A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to and making appropriations to state
2 departments and agencies from the rebuild Iowa
3 infrastructure fund and the technology reinvestment fund,
4 providing for related matters, and including effective date
5 provisions.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

DIVISION I

REBUILD IOWA INFRASTRUCTURE FUND

Section 1. REBUILD IOWA INFRASTRUCTURE FUND —

4 APPROPRIATIONS. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
5 infrastructure fund to the following departments and agencies
6 for the following fiscal years, the following amounts, or so
7 much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes
8 designated:

1. DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES

For security cameras on the state capitol complex,
notwithstanding section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph "c":

FY 2021-2022:

FY 2022-2023:

..... \$ 250,000

2. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND LAND STEWARDSHIP

a. For deposit in the water quality initiative fund created
in section 466B.45 for purposes of supporting the water quality
initiative administered by the division of soil conservation
and water quality as provided in section 466B.42, including
salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes,
notwithstanding section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph "c":

..... \$ 5,200,000

b. (1) The moneys appropriated in this subsection shall
be used to support demonstration projects in subwatersheds as
designated by the department that are part of high-priority
watersheds identified by the water resources coordinating
council.

(2) The moneys appropriated in this subsection shall be
used to support demonstration projects in watersheds generally,
including regional watersheds, as designated by the division
and high-priority watersheds identified by the water resources
coordinating council.

c. In supporting projects in watersheds and subwatersheds

1 as provided in paragraph "b", all of the following shall apply:

2 (1) The demonstration projects shall utilize water quality
3 practices as described in the latest revision of the document
4 entitled "Iowa Nutrient Reduction Strategy" initially presented
5 in November 2012 by the department of agriculture and land
6 stewardship, the department of natural resources, and Iowa
7 state university of science and technology.

8 (2) The division shall implement demonstration projects as
9 provided in subparagraph (1) by providing for participation by
10 persons who hold a legal interest in agricultural land used in
11 farming. To every extent practical, the division shall provide
12 for collaborative participation by such persons who hold a
13 legal interest in agricultural land located within the same
14 subwatershed.

15 (3) The division shall implement demonstration projects on
16 a cost-share basis as determined by the division. Except for
17 edge-of-field practices, the state's share of the amount shall
18 not exceed 50 percent of the estimated cost of establishing the
19 practice as determined by the division or 50 percent of the
20 actual cost of establishing the practice, whichever is less.

21 (4) The demonstration projects shall be used to educate
22 other persons about the feasibility and value of establishing
23 similar water quality practices. The division shall promote
24 field day events for purposes of allowing interested persons to
25 establish water quality practices on their agricultural land.

26 (5) The division shall conduct water quality evaluations
27 within supported subwatersheds. Within a reasonable period
28 after accumulating information from such evaluations, the
29 division shall create an aggregated database of water quality
30 practices. Any information identifying a person holding a
31 legal interest in agricultural land or specific agricultural
32 land shall be a confidential record.

33 d. The moneys appropriated in this subsection shall be used
34 to support education and outreach in a manner that encourages
35 persons who hold a legal interest in agricultural land used for

1 farming to implement water quality practices, including the
2 establishment of such practices in watersheds generally, and
3 not limited to subwatersheds or high-priority watersheds.

4 e. The moneys appropriated in this subsection may be used
5 to contract with persons to coordinate the implementation of
6 efforts provided in this subsection.

7 f. The moneys appropriated in this subsection may be used
8 by the department to support urban soil and water conservation
9 efforts, which may include but are not limited to management
10 practices related to bioretention, landscaping, the use of
11 permeable or pervious pavement, and soil quality restoration.
12 The moneys shall be allocated on a cost-share basis as provided
13 in [chapter 161A](#).

14 g. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the
15 contrary, the department may use moneys appropriated in this
16 subsection to carry out the provisions of this subsection on a
17 cost-share basis in combination with other moneys available to
18 the department from a state or federal source.

19 h. Not more than 10 percent of the moneys appropriated in
20 this subsection may be used for costs of administration and
21 implementation of the water quality initiative administered by
22 the soil conservation division.

20 deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.

22 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

23 Sec. 8. Section 8.57C, subsection 3, paragraph a, Code 2021,
24 is amended to read as follows:

26 to the technology reinvestment fund for the following fiscal
27 years, ~~the sum of seventeen million five hundred thousand~~

2 Sec. 9. Section 15.261, subsection 2, Code 2021, is amended
3 to read as follows:

4 2. Moneys in the vacant state buildings demolition fund
5 are appropriated to the authority for purposes of funding a
6 grant program for the demolition of vacant buildings owned by
7 the state which are no longer used for a state purpose. Grant
8 program criteria shall provide that no more than fifty percent
9 of the cost of a project for the demolition of vacant buildings
10 shall be funded from a grant under the program.
