A BILL FOR

1 An Act providing for a dyslexia response task force and report. 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA: 1 Section 1. DYSLEXIA RESPONSE TASK FORCE AND REPORT.

2 1. The department of education shall establish a dyslexia
 3 task force. The task force shall consist of the following
 4 members:

5 a. The director of the department of education or the 6 director's designee.

7 b. A representative of the Iowa reading research center.

8 c. A representative of an area education agency.

9 d. One school administrator.

10 e. One reading specialist.

11 f. One special education teacher.

12 g. Two representatives of decoding dyslexia who are parents 13 of children with dyslexia.

14 h. One representative of decoding dyslexia who is an 15 individual with dyslexia.

16 i. One provider certified in a structured literacy reading
17 program.

j. One psychologist or speech language pathologist licensed
in the state of Iowa with experience in diagnosing dyslexia.
2. The director of the department of education or the
21 director's designee shall convene the task force. The
22 department of education shall provide staffing services for the

23 task force.

24 3. The task force shall submit a report regarding its 25 findings and recommendations relating to dyslexia response 26 to the governor and the general assembly no later than 27 November 15, 2019. When making such recommendations, the 28 task force shall consider but not be limited to student 29 screening, interventions, teacher preparation and professional 30 development, classroom accommodations, and assistive 31 technology. The report shall include all of the following: An overview of the symptoms and effects of dyslexia. 32 a. 33 b. An overview of current practices relating to dyslexia 34 response in Iowa schools.

35 c. A description of current concerns relating to dyslexia

institutions of higher education.
