A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to qualifications to serve as a commissioner
2 or an executive director for a county commission of veteran
3 affairs.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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1 Section 1. Section 35B.3, Code 2025, is amended to read as
2 follows:

3 **35B.3 County commission of veteran affairs.**

4 1. The county commission of veteran affairs shall consist
5 of either three or five persons, as determined by the board of
6 supervisors, all of whom shall be ~~veterans~~ one of the following:

7 a. A veteran as defined in section 35.1.

8 b. An Iowa resident who is a current member of the Iowa
9 national guard or an Iowa unit of the reserve forces of the
10 United States, whose service is satisfactory according to a
11 letter of recommendation from the commander of the person's
12 current unit.

13 c. An Iowa resident who is a former member of the Iowa
14 national guard or an Iowa unit of the reserve forces of the
15 United States and was discharged under honorable conditions as
16 evidenced by the person's certificate of release or discharge
17 from active duty, commonly referred to as a DD214, or a letter
18 of recommendation from the commander of the person's last unit.

19 2. If possible, each member of the commission shall ~~be a~~
20 ~~veteran of~~ have served in a different military branch. However,
21 this qualification does not preclude membership to a veteran who
22 served in more than one branch of the military.

23 Sec. 2. Section 35B.6, subsection 1, paragraph a, Code 2025,
24 is amended to read as follows:

25 a. The members of the commission shall qualify by taking
26 the usual oath of office. The commission shall organize by
27 selecting one of the commission members as chairperson and one
28 as secretary. The commission, subject to the annual approval
29 of the board of supervisors, shall employ an executive director
30 or administrator who shall have the power to employ other
31 necessary employees to carry out the provisions of this chapter,
32 including administrative or clerical assistants, but no member
33 of the commission shall be so employed. The state department
34 of veterans affairs shall recognize the executive director or
35 administrator as a county veterans service officer of a veterans'

1 service organization recognized pursuant to 38 C.F.R. §14.628(c)
2 for the purposes of assisting veterans and their dependents
3 in obtaining federal and state benefits. The commission
4 shall recommend the compensation of the executive director or
5 administrator and all employees of the county veteran affairs
6 office to the board of supervisors. The board of supervisors
7 shall consider the recommendation and shall determine and approve
8 the compensation of the executive director or administrator
9 and all employees of the county veteran affairs office. The
10 executive director ~~must possess the same qualifications as~~
11 ~~provided in section 35B.3 for commission members~~ shall be a
12 veteran as defined in section 35.1. However, this qualification
13 requirement shall not apply to a person employed as an executive
14 director prior to July 1, 1989.

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
