A BILL FOR

1 An Act making appropriations to the department of cultural
2 affairs, the economic development authority, the Iowa
3 finance authority, the public employment relations board,
4 the department of workforce development, the college student
5 aid commission, and the state board of regents and certain
6 regents institutions, and properly related matters.
7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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DIVISION I

FISCAL YEAR 2019-2020 APPROPRIATIONS

Section 1. DEPARTMENT OF CULTURAL AFFAIRS.

1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the department of cultural affairs for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

a. ADMINISTRATION

For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes, and for not more than the following full-time equivalent positions for the department:

.....	FTEs	55.22

The department of cultural affairs shall coordinate activities with the tourism office of the economic development authority to promote attendance at the state historical building and at this state's historic sites.

Full-time equivalent positions authorized under this paragraph are funded, in full or in part, using moneys appropriated under this paragraph and paragraphs "c" through "g".

b. COMMUNITY CULTURAL GRANTS

For planning and programming for the community cultural grants program established under [section 303.3](#):

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c. HISTORICAL DIVISION

For the support of the historical division:

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1 Of the moneys appropriated in this paragraph, the department
2 shall allocate \$300,000 for purposes of the film office.

3 f. IOWA GREAT PLACES

4 For the Iowa great places program established under section
5 303.3C:

6 \$ 150,000

7 g. RECORDS CENTER RENT

8 For payment of rent for the state records center:

9 \$ 227,243

10 h. CULTURAL TRUST GRANTS

11 For grant programs administered by the Iowa arts
12 council including those programs supporting the long-term
13 financial stability and sustainability of nonprofit cultural
14 organizations:

15 \$ 100,000

16 2. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
17 this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
18 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
19 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
20 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

21 Sec. 2. GOALS AND ACCOUNTABILITY — ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

22 1. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, the goals
23 for the economic development authority shall be to expand and
24 stimulate the state economy, increase the wealth of Iowans, and
25 increase the population of the state.

26 2. To achieve the goals in subsection 1, the economic
27 development authority shall do all of the following for the
28 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019:

29 a. Concentrate its efforts on programs and activities that
30 result in commercially viable products and services.

31 b. Adopt practices and services consistent with free
32 market, private sector philosophies.

33 c. Ensure economic growth and development throughout the
34 state.

35 d. Work with businesses and communities to continually

1 improve the economic development climate along with the
2 economic well-being and quality of life for Iowans.

3 e. Coordinate with other state agencies to ensure that they
4 are attentive to the needs of an entrepreneurial culture.

5 f. Establish a strong and aggressive marketing image to
6 showcase Iowa's workforce, existing industry, and potential.
7 A priority shall be placed on recruiting new businesses,
8 business expansion, and retaining existing Iowa businesses.
9 Emphasis shall be placed on entrepreneurial development through
10 helping entrepreneurs secure capital, and developing networks
11 and a business climate conducive to entrepreneurs and small
12 businesses.

13 g. Encourage the development of communities and quality of
14 life to foster economic growth.

15 h. Prepare communities for future growth and development
16 through development, expansion, and modernization of
17 infrastructure.

18 i. Develop public-private partnerships with Iowa businesses
19 in the tourism industry, Iowa tour groups, Iowa tourism
20 organizations, and political subdivisions in this state to
21 assist in the development of advertising efforts.

22 j. Develop, to the fullest extent possible, cooperative
23 efforts for advertising with contributions from other sources.

24 Sec. 3. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY.

25 1. APPROPRIATION

26 a. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
27 to the economic development authority for the fiscal year
28 beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, the following
29 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the
30 purposes designated in this subsection, and for not more than
31 the following full-time equivalent positions:

32	\$ 13,413,379
33	FTEs 126.45

34 b. (1) For salaries, support, miscellaneous purposes,
35 programs, marketing, and the maintenance of an administration

1 division, a business development division, a community
2 development division, a small business development division,
3 and other divisions the authority may organize.

4 (2) The full-time equivalent positions authorized under
5 this section are funded, in whole or in part, by the moneys
6 appropriated under this subsection or by other moneys received
7 by the authority, including certain federal moneys.

8 (3) For business development operations and programs,
9 international trade, export assistance, workforce recruitment,
10 and the partner state program.

11 (4) For transfer to a fund created pursuant to section
12 15.313 for purposes of financing strategic infrastructure
13 projects.

14 (5) For community economic development programs, tourism
15 operations, community assistance, plans for Iowa green corps
16 and summer youth programs, the mainstreet and rural mainstreet
17 programs, the school-to-career program, the community
18 development block grant, and housing and shelter-related
19 programs.

20 (6) For achieving the goals and accountability, and
21 fulfilling the requirements and duties required under this Act.

22 c. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
23 this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
24 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
25 available for expenditure for the purposes designated in this
26 subsection until the close of the succeeding fiscal year.

27 2. FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE RESTRICTIONS

28 a. A business creating jobs through moneys appropriated in
29 subsection 1 shall be subject to contract provisions requiring
30 new and retained jobs to be filled by individuals who are
31 citizens of the United States who reside within the United
32 States or any person authorized to work in the United States
33 pursuant to federal law, including legal resident aliens in the
34 United States.

35 b. Any vendor who receives moneys appropriated in

1 subsection 1 shall adhere to such contract provisions and
2 provide periodic assurances as the state shall require that the
3 jobs are filled solely by citizens of the United States who
4 reside within the United States or any person authorized to
5 work in the United States pursuant to federal law, including
6 legal resident aliens in the United States.

7 c. A business that receives financial assistance from
8 the authority from moneys appropriated in subsection 1 shall
9 only employ individuals legally authorized to work in this
10 state. In addition to all other applicable penalties provided
11 by current law, all or a portion of the assistance received
12 by a business which is found to knowingly employ individuals
13 not legally authorized to work in this state is subject to
14 recapture by the authority.

15 3. USES OF APPROPRIATIONS

16 a. From the moneys appropriated in subsection 1, the
17 authority may provide financial assistance in the form of a
18 grant to a community economic development entity for conducting
19 a local workforce recruitment effort designed to recruit former
20 citizens of the state and former students at colleges and
21 universities in the state to meet the needs of local employers.

22 b. From the moneys appropriated in subsection 1, the
23 authority may provide financial assistance to early stage
24 industry companies being established by women entrepreneurs.

25 c. From the moneys appropriated in subsection 1, the
26 authority may provide financial assistance in the form of
27 grants, loans, or forgivable loans for advanced research and
28 commercialization projects involving value-added agriculture,
29 advanced technology, or biotechnology.

30 d. The authority shall not use any moneys appropriated in
31 subsection 1 for purposes of providing financial assistance for
32 the Iowa green streets pilot project or for any other program
33 or project that involves the installation of geothermal systems
34 for melting snow and ice from streets or sidewalks.

35 4. WORLD FOOD PRIZE

1 There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
2 to the economic development authority for the fiscal year
3 beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, the following
4 amount for the world food prize and in lieu of the standing
5 appropriation in [section 15.368](#):

6 \$ 350,000

7 5. IOWA COMMISSION ON VOLUNTEER SERVICE

8 There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
9 to the economic development authority for the fiscal year
10 beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, the following
11 amount for allocation to the Iowa commission on volunteer
12 service for purposes of the Iowa state commission grant
13 program, the Iowa's promise and Iowa mentoring partnership
14 programs, and for not more than the following full-time
15 equivalent positions:

16 \$ 168,201

17 FTEs 8.00

18 Of the moneys appropriated in this subsection, the
19 authority shall allocate \$75,000 for purposes of the Iowa state
20 commission grant program and \$93,201 for purposes of the Iowa's
21 promise and Iowa mentoring partnership programs.

22 Notwithstanding [section 8.33](#), moneys appropriated in this
23 subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the close
24 of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain available
25 for expenditure for the purposes designated until the close of
26 the succeeding fiscal year.

27 6. COUNCILS OF GOVERNMENTS — ASSISTANCE

28 There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
29 to the economic development authority for the fiscal year
30 beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, the following
31 amount to be used for the purposes of providing financial
32 assistance to Iowa's councils of governments:

33 \$ 225,000

34 7. REGISTERED APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM

35 There is appropriated from the general fund of the

1 state to the economic development authority for the fiscal
2 year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, the
3 following amount to be used for the funding of a registered
4 apprenticeship development program designed to encourage
5 small to midsize businesses to start or grow registered
6 apprenticeships:

7 \$ 1,000,000

8 8. SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING, AND MATHEMATICS
9 INTERNSHIPS

10 a. There is appropriated from the Iowa skilled worker and
11 job creation fund created in section 8.75 to the Iowa economic
12 development authority for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
13 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, the following amount, or so
14 much thereof as is necessary, for the purposes designated:

15 For the funding of internships for students studying in the
16 fields of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics
17 with eligible Iowa employers as provided in section 15.411,
18 subsection 3, paragraph "c":

19 \$ 1,000,000

20 b. No more than 3 percent of the moneys appropriated in this
21 subsection may be used by the authority for costs associated
22 with administration of the internship program.

23 c. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
24 this subsection which remain unencumbered or unobligated at
25 the end of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
26 available for expenditure for the purposes designated in
27 subsequent fiscal years.

28 9. FUTURE READY IOWA — VOLUNTEER MENTORING PROGRAM

29 a. There is appropriated from the Iowa skilled worker and
30 job creation fund created in section 8.75 to the economic
31 development authority for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
32 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, the following amount, or so
33 much thereof as is necessary, for the purpose designated:

34 For allocation to the Iowa commission on volunteer services
35 to be used for establishing a volunteer mentor program to

1 support implementation of the future ready Iowa skilled
2 workforce last-dollar scholarship program in section 261.131
3 and the future ready Iowa skilled workforce grant program
4 created in section 261.132:

5 \$ 400,000

6 b. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
7 this subsection which remain unencumbered or unobligated at
8 the end of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
9 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
10 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

11 10. EMPOWER RURAL IOWA — HOUSING NEEDS ASSESSMENT GRANT
12 PROGRAM

13 a. There is appropriated from the Iowa skilled worker and
14 job creation fund created in section 8.75 to the economic
15 development authority for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
16 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, the following amount, or so
17 much thereof as is necessary, for the purpose designated:

18 To be distributed by the authority for establishing a
19 housing needs assessment grant program to provide small
20 communities with hard data and housing-related information
21 specific to the community being analyzed:

22 \$ 100,000

23 b. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
24 this subsection which remain unencumbered or unobligated at
25 the end of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
26 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
27 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

28 c. The authority shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
29 17A to establish criteria for the distribution of the moneys
30 appropriated in this subsection.

31 11. EMPOWER RURAL IOWA — RURAL INNOVATION GRANTS

32 a. There is appropriated from the Iowa skilled worker and
33 job creation fund created in section 8.75 to the economic
34 development authority for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
35 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, the following amount, or so

1 much thereof as is necessary, for the purpose designated:

2 To be distributed by the authority for supporting innovative
3 rural projects:

4 \$ 300,000

5 b. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
6 this subsection which remain unencumbered or unobligated at
7 the end of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
8 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
9 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

10 c. The authority shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
11 17A to establish criteria for the distribution of the moneys
12 appropriated in this subsection.

13 Sec. 4. LIMITATIONS OF STANDING APPROPRIATIONS — FY
14 2019-2020. Notwithstanding the standing appropriations
15 in the following designated sections for the fiscal year
16 beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, the amounts
17 appropriated from the general fund of the state pursuant to
18 these sections for the following purposes shall not exceed the
19 following amounts:

20 1. For operational support grants and community cultural
21 grants under section 99F.11, subsection 3, paragraph "d",
22 subparagraph (1):

23 \$ 448,403

24 2. For the purposes of regional tourism marketing under
25 section 99F.11, subsection 3, paragraph "d", subparagraph (2):

26 \$ 900,000

27 Sec. 5. FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE REPORTING — ECONOMIC
28 DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY. The economic development authority and
29 the department of revenue shall submit a joint annual report
30 to the general assembly no later than November 1, 2019, that
31 details the amount of every direct loan, forgivable loan,
32 tax credit, tax exemption, tax refund, grant, or any other
33 financial assistance awarded to a person during the prior
34 fiscal year by the authority under an economic development
35 program administered by the authority. The report shall

1 identify the county where the project associated with each such
2 award is located.

3 Sec. 6. INSURANCE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. From the
4 moneys collected by the insurance division in excess of the
5 anticipated gross revenues under section 505.7, subsection
6 3, during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, \$100,000
7 shall be transferred to the economic development authority for
8 insurance economic development and international insurance
9 economic development.

10 Sec. 7. IOWA FINANCE AUTHORITY.

11 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
12 to the Iowa finance authority for the fiscal year beginning
13 July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, the following amount,
14 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used to provide
15 reimbursement for rent expenses to eligible persons under
16 the home and community-based services rent subsidy program
17 established in section 16.55:

18 \$ 658,000

19 2. Of the moneys appropriated in this section, not more than
20 \$35,000 may be used for administrative costs.

21 3. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
22 this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
23 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
24 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
25 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

26 Sec. 8. IOWA FINANCE AUTHORITY AUDIT. The auditor of state
27 is requested to review the audit of the Iowa finance authority
28 performed by the auditor hired by the authority.

29 Sec. 9. PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT RELATIONS BOARD.

30 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
31 to the public employment relations board for the fiscal year
32 beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, the following
33 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, for the purposes
34 designated:

35 For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous

1 purposes, and for not more than the following full-time
2 equivalent positions:

3 \$ 1,492,452
4 FTEs 11.00

5 2. Of the moneys appropriated in this section, the board
6 shall allocate \$15,000 for maintaining an internet site that
7 allows searchable access to a database of collective bargaining
8 information.

9 Sec. 10. DEPARTMENT OF WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT. There
10 is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the
11 department of workforce development for the fiscal year
12 beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, the following
13 amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, for the purposes
14 designated:

15 1. DIVISION OF LABOR SERVICES

16 a. For the division of labor services, including salaries,
17 support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes, and for not
18 more than the following full-time equivalent positions:

19 \$ 3,491,252
20 FTEs 58.10

21 b. From the contractor registration fees, the division of
22 labor services shall reimburse the department of inspections
23 and appeals for all costs associated with hearings under
24 chapter 91C, relating to contractor registration.

25 2. DIVISION OF WORKERS' COMPENSATION

26 a. For the division of workers' compensation, including
27 salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes, and
28 for not more than the following full-time equivalent positions:

29 \$ 3,321,044
30 FTEs 26.10

31 b. The division of workers' compensation shall charge a
32 \$100 filing fee for workers' compensation cases. The filing
33 fee shall be paid by the petitioner of a claim. However, the
34 fee can be taxed as a cost and paid by the losing party, except
35 in cases where it would impose an undue hardship or be unjust

1 under the circumstances. The moneys generated by the filing
2 fee allowed under this subsection are appropriated to the
3 department of workforce development to be used for purposes of
4 administering the division of workers' compensation.

5 3. WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT OPERATIONS

6 a. For the operation of field offices, the workforce
7 development board, and for not more than the following
8 full-time equivalent positions:

9	\$	6,675,650
10	FTEs	185.92

11 b. Of the moneys appropriated in paragraph "a" of this
12 subsection, the department shall allocate \$150,000 to the state
13 library for the purpose of licensing an online resource which
14 prepares persons to succeed in the workplace through programs
15 which improve job skills and vocational test-taking abilities.

16 4. OFFENDER REENTRY PROGRAM

17 a. For the development and administration of an offender
18 reentry program to provide offenders with employment skills,
19 and for not more than the following full-time equivalent
20 positions:

21	\$	387,158
22	FTEs	5.00

23 b. The department of workforce development shall partner
24 with the department of corrections to provide staff within the
25 correctional facilities to improve offenders' abilities to find
26 and retain productive employment.

27 5. INTEGRATED INFORMATION FOR IOWA SYSTEM

28 For the payment of services provided by the department of
29 administrative services related to the integrated information
30 for Iowa system:

31	\$	228,822
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32 6. SUMMER YOUTH INTERN PILOT PROGRAM

33 For the funding of a summer youth intern pilot program that
34 will help young people at risk of not graduating from high
35 school to explore and prepare for high-demand careers through

1 summer work experience, including the development of soft
2 skills:

3 \$ 250,000

4 7. FUTURE READY IOWA COORDINATOR

5 For the funding of a future ready Iowa coordinator in the
6 department, and for not more than the following full-time
7 equivalent positions:

8 \$ 150,000

9 FTEs 0.50

10 8. NONREVERSION

11 Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in this
12 section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the close of
13 the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain available for
14 expenditure for the purposes designated until the close of the
15 succeeding fiscal year.

16 Sec. 11. GENERAL FUND — EMPLOYEE MISCLASSIFICATION

17 PROGRAM. There is appropriated from the general fund of the
18 state to the department of workforce development for the fiscal
19 year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, the
20 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
21 used for the purposes designated:

22 For enhancing efforts to investigate employers that
23 misclassify workers and for not more than the following
24 full-time equivalent positions:

25 \$ 379,631

26 FTEs 5.50

27 Sec. 12. SPECIAL EMPLOYMENT SECURITY CONTINGENCY FUND.

28 1. There is appropriated from the special employment
29 security contingency fund to the department of workforce
30 development for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and
31 ending June 30, 2020, the following amount, or so much thereof
32 as is necessary, to be used for field offices:

33 \$ 1,766,084

34 2. Any remaining additional penalty and interest revenue
35 collected by the department of workforce development is

1 appropriated to the department for the fiscal year beginning
2 July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, to accomplish the
3 mission of the department.

4 Sec. 13. FUTURE READY IOWA — IOWA EMPLOYER INNOVATION FUND.

5 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
6 to the department of workforce development for the fiscal year
7 beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, the following
8 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the
9 purposes designated:

10 In consultation with the workforce development board, for
11 funding of the Iowa employer innovation program which shall
12 match eligible employer moneys to expand opportunities for
13 education and training leading to high-demand jobs and to
14 encourage Iowa employers, community leaders, and others to
15 provide leadership and support for regional workforce talent
16 pools throughout the state, and for future ready Iowa education
17 and outreach:

18 \$ 1,200,000

19 2. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
20 this section which remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
21 end of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
22 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
23 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

24 Sec. 14. HOME BASE IOWA.

25 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
26 to the department of workforce development for the fiscal year
27 beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, the following
28 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the
29 purposes designated:

30 To fund a position to assist with support of home base Iowa
31 activities:

32 \$ 100,000

33 FTEs 1.00

34 2. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
35 this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the

1 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
2 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
3 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

4 Sec. 15. UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION RESERVE FUND —
5 FIELD OFFICES. Notwithstanding section 96.9, subsection 8,
6 paragraph "e", there is appropriated from interest earned on
7 the unemployment compensation reserve fund to the department
8 of workforce development for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
9 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, the following amount, or so
10 much thereof as is necessary, for the purposes designated:

11 For the operation of field offices:
12 \$ 2,850,000

13 Sec. 16. VIRTUAL ACCESS WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT OFFICES. The
14 department of workforce development shall require a unique
15 identification login for all users of workforce development
16 centers operated through electronic means.

17 Sec. 17. UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION PROGRAM. Notwithstanding
18 section 96.9, subsection 4, paragraph "a", moneys credited to
19 the state by the secretary of the treasury of the United
20 States pursuant to section 903 of the Social Security
21 Act are appropriated to the department of workforce
22 development and shall be used by the department for the
23 administration of the unemployment compensation program only.
24 This appropriation shall not apply to any fiscal year
25 beginning after December 31, 2019.

26 Sec. 18. IOWA SKILLED WORKER AND JOB CREATION FUND.

27 1. There is appropriated from the Iowa skilled worker and
28 job creation fund created in section 8.75 to the following
29 departments, agencies, and institutions for the fiscal year
30 beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, the following
31 amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the
32 purposes designated:

33 a. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

34 (1) For the purposes of providing assistance under the high
35 quality jobs program as described in section 15.335B:

1 \$ 11,850,000

2 (2) From the moneys appropriated in this lettered paragraph
3 "a", the economic development authority may use not more than
4 \$1,000,000 for purposes of providing infrastructure grants to
5 mainstreet communities under the main street Iowa program.

6 (3) As a condition of receiving moneys appropriated in

30 interest and a statement by a member of a conflict of interest
