**A BILL FOR**

1 An Act relating to and making appropriations for the economic  
2 development of the state, including to the economic  
3 development authority, the Iowa finance authority, the  
4 public employment relations board, the department of  
5 workforce development, and the state board of regents and  
6 certain regents institutions.  
7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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DIVISION I

FY 2024–2025 APPROPRIATIONS

Section 1. GOALS AND ACCOUNTABILITY — ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

1. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, the goals for the economic development authority shall be to expand and stimulate the state economy, increase the wealth of Iowans, and increase the population of the state.

2. To achieve the goals in subsection 1, the economic development authority shall do all of the following for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024:

a. Concentrate its efforts on programs and activities that result in commercially viable products and services.

b. Adopt practices and services consistent with free market, private sector philosophies.

c. Ensure economic growth and development throughout the state.

d. Work with businesses and communities to continually improve the economic development climate along with the economic well-being and quality of life for Iowans.

e. Coordinate with other state agencies to ensure that they are attentive to the needs of an entrepreneurial culture.

f. Establish a strong and aggressive marketing image to showcase Iowa’s workforce, existing industry, and potential.

A priority shall be placed on recruiting new businesses, business expansion, and retaining existing Iowa businesses.

Emphasis shall be placed on entrepreneurial development through helping entrepreneurs secure capital, and developing networks and a business climate conducive to entrepreneurs and small businesses.

g. Encourage the development of communities and quality of life to foster economic growth.

h. Prepare communities for future growth and development through development, expansion, and modernization of infrastructure.

1 i. Develop public-private partnerships with Iowa businesses  
2 in the tourism industry, Iowa tour groups, Iowa tourism  
3 organizations, and political subdivisions in this state to  
4 assist in the development of advertising efforts.

5 Sec. 2. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY.

6 1. APPROPRIATION

7 a. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
8 to the economic development authority for the fiscal year  
9 beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025, the following  
10 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the  
11 purposes designated in this subsection, and for not more than  
12 the following full-time equivalent positions:

13 .....	\$ 12,921,510
14 .....	FTEs 112.50

15 b. (1) For salaries, support, miscellaneous purposes,  
16 programs, marketing, administration, business development,  
17 community development, small business development, and any  
18 divisions the authority may organize.

19 (2) For business development operations and programs,  
20 international trade, export assistance, workforce recruitment,  
21 and the partner state program.

22 (3) For transfer to a fund created pursuant to section  
23 15.313 for purposes of financing strategic infrastructure  
24 projects.

25 (4) For community economic development programs, tourism  
26 operations, community assistance, and the community development  
27 block grant.

28 (5) For achieving the goals and accountability, and  
29 fulfilling the requirements and duties required under this Act.

30 (6) The full-time equivalent positions authorized under  
31 this section are funded, in whole or in part, by the moneys  
32 appropriated under this subsection or by other moneys received  
33 by the authority, including certain federal moneys.

34 c. Notwithstanding [section 8.33](#), moneys appropriated in  
35 this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the

1 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain  
2 available for expenditure for the purposes designated in this  
3 subsection until the close of the succeeding fiscal year.

4 2. FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE RESTRICTIONS

5 a. A business creating jobs through moneys appropriated in  
6 subsection 1 shall be subject to contract provisions requiring  
7 new and retained jobs to be filled by individuals who are  
8 citizens of the United States who reside within the United  
9 States, or any person authorized to work in the United States  
10 pursuant to federal law, including legal resident aliens  
11 residing in the United States.

12 b. Any vendor who receives moneys appropriated in  
13 subsection 1 shall adhere to such contract provisions and  
14 provide periodic assurances as the state shall require that the  
15 jobs are filled solely by citizens of the United States who  
16 reside within the United States, or any person authorized to  
17 work in the United States, pursuant to federal law, including  
18 legal resident aliens residing in the United States.

19 c. A business that receives financial assistance from  
20 the authority from moneys appropriated in subsection 1 shall  
21 only employ individuals legally authorized to work in this  
22 state. In addition to all other applicable penalties provided  
23 by current law, all or a portion of the assistance received  
24 by a business which is found to knowingly employ individuals  
25 not legally authorized to work in this state is subject to  
26 recapture by the authority.

27 3. USES OF APPROPRIATIONS

28 a. From the moneys appropriated in subsection 1, the  
29 authority may provide financial assistance in the form of a  
30 grant to a community economic development entity for conducting  
31 a local workforce recruitment effort designed to recruit former  
32 citizens of the state and former students at colleges and  
33 universities in the state to meet the needs of local employers.

34 b. From the moneys appropriated in subsection 1, the  
35 authority may provide financial assistance to early stage

1 industry companies being established by women entrepreneurs.

2 c. From the moneys appropriated in subsection 1, the  
3 authority may provide financial assistance in the form of  
4 grants, loans, or forgivable loans for advanced research and  
5 commercialization projects involving value-added agriculture,  
6 advanced technology, or biotechnology.

7 d. The authority shall not use any moneys appropriated in  
8 subsection 1 for purposes of providing financial assistance  
9 for any program or project that involves the installation of  
10 geothermal systems for melting snow and ice from streets or  
11 sidewalks.

12 4. WORLD FOOD PRIZE

13 In lieu of the standing appropriation in [section 15.368](#),  
14 there is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the  
15 economic development authority for the fiscal year beginning  
16 July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025, the following amount  
17 for the world food prize:

18 ..... \$ 650,000

19 5. COUNCILS OF GOVERNMENTS — ASSISTANCE

20 There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
21 to the economic development authority for the fiscal year  
22 beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025, the following  
23 amount to be used for the purposes of providing financial  
24 assistance to Iowa’s councils of governments:

25 ..... \$ 350,000

26 6. TOURISM OFFICE

27 a. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
28 to the economic development authority for the fiscal year  
29 beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025, the following  
30 amount for the tourism office to be used for advertising,  
31 promoting, placement, and implementation of the economic  
32 development authority’s strategic plan for tourism and travel:

33 ..... \$ 1,100,000

34 b. Notwithstanding [section 8.33](#), moneys appropriated in  
35 this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the

1 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain  
2 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the  
3 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

4 c. The economic development authority shall submit an  
5 annual report on or before January 15 to the general assembly  
6 regarding the tourism office's activities funded with moneys  
7 appropriated under this subsection. The report shall be  
8 provided in an electronic format and shall include metrics  
9 and criteria that allow the general assembly to quantify  
10 and evaluate the effectiveness and economic impact of the  
11 tourism office's activities related to advertising, promoting,  
12 placement, and implementation of the economic development  
13 authority's strategic plan for tourism and travel.

14 7. CULTURAL AFFAIRS ACTIVITIES

15 a. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
16 to the economic development authority for the fiscal year  
17 beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025, the following  
18 amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the  
19 purposes designated:

20 (1) For planning and programming for the community cultural  
21 grants program established under section 15.436:

22 ..... \$ 172,090

23 (2) For support of the Iowa arts council:

24 ..... \$ 1,450,000

25 Of the moneys appropriated in this subparagraph, the  
26 authority shall allocate \$300,000 for purposes of the film  
27 office.

28 (3) For the Iowa great places program established under  
29 section 15.439:

30 ..... \$ 149,710

31 (4) For grant programs administered by the Iowa arts  
32 council including those programs supporting the long-term  
33 financial stability and sustainability of nonprofit cultural  
34 organizations:

35 ..... \$ 150,000

1 b. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in  
2 this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the  
3 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain  
4 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the  
5 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

6 Sec. 3. LIMITATIONS OF STANDING APPROPRIATIONS — FY  
7 2024-2025. Notwithstanding the standing appropriations  
8 in the following designated sections for the fiscal year  
9 beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025, the amounts  
10 appropriated from the general fund of the state pursuant to  
11 those sections for the following purposes shall not exceed the  
12 following amounts:

13 1. For operational support grants and community cultural  
14 grants under section 99F.11, subsection 4, paragraph "d",  
15 subparagraph (1):

16 ..... \$ 448,403

17 2. For the purposes of tourism marketing under section  
18 99F.11, subsection 4, paragraph "d", subparagraph (2):

19 ..... \$ 1,443,700

20 Sec. 4. FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE REPORTING — ECONOMIC  
21 DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY. The economic development authority  
22 shall submit an annual report to the general assembly no later  
23 than November 1, 2024, that details the amount of every direct  
24 loan, forgivable loan, tax credit, tax exemption, tax refund,  
25 grant, or any other financial assistance awarded to a person  
26 during the prior fiscal year by the authority under an economic  
27 development program administered by the authority. The report  
28 shall identify the county where the project associated with  
29 each such award is located.

30 Sec. 5. INSURANCE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. From the moneys  
31 collected by the insurance division of the department of  
32 insurance and financial services in excess of the anticipated  
33 gross revenues under section 505.7, subsection 3, during  
34 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, \$100,000 shall be  
35 transferred to the economic development authority for insurance

1 economic development and international insurance economic  
2 development.

3 Sec. 6. IOWA FINANCE AUTHORITY.

4 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
5 to the Iowa finance authority for the fiscal year beginning  
6 July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025, the following amounts,  
7 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes  
8 designated:

9 a. Rent subsidy program

10 (1) To provide reimbursement for rent expenses to eligible  
11 persons under the home and community-based services rent  
12 subsidy program established in section 16.55:

13 ..... \$ 873,000

14 (2) Of the moneys appropriated in this paragraph, not more  
15 than \$35,000 may be used for administrative costs.

16 b. Housing renewal pilot program

17 To provide housing renewal moneys to a nonprofit Iowa  
18 affiliate to award grants to eligible communities for a housing  
19 renewal pilot program:

20 ..... \$ 550,000

21 2. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in  
22 this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the  
23 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain  
24 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the  
25 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

26 Sec. 7. IOWA FINANCE AUTHORITY AUDIT. The auditor of state  
27 is requested to review the audit of the Iowa finance authority  
28 performed by the auditor hired by the authority.

29 Sec. 8. PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT RELATIONS BOARD.

30 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
31 to the public employment relations board for the fiscal year  
32 beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025, the following  
33 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the  
34 purposes designated:

35 For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous

1 purposes, and for not more than the following full-time  
2 equivalent positions:

3 .....	\$	1,296,403
4 .....	FTEs	9.00

5 2. Of the moneys appropriated in this section, the board  
6 shall allocate \$15,000 for maintaining an internet site that  
7 allows access to a searchable database of collective bargaining  
8 information.

9 Sec. 9. DEPARTMENT OF WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT. There  
10 is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the  
11 department of workforce development for the fiscal year  
12 beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025, the following  
13 amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the  
14 purposes designated:

15 1. WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT OPERATIONS

16 a. For the operation of field offices and the workforce  
17 development board, and for not more than the following  
18 full-time equivalent positions:

19 .....	\$	6,902,636
20 .....	FTEs	166.41

21 b. Of the moneys appropriated in paragraph "a", the  
22 department shall allocate \$150,000 to the state library for the  
23 purpose of licensing an online resource which prepares persons  
24 to succeed in the workplace through programs which improve job  
25 skills and vocational test-taking abilities.

26 2. OFFENDER REENTRY PROGRAM

27 a. For the development and administration of an offender  
28 reentry program to provide offenders with employment skills,  
29 and for not more than the following full-time equivalent  
30 positions:

31 .....	\$	387,158
32 .....	FTEs	5.00

33 b. The department of workforce development shall partner  
34 with the department of corrections to provide staff within  
35 the correctional facilities resources to improve offenders'

1 abilities to find and retain productive employment.

2 3. INTEGRATED INFORMATION FOR IOWA SYSTEM

3 For the payment of services provided by the department of  
4 administrative services related to the integrated information  
5 for Iowa system:

6 ..... \$ 228,822

7 4. WORKPLACE INJURY AND SAFETY SURVEYS

8 For the operation of workplace safety surveys and workplace  
9 data collection and analysis, including salaries, support,  
10 maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes, and for not more than  
11 the following full-time equivalent positions:

12 ..... \$ 125,555

13 ..... FTEs 3.00

14 5. SUMMER YOUTH INTERN PILOT PROGRAM

15 For the funding of a summer youth intern pilot program that  
16 will help young people at risk of not graduating from high  
17 school to explore and prepare for high-demand careers through  
18 summer work experience, including the development of soft  
19 skills:

20 ..... \$ 250,000

21 6. VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION SERVICES DIVISION

22 a. For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous  
23 purposes, and for not more than the following full-time  
24 equivalent positions:

25 ..... \$ 6,226,739

26 ..... FTEs 248.00

27 For purposes of optimizing the job placement of individuals  
28 with disabilities, the division shall make its best efforts  
29 to work with community rehabilitation program providers for  
30 job placement and retention services for individuals with  
31 significant disabilities and most significant disabilities. By  
32 January 15, 2025, the division shall submit a written report to  
33 the general assembly regarding the division's outreach efforts  
34 with community rehabilitation program providers.

35 b. For matching moneys for programs to enable persons

1 with severe physical or mental disabilities to function more  
2 independently, including salaries and support, and for not more  
3 than the following full-time equivalent positions:

4 ..... \$ 84,804  
5 ..... FTEs 1.00

6 c. For the entrepreneurs with disabilities program  
7 established pursuant to section 84H.4:  
8 ..... \$ 138,506

9 d. For costs associated with centers for independent  
10 living:  
11 ..... \$ 86,547

12 7. ADULT EDUCATION AND LITERACY PROGRAMS

13 For distribution as grants to community colleges for  
14 the purpose of adult basic education programs for students  
15 requiring instruction in English as a second language:  
16 ..... \$ 500,000

17 In issuing grants under this subsection, the department of  
18 workforce development shall use the same application process  
19 and criteria as are used for purposes of awarding grants to  
20 community colleges for the purpose of adult basic education  
21 programs for students requiring instruction in English as a  
22 second language using moneys that are appropriated to the  
23 department from the Iowa skilled worker and job creation fund.

24 8. REGISTERED APPRENTICESHIP DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS

25 For the funding of the registered apprenticeship development  
26 programs under chapter 84F to encourage small to midsize  
27 businesses to start or grow registered apprenticeships:

29 Notwithstanding [section 8.33](#), moneys appropriated in this  
30 section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the close of  
31 the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain available for  
32 expenditure for the purposes designated until the close of the  
33 succeeding fiscal year.

34 Sec. 10. GENERAL FUND — EMPLOYEE MISCLASSIFICATION

35 PROGRAM. There is appropriated from the general fund of the

1 state to the department of workforce development for the fiscal  
2 year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025, the  
3 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be  
4 used for the purposes designated:

5 For enhancing efforts to investigate employers that  
6 misclassify workers, and for not more than the following  
7 full-time equivalent positions:

8 ..... \$ 379,631  
9 ..... FTEs 3.00

10 Sec. 11. SPECIAL EMPLOYMENT SECURITY CONTINGENCY FUND.

11 1. There is appropriated from the special employment  
12 security contingency fund created in section 96.13 to the  
13 department of workforce development for the fiscal year  
14 beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025, the following  
15 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for  
16 field offices:

17 ..... \$ 2,416,084

18 2. Any remaining additional penalty and interest revenue  
19 collected by the department of workforce development is  
20 appropriated to the department for the fiscal year beginning  
21 July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025, to accomplish the  
22 mission of the department.

23 Sec. 12. UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION RESERVE FUND — FIELD  
24 OFFICES. Notwithstanding [section 96.9, subsection 8](#), paragraph  
25 "e", there is appropriated from interest earned on the  
26 unemployment compensation reserve fund created in section 96.9  
27 to the department of workforce development for the fiscal year  
28 beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025, the following  
29 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the  
30 purposes designated:

31 For the operation of field offices:

32 ..... \$ 2,200,000

33 Sec. 13. IOWA SKILLED WORKER AND JOB CREATION FUND.

34 1. There is appropriated from the Iowa skilled worker and  
35 job creation fund created in [section 8.75](#) to the following

1 departments, agencies, and institutions for the fiscal year  
2 beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025, the following  
3 amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the  
4 purposes designated:

5 a. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

6 (1) For the purposes of providing assistance as described in  
7 section 15.335B for the high quality jobs program:

8 ..... \$ 11,700,000

9 (a) From the moneys appropriated in this subparagraph  
10 (1), the economic development authority may use not more than  
11 \$1,000,000 for purposes of providing infrastructure grants to  
12 main street communities under the main street Iowa program.

13 (b) As a condition of receiving moneys appropriated in this  
14 subparagraph (1), an entity shall testify upon the request of  
15 the joint appropriations subcommittee on economic development  
16 regarding the expenditure of such moneys.

17 (2) For support of the manufacturing 4.0 technology  
18 investment program established in section 15.371:

19 ..... \$ 2,016,675

20 (3) For the empower rural Iowa program:

21 ..... \$ 700,000

22 b. STATE BOARD OF REGENTS AND REGENTS INSTITUTIONS

23 (1) STATE BOARD OF REGENTS. For capacity building  
24 infrastructure in areas related to technology  
25 commercialization, marketing and business development  
26 efforts in areas related to technology commercialization,  
27 entrepreneurship, and business growth, and infrastructure  
28 projects and programs needed to assist in implementation of  
29 activities under [chapter 262B](#):

30 ..... \$ 3,000,000

31 (a) Of the moneys appropriated pursuant to this  
32 subparagraph (1), 35 percent shall be allocated for Iowa state  
33 university of science and technology, 35 percent shall be  
34 allocated for the state university of Iowa, and 30 percent  
35 shall be allocated for the university of northern Iowa.

1 (b) The institutions shall provide a one-to-one match  
2 of additional moneys for the activities funded with moneys  
3 appropriated under this subparagraph (1).

4 (c) The state board of regents shall submit a report by  
5 January 15, 2025, to the governor and the general assembly  
6 regarding the activities, projects, and programs funded with  
7 moneys appropriated under this subparagraph (1). The report  
8 shall be provided in an electronic format and shall include a  
9 list of metrics and criteria mutually agreed to in advance by  
10 the board of regents and the economic development authority.  
11 The metrics and criteria shall allow the governor's office and  
12 the general assembly to quantify and evaluate the progress  
13 of the board of regents institutions with regard to their  
14 activities, projects, and programs in the areas of technology  
15 commercialization, entrepreneurship, regional development, and  
16 market research.

17 (2) IOWA STATE UNIVERSITY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY. For  
18 small business development centers, the research park, and the  
19 center for industrial research and service, and for not more  
20 than the following full-time equivalent positions:

21 .....	\$	2,424,302
22 .....	FTEs	50.95

23 (a) Of the moneys appropriated in this subparagraph (2),  
24 Iowa state university of science and technology shall allocate  
25 at least \$735,728 for purposes of funding small business  
26 development centers. Iowa state university of science and  
27 technology may allocate the appropriated moneys to the various  
28 small business development centers in any manner necessary to  
29 achieve the purposes of this subparagraph.

30 (b) Iowa state university of science and technology shall  
31 do all of the following:

32 (i) Direct expenditures for research toward projects that  
33 will provide economic stimulus for Iowa.

34 (ii) Provide emphasis to providing services to Iowa-based  
35 companies.

1 (c) It is the intent of the general assembly that the  
 2 industrial incentive program focus on Iowa industrial sectors  
 3 and seek contributions and in-kind donations from businesses,  
 4 industrial foundations, and trade associations, and that moneys  
 5 for the center for industrial research and service industrial  
 6 incentive program shall be allocated only for projects which  
 7 are matched by private sector moneys for directed contract  
 8 research or for nondirected research. The match required of  
 9 small businesses as defined in [section 15.102](#) for directed  
 10 contract research or for nondirected research shall be \$1  
 11 for each \$3 of state funds. The match required for other  
 12 businesses for directed contract research or for nondirected  
 13 research shall be \$1 for each \$1 of state funds. The match  
 14 required of industrial foundations or trade associations shall  
 15 be \$1 for each \$1 of state funds.

16 (d) Iowa state university of science and technology shall  
 17 report annually to the general assembly the total amount of  
 18 private contributions, the proportion of contributions from  
 19 small businesses and other businesses, and the proportion for  
 20 directed contract research and nondirected research of benefit  
 21 to Iowa businesses and industrial sectors.

22 (3) STATE UNIVERSITY OF IOWA

23 (a) For the state university of Iowa research park and for  
 24 university of Iowa pharmaceuticals located at the research  
 25 park, including salaries, support, maintenance, equipment, and  
 26 miscellaneous purposes, and for not more than the following  
 27 full-time equivalent positions:

30 The state university of Iowa shall do all of the following:

31 (i) Direct expenditures for research toward projects that  
 32 will provide economic stimulus for Iowa.

35 (b) For the purpose of implementing the entrepreneurship

1 and economic growth initiative, and for not more than the  
2 following full-time equivalent positions:

3 ..... \$ 2,000,000  
4 ..... FTEs 8.00

5 (4) UNIVERSITY OF NORTHERN IOWA. For the metal casting and  
6 foundry 4.0 centers, advance Iowa, family business center, and  
7 the institute for decision making, including salaries, support,  
8 maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes, and for not more than  
9 the following full-time equivalent positions:

10 ..... \$ 1,466,419  
11 ..... FTEs 13.00

12 The university of northern Iowa shall do all of the  
13 following:

14 (a) Direct expenditures for research toward projects that  
15 will provide economic stimulus for Iowa.

16 (b) Provide emphasis to providing services to Iowa-based  
17 companies.

18 (5) As a condition of receiving moneys appropriated in  
19 this lettered paragraph "b", an entity shall testify upon the  
20 request of the joint appropriations subcommittee on economic  
21 development regarding the expenditure of such moneys.

22 c. DEPARTMENT OF WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

23 (1) To develop a long-term sustained program to train  
24 unemployed and underemployed central Iowans with skills  
25 necessary to advance to higher-paying jobs with full benefits:

26 ..... \$ 100,000
