A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to higher education, including by modifying
- 2 the responsibilities of private institutions of higher
- 3 education, community colleges, the state board of regents,
- 4 and institutions of higher education governed by the state
- 5 board of regents, modifying provisions related to diversity,
- 6 equity, and inclusion policies, tuition, and administrator
- 7 hiring at state universities, membership of the state board
- 8 of regents, and student-employer work and tuition programs
- 9 at state universities and community colleges, and including
- 10 applicability provisions.
- 11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 2 SHORT TITLE
- 3 Section 1. SHORT TITLE. This Act shall be known and may be 4 cited as the "Higher Education Reform Act of 2024".
- 5 DIVISION II
- 6 COMMUNITY COLLEGES
- 7 Sec. 2. Section 260C.14, Code 2024, is amended by adding the 8 following new subsections:
- 9 NEW SUBSECTION. 25. Prior to the beginning of the 2025-2026
- 10 academic year, establish a program that satisfies all of the
- 11 following requirements:
- 12 a. Allows students admitted to the community college to
- 13 complete the community college's associate's degree program
- 14 while working part-time for an employer registered under the
- 15 program.
- 16 b. Requires the student and a representative of the
- 17 student's employer to execute an agreement that requires the
- 18 student to work part-time for the student's employer for at
- 19 least one calendar year and that describes the rights and
- 20 responsibilities of the student and the employer under the
- 21 program.
- 22 c. Requires the student's employer to pay all of the tuition
- 23 and mandatory fees associated with the student's participation
- 24 in the associate's degree program during the fall and spring
- 25 semesters.
- 26 d. Requires the student's employer to pay the student a rate
- 27 of compensation that shall not be less than the higher of the
- 28 applicable federal or state minimum wage.
- 29 NEW SUBSECTION. 26. Adopt policies and procedures that
- 30 require the community college to follow state law, regardless
- 31 of any rules or directives of any accrediting agency.
- 32 NEW SUBSECTION. 27. Adopt policies and procedures
- 33 that require any strategic plan adopted by the community
- 34 college to include a description of how the community college
- 35 will prioritize degree programs that lead to employment

- 1 in high-demand fields within the state. The policies and
- 2 procedures shall also require that the community college's
- 3 current strategic plan be revised to include a description of
- 4 how the community college will prioritize degree programs that
- 5 lead to employment in high-demand fields within the state.
- 6 NEW SUBSECTION. 28. Adopt policies and procedures that
- 7 prohibit any faculty senate committee or subcommittee from
- 8 having any governance authority over the community college.
- 9 The policies and procedures shall provide that the scope of
- 10 authority of a faculty senate committee or subcommittee is
- 11 limited to an advisory role.
- 12 DIVISION III
- 13 STATE BOARD OF REGENTS
- 14 Sec. 3. Section 262.1, Code 2024, is amended to read as
- 15 follows:
- 16 262.1 Membership.
- 17 l. The state board of regents consists of nine voting
- 18 members, eight of whom shall be selected from the state at
- 19 large solely with regard to their qualifications and fitness
- 20 to discharge the duties of the office. The ninth member shall
- 21 be a student enrolled on a full-time basis in good standing
- 22 at either the graduate or undergraduate level at one of the
- 23 institutions listed in section 262.7, subsection 1, 2, or 3,
- 24 at the time of the member's appointment. Not more than five
- 25 members shall be of the same political party.
- 26 2. In addition to the nine voting members, the membership
- 27 of the state board of regents shall include two ex officio,
- 28 nonvoting members of the general assembly, with one member
- 29 designated by the majority leader of the senate and one member
- 30 designated by the speaker of the house of representatives. A
- 31 legislative member serves for a term as provided in section
- 32 69.16B.
- 33 Sec. 4. Section 262.2, Code 2024, is amended to read as
- 34 follows:
- 35 262.2 Appointment term of office.

- 1 The voting members shall be appointed by the governor 2 subject to confirmation by the senate. Prior to appointing 3 the ninth member as specified in section 262.1, subsection 1, 4 the governor shall consult with the appropriate student body 5 government at the institution at which the proposed appointee 6 is enrolled. The term of each voting member of the board shall 7 be for six four years, unless the ninth member, appointed in 8 accordance with section 262.1, subsection 1, graduates or 9 is no longer enrolled at an institution of higher education 10 under the board's control, at which time the term of the 11 ninth member shall expire one year from the date on which the 12 member graduates or is no longer enrolled in an institution 13 of higher education under the board's control. However, if 14 within that year the ninth member reenrolls in any institution 15 of higher education under the board's control on a full-time 16 basis and is a student in good standing at either the graduate 17 or undergraduate level, the term of the ninth member shall 18 continue in effect. The terms of three the voting members of 19 the board shall be staggered and shall begin and expire in each 20 odd-numbered year as provided in section 69.19. 21 Sec. 5. Section 262.4, Code 2024, is amended to read as 22 follows: 262.4 Removals. The governor, with the approval of a majority of the senate 25 during a session of the general assembly, may remove any voting

- 26 member of the board for malfeasance in office, or for any cause
- 27 which would render the voting member ineligible for appointment
- 28 or incapable or unfit to discharge the duties of office, and
- 29 the voting member's removal, when so made, shall be final.
- 30 Section 262.5, Code 2024, is amended to read as Sec. 6.
- 31 follows:
- 32 262.5 Suspension.
- 33 When the general assembly is not in session, the governor
- 34 may suspend any voting member so disqualified and shall appoint
- 35 another to fill the vacancy thus created, subject to the

- 1 approval of the senate when next in session.
- 2 Sec. 7. Section 262.6, Code 2024, is amended to read as
- 3 follows:
- 4 262.6 Vacancies.
- 5 Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner in which
- 6 regular appointments are required to be made. If the ninth
- 7 voting member resigns prior to the expiration of the term,
- 8 the individual appointed to fill the vacancy shall meet the
- 9 requirements for the ninth voting member specified in section
- 10 262.1, subsection 1. Other vacancies in the voting members
- ll occurring prior to the expiration of the ninth voting member's
- 12 term shall be filled in the same manner as the original
- 13 appointments for those vacancies.
- 14 Sec. 8. Section 262.8, Code 2024, is amended to read as
- 15 follows:
- 16 **262.8** Meetings.
- 17 The board shall meet four times a year. Special meetings
- 18 may be called by the board, by the president of the board, or
- 19 by the executive director of the board upon written request of
- 20 any five voting members thereof.
- 21 Sec. 9. Section 262.9, subsection 1, Code 2024, is amended
- 22 to read as follows:
- 23 l. a. Each even-numbered year elect nominate, from
- 24 its members, a president of the board, who is subject to
- 25 confirmation by the senate and who shall serve for two years
- 26 and until a successor is elected nominated and qualified
- 27 confirmed.
- 28 b. Notwithstanding paragraph "a", an individual who has been
- 29 nominated by the board and confirmed by the senate pursuant
- 30 to paragraph "a" shall not be required to be confirmed by the
- 31 senate subsequent to the expiration of the individual's term
- 32 as president if the board nominates the individual to serve as
- 33 president of the board subsequent to the expiration of such
- 34 term.
- 35 Sec. 10. APPLICABILITY. The following applies to members

- 1 of the state board of regents appointed by the governor, and
- 2 not yet confirmed by the senate, on or after the effective date
- 3 of this division of this Act:
- 4 The section of this division of this Act amending section
- 5 262.2.
- 6 Sec. 11. APPLICABILITY. The following applies upon the
- 7 expiration of the term of the president of the state board of
- 8 regents as provided in section 262.9, subsection 1:
- 9 The section of this division of this Act amending section
- 10 262.9, subsection 1.
- 11 DIVISION IV
- 12 INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION GOVERNED BY THE STATE BOARD
- 13 OF REGENTS
- 14 Sec. 12. Section 262.9, subsections 2, 3, and 22, Code 2024,
- 15 are amended to read as follows:
- 16 2. a. Elect a president of each of the institutions of
- 17 higher learning; a treasurer and a secretarial officer for each
- 18 institution annually; professors, instructors, officers, and
- 19 employees; and fix their compensation.
- 20 b. (1) When electing a president of an institution of
- 21 higher learning, the board shall use a presidential selection
- 22 committee that shall provide the board with recommendations
- 23 related to the best candidate for the position. The board
- 24 shall not elect a president of an institution of higher
- 25 learning unless the presidential selection committee
- 26 recommended the election of the president to the board.
- 27 (2) Only members of the board shall serve as members of the
- 28 presidential selection committee.
- 29 (3) In carrying out its duties under this paragraph, the
- 30 presidential selection committee may do any of the following:
- 31 (a) Contract for and use the services of any person engaged
- 32 in the business of placing highly qualified job candidates in
- 33 leadership positions.
- 34 (b) Use moneys allocated to the committee by the board.
- 35 (4) The identity of a candidate for president of an

- 1 institution of higher learning being considered by the
- 2 presidential selection committee shall be confidential and
- 3 shall not be a public record subject to disclosure under
- 4 chapter 22, unless the identity of the candidate is revealed
- 5 pursuant to the terms of a written agreement entered into
- 6 between all members of the presidential selection committee.
- 7 3. Make rules for admission to and for the government of
- 8 said institutions, not inconsistent with law. The rules shall
- 9 require the institutions of higher learning under its control
- 10 to incorporate the classic learning test, developed by classic
- 11 learning initiatives, into the regent admission index prior to
- 12 the beginning of the 2025-2026 academic year.
- 13 22. a. Develop a policy and adopt rules relating to the
- 14 establishment of tuition rates which provide a predictable
- 15 basis for assessing and anticipating changes in tuition rates.
- 16 b. The rules shall provide that the amount of resident
- 17 tuition and mandatory fees charged by an institution of
- 18 higher education under the board's control to an undergraduate
- 19 student who began the baccalaureate program on or after the
- 20 2025-2026 academic year shall not increase during the student's
- 21 first four full consecutive academic years of participation
- 22 in the baccalaureate program. This paragraph shall not be
- 23 construed to prohibit the board from increasing the amount of
- 24 resident tuition and mandatory fees for incoming classes by
- 25 an amount not to exceed three percent of the total amount of
- 26 resident tuition and mandatory fees the institution charged
- 27 to undergraduate students during the immediately preceding
- 28 academic year.
- 29 c. (1) Notwithstanding paragraph b'', the rules developed
- 30 by the board shall authorize institutions of higher education
- 31 under the board's control to increase the total amount of
- 32 resident tuition and mandatory fees associated with the
- 33 baccalaureate program for all of the following students:
- 34 (a) Students who take more than four full consecutive
- 35 academic years to complete the baccalaureate program.

- 1 (b) Students who have attained a sufficient amount of
- 2 semester hours of undergraduate credits prior to the student's
- 3 date of admission such that the student is able to complete
- 4 the remaining semester hours of credits associated with the
- 5 baccalaureate program in less than four full consecutive
- 6 academic years, but the student fails to do so.
- 7 (2) If an institution of higher education increases the
- 8 total amount of resident tuition and mandatory fees associated
- 9 with the baccalaureate program pursuant to this paragraph, the
- 10 institution shall not increase the total amount of resident
- 11 tuition and mandatory fees to an amount that is greater than
- 12 the amount of tuition and mandatory fees charged to the most
- 13 recent incoming class.
- 14 Sec. 13. Section 262.9, Code 2024, is amended by adding the
- 15 following new subsections:
- 16 NEW SUBSECTION. 39. a. Direct the institutions of higher
- 17 education under its control to adopt policies and procedures
- 18 that prohibit the institutions from creating any new position
- 19 for an administrator, unless the board approves the creation of
- 20 the new position.
- 21 b. The policies and procedures adopted pursuant to paragraph
- 22 "a" shall not prohibit an institution of higher education under
- 23 the control of the state board of regents from filling an open
- 24 administrator position with an administrator who is currently
- 25 employed by the institution of higher education.
- 26 c. For purposes of this subsection, "administrator" means an
- 27 employee who serves in the role of vice president, assistant
- 28 vice president, or associate vice president.
- 29 NEW SUBSECTION. 40. Direct the institutions of higher
- 30 education under its control to establish, prior to the
- 31 beginning of the 2025-2026 academic year, a program at each
- 32 institution that satisfies all of the following requirements:
- 33 a. Allows students admitted to the baccalaureate degree
- 34 program at the institution to complete the baccalaureate degree
- 35 program while working part-time for an employer registered

- 1 under the program.
- 2 b. Requires the student and a representative of the
- 3 student's employer to execute an agreement that requires the
- 4 student to work part-time for the student's employer for at
- 5 least one calendar year and that describes the rights and
- 6 responsibilities of the student and the employer under the
- 7 program.
- 8 c. Requires the student's employer to pay all of the tuition
- 9 and mandatory fees associated with the student's participation
- 10 in the baccalaureate degree program during the fall and spring
- 11 semesters.
- 12 d. Requires the student's employer to pay the student a rate
- 13 of compensation that shall not be less than the higher of the
- 14 applicable federal or state minimum wage.
- 15 NEW SUBSECTION. 41. Direct the institutions of higher
- 16 education under its control to structure university-wide
- 17 diversity, equity, and inclusion offices to prohibit any
- 18 diversity, equity, and inclusion function that is not necessary
- 19 for compliance with federal or state laws or accreditation.
- 20 The institutions of higher education shall make the support
- 21 services that are provided by such offices broadly available to
- 22 all students and employees, subject to applicable federal and
- 23 state eligibility requirements.
- 24 NEW SUBSECTION. 42. Direct the institutions of higher
- 25 education under its control to regularly do all of the
- 26 following:
- 27 a. Review the services provided by offices that support
- 28 diversity or multicultural affairs in other divisions of the
- 29 institution to ensure that such services are available to all
- 30 students, subject to applicable federal or state eligibility
- 31 requirements.
- 32 b. Update promotional and informational materials and
- 33 internet sites to clarify that the mission of offices that
- 34 support diversity or multicultural affairs in other divisions
- 35 of the institution is to support success broadly.

- 1 NEW SUBSECTION. 43. Direct the institutions of higher
- 2 education under its control to take reasonable steps to assure
- 3 all of the following:
- 4 a. That an employee, student, applicant, or campus visitor
- 5 is not required to submit a diversity, equity, and inclusion
- 6 statement, or be evaluated based on participation in a
- 7 diversity, equity, and inclusion initiative, unless required
- 8 for compliance or accreditation related to diversity, equity,
- 9 and inclusion.
- 10 b. That an employee, student, applicant, or campus visitor
- ll is not compelled to disclose the employee's, student's,
- 12 applicant's, or campus visitor's preferred pronouns.
- NEW SUBSECTION. 44. Develop a policy that each
- 14 institution of higher education under the control of the board
- 15 shall approve, institute, and enforce, that prohibits the
- 16 consideration of race and other protected class characteristics
- 17 during the admissions process that is consistent with current
- 18 federal and state law.
- 19 NEW SUBSECTION. 45. Develop a policy that each institution
- 20 of higher education under the control of the board shall
- 21 approve, institute, and enforce, that contains guidance for
- 22 employees of each institution related to the separation of
- 23 personal political advocacy from the employee's job duties and
- 24 the business of the institution.
- 25 NEW SUBSECTION. 46. Direct the institutions of higher
- 26 education under its control to adopt policies and procedures
- 27 to advance the diversity of intellectual and philosophical
- 28 perspectives in faculty and staff applicant pools.
- 29 NEW SUBSECTION. 47. Provide an annual notice to the
- 30 institutions of higher education under its control concerning
- 31 the board's policy related to institution statements on matters
- 32 of public concern.
- 33 NEW SUBSECTION. 48. Direct the institutions of higher
- 34 education under its control to follow state law, regardless of
- 35 any rules or directives of any accrediting agency.

- 1 NEW SUBSECTION. 49. a. Direct the institutions of higher
- 2 education under its control to adopt policies that require
- 3 all undergraduate students admitted on or after the 2025-2026
- 4 academic year to complete a three-credit-hour course devoted to
- 5 American history and civics prior to graduation.
- 6 b. Direct the institutions of higher education under its
- 7 control to develop the curriculum and materials related to the
- 8 American history and civics course, subject to the approval
- 9 of the board. The curriculum shall focus on the founding of
- 10 the United States and shall emphasize the federalist papers,
- 11 the United States Constitution, and the three branches of
- 12 government.
- 13 c. Direct the institutions of higher education under
- 14 its control to develop policies that allow undergraduate
- 15 students to fulfill the requirements described in paragraph "a"
- 16 through semester hours of credit attained at other educational
- 17 institutions.
- 18 NEW SUBSECTION. 50. Direct the institutions of higher
- 19 education under its control to adopt policies that authorize
- 20 the president of the institution to initiate a post-tenure
- 21 review of any employee of the institution at any time.
- 22 NEW SUBSECTION. 51. Direct the institutions of higher
- 23 education under its control to adopt policies that require
- 24 any strategic plan adopted by the institution to include a
- 25 description of how the institution will prioritize degree
- 26 programs that lead to employment in high-demand fields within
- 27 the state. The policies and procedures shall also require that
- 28 the institution's current strategic plan be revised to include
- 29 a description of how the institution will prioritize degree
- 30 programs that lead to employment in high-demand fields within
- 31 the state.
- 32 NEW SUBSECTION. 52. Prohibit the institutions of higher
- 33 education under its control from allowing any Confucius
- 34 institute, or any other educational institute funded in whole
- 35 or in part by the People's Republic of China, to be located on

- 1 any property owned by the institution of higher education.
- NEW SUBSECTION. 53. Direct the institutions of higher
- 3 education under its control to adopt policies and procedures
- 4 that prohibit any faculty senate committee or subcommittee
- 5 from having any governance authority over the institution of
- 6 higher education. The policies and procedures shall provide
- 7 that the scope of authority of a faculty senate committee or
- 8 subcommittee is limited to an advisory role.
- 9 NEW SUBSECTION. 54. In a timely manner, respond to and
- 10 fulfill any request for information submitted to the board by a
- 11 member of the general assembly or the governor.
- 12 Sec. 14. INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION GOVERNED BY THE
- 13 STATE BOARD OF REGENTS REQUIRED REVIEWS.
- 1. On or before December 31, 2024, each institution of
- 15 higher education governed by the state board of regents shall
- 16 do all of the following:
- 17 a. Review all college, department, and unit-level
- 18 diversity, equity, and inclusion positions to determine whether
- 19 diversity, equity, and inclusion-specific job responsibilities
- 20 are necessary for compliance with federal or state law,
- 21 accreditation, or for the provision of student or employee
- 22 support services.
- 23 b. Adjust or eliminate any diversity, equity, and inclusion
- 24 position that is not necessary for those purposes described in
- 25 paragraph "a".
- 26 c. Review all employee position names and working titles to
- 27 ensure that the position names and working titles appropriately
- 28 reflect the employee's responsibilities.
- 29 2. Each institution of higher education governed by the
- 30 state board of regents shall initiate and conduct a review of
- 31 general education categories related to diversity, equity, and
- 32 inclusion and update such categories to accurately reflect the
- 33 array of options students may select in order to satisfy the
- 34 requirements associated with such categories and to ensure a
- 35 breadth of offerings.

1 Sec. 15. INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION GOVERNED BY THE 2 STATE BOARD OF REGENTS - REQUIRED DEVELOPMENT OF NEW ACADEMIC 3 PROGRAM. Prior to the November 2024 meeting of the state board 4 of regents, each institution of higher education governed by 5 the state board of regents shall develop and submit to the 6 state board of regents, the general assembly, and the governor, 7 a proposed baccalaureate degree program that requires a student 8 to complete no more than ninety semester hours of classroom 9 work. This section shall not be construed to require an 10 institution of higher education governed by the state board of 11 regents to implement the proposed baccalaureate degree program. 12 Sec. 16. COMPREHENSIVE STUDY - REDUCTION OF COSTS. 13 institution of higher education governed by the state board of 14 regents shall do all of the following: 15 1. Conduct a comprehensive study related to how to 16 reduce costs, maintain close to current levels of tuition 17 and mandatory fees, and maintain noninstructional costs 18 below ten percent of the average annual total of the moneys 19 appropriated to the institution by the general assembly and the 20 institution's revenue generated by tuition and mandatory fees. Prior to the November 2024 meeting of the state board 21 22 of regents, each institution of higher education governed by 23 the state board of regents shall develop and submit to the 24 state board of regents, the general assembly, and the governor 25 a report detailing the results of the comprehensive study 26 described in subsection 1. INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION GOVERNED BY 27 Sec. 17. 28 THE STATE BOARD OF REGENTS - EDUCATION AND RESEARCH ON FREE 29 SPEECH AND CIVIC EDUCATION PROPOSAL. Prior to the November 30 2024 meeting of the state board of regents, each institution 31 of higher education governed by the state board of regents 32 shall develop and submit to the state board of regents, the 33 general assembly, and the governor, a proposal related to the 34 establishment of a center or institute that is dedicated to 35 expanding opportunities for education and research concerning

- 1 freedom of speech and civic education.
- 2 DIVISION V
- 3 CLOSURE OF PRIVATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION
- 4 Sec. 18. NEW SECTION. 261J.1 Closure of private
- 5 institutions of higher education.
- 6 1. An accredited private institution shall provide notice
- 7 to the department of education immediately upon a vote of the
- 8 accredited private institution's governing board to close the
- 9 institution.
- 10 2. Within five business days after providing notice
- 11 under subsection 1, an accredited private institution shall
- 12 provide the department of education with copies of all of the
- 13 following:
- 14 a. Teachout plan.
- 15 b. The notice to faculty, staff, and students that the
- 16 institution will close.
- 17 c. Plans to coordinate alternative program options.
- 18 d. A comprehensive student directory with contact
- 19 information and information related to each student's current
- 20 status at the institution as of the date the institution will
- 21 close.
- 22 e. The institution's plan to provide transitional support.
- 23 f. The institution's transcript retention plan.
- 24 g. The process and contact person for student concerns,
- 25 complaints, and questions related to the closure of the
- 26 institution, both before and after the institution closes.
- 27 3. For purposes of this section, "accredited private
- 28 institution" means the same as defined in section 256.183.
