A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to education, including by modifying provisions
- 2 related to the sale of real property by school districts and
- 3 to charter school and open enrollment funding.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

DIVISION I 1 2 FUNDING FORMULA Section 1. Section 256E.8, subsection 2, paragraph a, Code 3 4 2024, is amended to read as follows: a. The charter school in which the student is enrolled shall 6 receive under paragraph c an amount equal to the sum of the 7 regular program state cost per pupil for the previous school 8 budget year plus the teacher leadership supplement state cost 9 per pupil, the professional development supplement state cost 10 per pupil, and the early intervention supplement state cost ll per pupil for the previous fiscal budget year as provided in 12 section 257.9 plus any moneys received by that would be due to 13 the school district of residence for the student as a result 14 of the non-English speaking weighting under section 280.4, 15 subsection 3, for the previous school budget year multiplied 16 by the state cost per pupil for the previous budget year. 17 If a student is an eligible pupil under section 261E.6, the 18 charter school shall pay the tuition reimbursement amount to 19 an eligible postsecondary institution as provided in section 20 261E.7. 21 Section 282.18, subsection 5, paragraph b, Sec. 2. 22 subparagraph (1), Code 2024, is amended to read as follows: 23 (1) The board of directors of the district of residence 24 shall pay to the receiving district the sum of the state cost 25 per pupil for the previous school budget year plus either 26 the teacher leadership supplement state cost per pupil, the 27 professional development supplement state cost per pupil, and 28 the early intervention supplement state cost per pupil for 29 the previous fiscal budget year as provided in section 257.9 30 or the teacher leadership supplement foundation aid for the 31 previous fiscal year as provided in section 284.13, subsection 32 1, paragraph "d", if both the district of residence and the 33 receiving district are receiving such supplements, plus any 34 moneys received that would be due to the school district of 35 residence for the pupil as a result of the non-English speaking

- 1 weighting under section 280.4, subsection 3, for the previous
- 2 school budget year multiplied by the state cost per pupil for

- 15 and the application to be made of the proceeds thereof.

- 1 l. The board of directors of a school district shall not
- 2 enter into any agreement that prohibits the sale of real
- 3 property to an educational institution.
- 4 2. If the board of directors of a school district offers
- 5 to sell real property that contains a building or structure,
- 6 and an educational institution offers to purchase such real
- 7 property for a purchase price that represents the highest bid
- 8 the board of directors of the school district received for
- 9 the real property, then the board of directors of the school
- 10 district shall sell the real property to the educational
- 11 institution for such purchase price.
- 12 3. For purposes of this section, "educational institution"
- 13 means all of the following:
- 14 a. A school district.
- 15 b. A nonpublic school.
- 16 c. A charter school established pursuant to chapter 256E.
- 17 d. A charter school or innovation zone school established
- 18 pursuant to chapter 256F.
- 19 e. An institution of higher education under the control of
- 20 the state board of regents.
- 21 f. A community college established under chapter 260C.
- 22 g. The state training school established under chapter 233A.
- 23 h. An accredited private institution as defined in section
- 24 256.183.
- 25 Sec. 6. IMPLEMENTATION OF ACT. Section 25B.2, subsection 3,
- 26 shall not apply to this division of this Act.
