
8 \$ 150,000
9 4. DEPARTMENT OF CULTURAL AFFAIRS
10 a. For deposit in the Iowa great places program fund created
11 in section 303.3D for Iowa great places program projects that
12 meet the definition of "vertical infrastructure" in section
13 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph "c":

15 b. For costs associated with maintenance projects for the
16 state historical building:

31 15E.321, notwithstanding section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph

6 The authority shall establish a plan for the repayment of
7 moneys appropriated pursuant to this paragraph once federal
8 moneys for the project have been received. The authority shall
9 submit a report to the general assembly by February 1, 2018,
10 on the status of any federal moneys being appropriated for the
11 project.

12 e. For the renovation, expansion, and enhancements
13 to a swimming pool at a year-round camp for persons with
14 disabilities that is located in a city with a population of
15 more than 200,000 as determined by the 2010 federal decennial
16 census:

19 in a city with a population between 75,000 and 85,000 as

29 APPROPRIATIONS. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
30 infrastructure fund to the economic development authority for
31 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018, and ending June 30,
32 2019, the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary,
33 to be used for the purposes designated:

34 For connection of communities to the Lewis and Clark
35 regional water systems:

1 \$ 4,750,000

2 The authority shall establish a plan for the repayment of
3 moneys appropriated pursuant to this paragraph once federal
4 moneys for the project have been received. The authority shall
5 submit a report to the general assembly by February 1, 2019,
6 on the status of any federal moneys being appropriated for the
7 project.

8 Sec. 3. REVERSION. For purposes of section 8.33, unless
9 specifically provided otherwise, unencumbered or unobligated
10 moneys made from an appropriation in this division of this Act
11 shall not revert but shall remain available for expenditure for
12 the purposes designated until the close of the fiscal year that
13 ends three years after the end of the fiscal year for which the
14 appropriation is made. However, if the project or projects for
15 which such appropriation was made are completed in an earlier
16 fiscal year, unencumbered or unobligated moneys shall revert at
17 the close of that same fiscal year.

21 acquisition and construction; major renovation and major repair
22 of buildings; routine, recurring maintenance; all appurtenant
23 structures; utilities; site development; recreational trails;
24 renewable fuel infrastructure programs; and debt service
25 payments on academic revenue bonds issued in accordance
26 with [chapter 262A](#) for capital projects at board of regents
27 institutions. "*Vertical infrastructure*" does not include
28 operational expenses or leasing of a building, appurtenant
29 structure, or utility without a lease-purchase agreement.

14 administrative services shall conduct an inventory and study
15 of vacant buildings owned by the state. The study shall
16 include an assessment as to how much revenue could be realized
17 by the sale of any buildings identified. If during the
18 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017, the department sells any
19 vacant buildings identified by the study, fifty percent of
20 any moneys realized from the sale of any vacant buildings are
21 appropriated to the department of administrative services for
22 major maintenance projects and fifty percent are appropriated
23 to the department of cultural affairs for costs associated with
24 maintenance projects for the state historical building.
