**A BILL FOR**

1 An Act relating to and making appropriations and related  
2 statutory changes involving certain state departments,  
3 agencies, funds, and certain other entities, providing for  
4 regulatory authority, and other properly related matters.  
5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

DIVISION I  
FY 2019-2020

Section 1. DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES.

1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the department of administrative services for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

a. For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes, and for not more than the following full-time equivalent positions:

b. For the payment of utility costs, and for not more than the following full-time equivalent positions:

.....	\$	3,524,611
.....	FTEs	1.00

Notwithstanding section 8.33, any excess moneys appropriated for utility costs in this lettered paragraph shall not revert to the general fund of the state at the end of the fiscal year but shall remain available for expenditure for the purposes of this lettered paragraph during the succeeding fiscal year.

c. For Terrace Hill operations, and for not more than the following full-time equivalent positions:

.....	\$	418,200
.....	FTEs	5.07

2. Any moneys and premiums collected by the department for workers' compensation shall be segregated into a separate workers' compensation fund in the state treasury to be used for payment of state employees' workers' compensation claims and administrative costs. Notwithstanding section 8.33, unencumbered or unobligated moneys remaining in this workers' compensation fund at the end of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall be available for expenditure for purposes of the fund for subsequent fiscal years.

1 3. The department shall conduct a study regarding the  
2 feasibility, timeline, and costs of developing and maintaining  
3 a searchable database available on the department's internet  
4 site containing a listing, updated annually, of real property  
5 owned or leased by the state. Real property listed in the  
6 searchable database shall be listed by location and searchable  
7 by county, address, and any other method deemed beneficial  
8 to the public. If real property listed in the searchable  
9 database is leased by the state, the searchable database shall  
10 also include the rental or lease costs of such real property.  
11 The department shall submit its findings and recommendations  
12 in a report to the general assembly and to the chairpersons  
13 and ranking members of the senate and house committees on  
14 appropriations by December 31, 2019.

15 Sec. 2. REVOLVING FUNDS. There is appropriated to the  
16 department of administrative services for the fiscal year  
17 beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, from the  
18 revolving funds designated in [chapter 8A](#) and from internal  
19 service funds created by the department such amounts as the  
20 department deems necessary for the operation of the department  
21 consistent with the requirements of [chapter 8A](#).

22 Sec. 3. STATE EMPLOYEE HEALTH INSURANCE ADMINISTRATION  
23 CHARGE. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending  
24 June 30, 2020, the monthly per contract administrative charge  
25 which may be assessed by the department of administrative  
26 services shall be \$2 per contract on all health insurance plans  
27 administered by the department.

28 Sec. 4. AUDITOR OF STATE.

29 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
30 to the office of the auditor of state for the fiscal year  
31 beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, the following  
32 amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the  
33 purposes designated:

34 For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous  
35 purposes, and for not more than the following full-time

1 equivalent positions:

4 2. The auditor of state may retain additional full-time  
5 equivalent positions as is reasonable and necessary to  
6 perform governmental subdivision audits which are reimbursable  
7 pursuant to [section 11.20](#) or [11.21](#), to perform audits which are  
8 requested by and reimbursable from the federal government, and  
9 to perform work requested by and reimbursable from departments  
10 or agencies pursuant to [section 11.5A](#) or [11.5B](#). The auditor  
11 of state shall notify the department of management, the  
12 legislative fiscal committee, and the legislative services  
13 agency of the additional full-time equivalent positions  
14 retained.

15 3. The auditor of state shall allocate moneys from the  
16 appropriation in this section solely for audit work related to  
17 the comprehensive annual financial report, federally required  
18 audits, and investigations of embezzlement, theft, or other  
19 significant financial irregularities until the audit of the  
20 comprehensive annual financial report is complete.

21 Sec. 5. IOWA ETHICS AND CAMPAIGN DISCLOSURE BOARD. There  
22 is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the  
23 Iowa ethics and campaign disclosure board for the fiscal year  
24 beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, the following  
25 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the  
26 purposes designated:

27 For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous  
28 purposes, and for not more than the following full-time  
29 equivalent positions:

32 Sec. 6. OFFICE OF THE CHIEF INFORMATION OFFICER — INTERNAL  
33 SERVICE FUNDS — IOWACCESS.

34 1. There is appropriated to the office of the chief  
35 information officer for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019,

1 and ending June 30, 2020, from the revolving funds designated  
2 in [chapter 8B](#) and from internal service funds created by the  
3 office such amounts as the office deems necessary for the  
4 operation of the office consistent with the requirements of  
5 chapter 8B.

6 2. a. Notwithstanding [section 321A.3, subsection 1](#), for the  
7 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020,  
8 the first \$750,000 collected and transferred to the treasurer  
9 of state with respect to the fees for transactions involving  
10 the furnishing of a certified abstract of a vehicle operating  
11 record under [section 321A.3, subsection 1](#), shall be transferred  
12 to the IowAccess revolving fund created in [section 8B.33](#) for  
13 the purposes of developing, implementing, maintaining, and  
14 expanding electronic access to government records as provided  
15 by law.

16 b. All fees collected with respect to transactions  
17 involving IowAccess shall be deposited in the IowAccess  
18 revolving fund created under [section 8B.33](#) and shall be used  
19 only for the support of IowAccess projects.

21 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
22 to the department of commerce for the fiscal year beginning  
23 July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, the following amounts,

26 (2) The insurance division may reallocate authorized  
27 full-time equivalent positions as necessary to respond to  
28 accreditation recommendations or requirements.

29 (3) The insurance division expenditures for examination  
30 purposes may exceed the projected receipts, refunds, and  
31 reimbursements, estimated pursuant to [section 505.7](#), subsection  
32 7, including the expenditures for retention of additional  
33 personnel, if the expenditures are fully reimbursable and the  
34 division first does both of the following:

35 (a) Notifies the department of management, the legislative

1 services agency, and the legislative fiscal committee of the  
2 need for the expenditures.

3 (b) Files with each of the entities named in subparagraph  
4 division (a) the legislative and regulatory justification for

12 (2) The utilities division may expend additional moneys,

17 amount in excess of the moneys budgeted for regulation, the  
18 division shall first do both of the following:

19 (a) Notify the department of management, the legislative  
20 services agency, and the legislative fiscal committee of the  
21 need for the expenditures.

22 (b) File with each of the entities named in subparagraph  
23 division (a) the legislative and regulatory justification for  
24 the expenditures, along with an estimate of the expenditures.

25 3. CHARGES. Each division and the office of consumer  
26 advocate shall include in its charges assessed or revenues  
27 generated an amount sufficient to cover the amount stated  
28 in its appropriation and any state-assessed indirect costs  
29 determined by the department of administrative services.

11 purposes designated:

14 purposes, and for not more than the following full-time  
15 equivalent positions:

13 shall include but is not limited to a summary of the number  
14 of cases investigated, case outcomes, overpayment dollars

29 (2) The total annual operations budget for the division,  
30 including general fund appropriations and federal contract  
31 dollars received by type of service provider inspected.

32 (3) The total number of full-time equivalent positions in  
33 the division, to include the number of full-time equivalent  
34 positions serving in a supervisory capacity, and serving as  
35 surveyors, inspectors, or monitors in the field by type of

1 service provider inspected.

2 (4) Identification of state and federal survey trends,  
3 cited regulations, the scope and severity of deficiencies  
4 identified, and federal and state fines assessed and collected  
5 concerning nursing and assisted living facilities and programs.

6 c. It is the intent of the general assembly that the  
7 department and division continuously solicit input from  
8 facilities regulated by the division to assess and improve  
9 the division's level of collaboration and to identify new  
10 opportunities for cooperation.

12 a. For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous

16 8. APPROPRIATION REALLOCATION. Notwithstanding section  
17 8.39, the department of inspections and appeals, in  
18 consultation with the department of management, may reallocate  
19 moneys appropriated in this section as necessary to best  
20 fulfill the needs of the department provided for in the  
21 appropriation. However, the department of inspections and  
22 appeals shall not reallocate moneys appropriated to the child  
23 advocacy board in this section.

24 Sec. 13. DEPARTMENT OF INSPECTIONS AND APPEALS — LICENSE OR  
25 REGISTRATION FEES.

26 1. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending  
27 June 30, 2020, the department of inspections and appeals  
28 shall collect any license or registration fees or electronic  
29 transaction fees generated during the fiscal year as a result  
30 of licensing and registration activities under [chapters 99B,](#)  
31 [137C, 137D,](#) and [137F.](#)

32 2. From the fees collected by the department under this  
33 section on behalf of a municipal corporation with which  
34 the department has an agreement pursuant to [section 137F.3,](#)  
35 through a statewide electronic licensing system operated by

1 the department, notwithstanding [section 137F.6, subsection 2](#),  
2 the department shall remit the amount of those fees to the  
3 municipal corporation for whom the fees were collected less  
4 any electronic transaction fees collected by the department to  
5 enable electronic payment.

6 3. From the fees collected by the department under this  
7 section, other than those fees described in subsection 2,  
8 the department shall deposit the amount of \$800,000 into the  
9 general fund of the state prior to June 30, 2020.

10 4. From the fees collected by the department under this  
11 section, other than those fees described in subsections 2 and  
12 3, the department shall retain the remainder of the fees for  
13 the purposes of enforcing the provisions of [chapters 99B, 137C,](#)  
14 [137D,](#) and [137F](#). Notwithstanding [section 8.33](#), moneys retained  
15 by the department pursuant to this subsection that remain  
16 unencumbered or unobligated at the end of the fiscal year  
17 shall not revert but shall remain available for expenditure  
18 for the purposes of enforcing the provisions of [chapters 99B,](#)  
19 [137C, 137D,](#) and [137F](#) during the succeeding fiscal year. The  
20 department shall provide an annual report to the department of  
21 management and the legislative services agency on fees billed  
22 and collected and expenditures from the moneys retained by  
23 the department in a format as determined by the department  
24 of management in consultation with the legislative services  
25 agency.

27 REGULATION. There is appropriated from the gaming regulatory

31 2020, the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary,  
32 to be used for the purposes designated:

1 structure laws, and website construction and maintenance for  
2 conducting regulation as required by 2018 Iowa Acts, chapter  
3 1099, and for not more than the following full-time equivalent

7 Sec. 15. ROAD USE TAX FUND APPROPRIATION — DEPARTMENT OF

10 hearings division of the department of inspections and appeals  
11 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30,  
12 2020, the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary,  
13 to be used for the purposes designated:

15 purposes:

17 Sec. 16. DEPARTMENT OF MANAGEMENT. There is appropriated  
18 from the general fund of the state to the department of  
19 management for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and  
20 ending June 30, 2020, the following amounts, or so much thereof  
21 as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

22 1. For enterprise resource planning, providing for a salary  
23 model administrator, conducting performance audits, and the  
24 department's LEAN process; for salaries, support, maintenance,  
25 and miscellaneous purposes; and for not more than the following  
26 full-time equivalent positions:

27 ..... \$ 2,652,389  
28 ..... FTEs 21.00

29 2. a. For distribution of moneys to other governmental  
30 entities for the payment of rate adjustments established by  
31 the office of the chief information officer; and for salaries,  
32 support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:

34 b. Moneys appropriated in this subsection shall be  
35 separately accounted for in a distribution account and shall

1 be distributed to other governmental entities to pay for rate  
2 adjustments established by the office of the chief information  
3 officer related to the overpayment of federal funds for  
4 information technology services. The department of management  
5 may reduce the amount of moneys to be distributed to another  
6 governmental entity for the payment of rate adjustments under  
7 this subsection if the amount to be distributed is less than  
8 the amount currently paid by the governmental entity for such  
9 rates. In addition to moneys appropriated in this subsection,  
10 rate adjustments may also be funded using unencumbered and  
11 unobligated moneys remaining in the department of commerce

24 the amount of the distributions and the dates on which the  
25 distributions are provided.

12 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
13 to the department of revenue for the fiscal year beginning July
